8	AN AMENDMENT TO THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION CONCERNING
9	THE OFFICE OF LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR; PROVIDING THAT
10	LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR CANDIDATES RUN JOINTLY WITH
11	GUBERNATORIAL CANDIDATES; AMENDING THE DUTIES OF THE
12	LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BY PROVIDING THAT THE GOVERNOR
13	RETAIN HIS OR HER POWERS AND DUTIES WHEN ABSENT FROM
14	THE STATE; ALLOWING THE GOVERNOR TO ASSIGN DUTIES TO
15	THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR; ALLOWING THE GENERAL
16	ASSEMBLY TO PROVIDE BY LAW FOR ADDITIONAL DUTIES AND
17	RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR; AND
18	PROVIDING THAT THE GOVERNOR MAY FILL A VACANCY IN THE
19	OFFICE OF LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR BY APPOINTMENT.

23	AN AMENDMENT TO THE ARKANSAS CONSTITUTION
24	CONCERNING THE OFFICE OF LIEUTENANT
25	GOVERNOR.
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28	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL
29	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL
30	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
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32	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
33	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
34	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives
35	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election
36	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of



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1 the State of Arkansas, to wit: 2 3 SECTION 1. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, § 3, is amended to read 4 as follows: 5 § 3. Election of Governor and Lieutenant Governor. 6 (a) The Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected at the times 7 and places of choosing members of the Assembly. A candidate for Lieutenant 8 Governor shall run jointly with a candidate for Governor, and his or her name 9 shall appear jointly on the ballot with the candidate for Governor. The 10 Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be chosen jointly by the casting of a single vote applicable to both offices. A candidate for Governor shall 11 12 select the candidate for Lieutenant Governor with whom he or she shall run 13 jointly. A person shall not file as a candidate for Lieutenant Governor. A 14 candidate for Governor seeking the nomination of a political party shall 15 select the candidate for Lieutenant Governor with whom he or she shall run jointly no later than sixty (60) days before the preferential primary 16 17 election. The persons respectively jointly having the highest number of 18 votes for Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected as Governor and 19 Lieutenant Governor, respectively, but in case two or more shall more than 20 two (2) joint candidates have an equal and the highest number of votes for 21 Governor, or for and Lieutenant Governor respectively, the two houses of the 22 Legislature at its next annual session shall forthwith, by joint ballot, 23 choose one of among the said persons joint candidates so having an equal and 24 the highest number of votes for Governor or and Lieutenant Governor for the 25 office of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, respectively. 26 (b) The General Assembly may enact laws necessary to implement this 27 section, including without limitation laws necessary to provide that the Lieutenant Governor shall run jointly with a candidate for Governor. 28 29 30 SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, § 4 is amended to read 31 as follows: 32 § 4. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor. 33 In case of the impeachment of the Governor, or his or her removal from 34 office, death, inability to discharge the powers and duties of the said 35 office, or resignation or absence from the State, the powers and duties of 36 the office, shall devolve upon the Lieutenant Governor for the residue of the

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1 term, or until the disability shall cease. But when When the Governor shall, 2 with the consent of the Legislature, be out of the State, in time of war, at the head of a military force thereof, he or she shall continue commander-in-3 4 chief of all the military force of the State. 5 6 SECTION 3. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, is amended to add an 7 additional section to read as follows: 8 § 7. Additional duties and responsibilities of Lieutenant Governor. 9 The Governor may assign duties and responsibilities to the Lieutenant 10 Governor as he or she deems necessary. 11 12 SECTION 4. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 29, Section 1, is amended to read as follows: 13 14 § 1. Elective offices - Exceptions. 15 Vacancies in the office of United States Senator, and in all elective state, district, circuit, county, and township offices except those of 16 17 Lieutenant Governor, Member of the General Assembly and Representative in the 18 Congress of the United States, shall be filled by appointment by the 19 Governor. 20 SECTION 5. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 29, Section 4, is amended 21 22 to read as follows: 23 § 4. Duration of term of appointee - Election to fill vacancy. 24 (a) The Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the 25 appointee shall serve during the entire unexpired term in the office in which the vacancy occurs if such office would in regular course be filled at the 26 27 next General Election if no vacancy had occurred. If such office would not 28 in regular course be filled at such next general election the vacancy shall 29 be filled as follows: At the next General Election, if the vacancy occurs 30 four months or more prior thereto, and at the second General Election after 31 the vacancy occurs if the vacancy occurs less than four months before the 32 next General Election after it occurs. The person so elected shall take office on the 1st day of January following his election. 33 34 (b) An appointee to fill a vacancy in the office of Lieutenant 35 Governor shall serve during the entire unexpired term regardless of whether 36 the office would in regular course be filled at the next General Election if

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1	no vacancy had occurred.
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3	SECTION 6. (a) No later than thirty (30) days after the effective
4	date of this section, the independent citizens commission shall conduct a
5	study of the salary of the Lieutenant Governor to determine if new duties and
6	responsibilities under this amendment require an adjustment to the salary of
7	the position.
8	(b) The commission shall complete its study under subsection (a) of
9	this section no later than thirty (30) days after the date it begins the
10	<u>study.</u>
11	(c)(l) If at the conclusion of its study under subsection (a) of this
12	section the commission determines that a salary revision for the position of
13	Lieutenant Governor is appropriate, the commission shall propose an
14	<u>adjustment under Arkansas Constitution, Article 19, § 31(e).</u>
15	(2) A salary revision for the position of Lieutenant Governor
16	resulting from the study under subsection (a) of this section is not subject
17	<u>to Arkansas Constitution, Article 19, § 31(g)(3)(A).</u>
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19	SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b)
20	of this section, this amendment is effective on and after January 1, 2023.
21	(b) A candidate for Lieutenant Governor shall run jointly with a
22	candidate for Governor, and his or her name shall appear jointly on the
23	ballot with the candidate for Governor, at the 2022 general election.
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25	SECTION 8. BALLOT TITLE AND POPULAR NAME. When this proposed
26	amendment is submitted to the electors of this state on the general election
27	ballot:
28	(1) The title of this joint resolution shall be the ballot
29	title; and
30	(2) The popular name shall be "A Constitutional Amendment
31	Concerning the Office of Lieutenant Governor and Amending the Method of
32	Election, Assignment of Duties, and Method of Filling a Vacancy for the
33	Office of Lieutenant Governor".
