28	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETIETH GENERA	L
29	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL	
30	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:	
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32	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constituti	on of
33	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the	state
34	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representat	ives
35	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the elec	tion
36	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitu	tion of

1 the State of Arkansas, to wit:

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- 3 SECTION 1. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, § 3, is amended to read 4 as follows:
- 5 § 3. Election of Governor and Lieutenant Governor.
- 6 <u>(a)</u> The Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected at the times 7 and places of choosing members of the Assembly. <u>A candidate for Lieutenant</u>
- 8 Governor shall run jointly with a candidate for Governor, and his or her name
- 9 shall appear jointly on the ballot with the candidate for Governor. The
- 10 Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be chosen jointly by the casting of a
- 11 single vote applicable to both offices. A candidate for Governor shall
- 12 <u>select the candidate for Lieutenant Governor with whom he or she shall run</u>
- 13 jointly. A person shall not file as a candidate for Lieutenant Governor. A
- 14 <u>candidate for Governor seeking the nomination of a political party shall</u>
- 15 <u>select the candidate for Lieutenant Governor with whom he or she shall run</u>
- 16 jointly no later than sixty (60) days before the preferential primary
- 17 <u>election.</u> The persons respectively <u>jointly</u> having the highest number of
- 18 votes for Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected <u>as Governor and</u>
- 19 <u>Lieutenant Governor, respectively</u>, but in case two or more shall <u>more than</u>
- 20 two (2) joint candidates have an equal and the highest number of votes for
- 21 Governor, or for and Lieutenant Governor respectively, the two houses of the
- 22 Legislature at its next annual session shall forthwith, by joint ballot,
- 23 choose one of among the said persons joint candidates so having an equal and
- 24 the highest number of votes for Governor or and Lieutenant Governor for the
- 25 <u>office of Governor and Lieutenant Governor, respectively.</u>
- 26 (b) The General Assembly may enact laws necessary to implement this
- 27 section, including without limitation laws necessary to provide that the
- 28 Lieutenant Governor shall run jointly with a candidate for Governor.

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- 30 SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, § 4 is amended to read 31 as follows:
- 32 § 4. Lieutenant Governor acting as Governor.
- 33 $\underline{(a)(1)}$ In case of the impeachment of the Governor, or his <u>or her</u>
- 34 removal from office, death, inability to discharge the powers and duties of
- 35 the said office, or resignation or absence from the State, the powers and
- 36 duties of the office, shall devolve upon the Lieutenant Governor for the

1	residue of the term, or until the disability shall cease.	
2	(2)(A) If the Governor is absent from the state, he or she may	
3	designate the Lieutenant Governor to act as Governor until the Governor	
4	returns to the State.	
5	(B) A designation under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this	
6	section:	
7	(i) Shall be made in writing to the Secretary of	
8	State; and	
9	(ii) Shall expire upon the earlier of:	
10	(a) The Governor's return to the state; or	
11	(b) The Governor's delivery of a written	
12	revocation of the designation to the Secretary of State.	
13	(b) But when the Governor shall, with the consent of the Legislature,	
14	be out of the State, in time of war, at the head of a military force thereof,	
15	he <u>or she</u> shall continue commander-in-chief of all the military force of the	
16	State.

18	SECTION 3. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 6, is amended to add an	
19	additional section to read as follows:	
20	§ 7. Additional duties and responsibilities of Lieutenant Governor.	
21	The Governor may assign duties and responsibilities to the Lieutenant	
22	Governor as he or she deems necessary.	
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24	SECTION 4. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 29, Section 1, is amended	
25	to read as follows:	
26	§ 1. Elective offices — Exceptions.	
27	Vacancies in the office of United States Senator, and in all elective	
28	state, district, circuit, county, and township offices except those of	
29	Lieutenant Governor, Member of the General Assembly and Representative in the	
30	Congress of the United States, shall be filled by appointment by the	
31	Governor.	
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33	SECTION 5. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 29, Section 4, is amended	
34	to read as follows:	
35	\S 4. Duration of term of appointee — Election to fill vacancy.	
36	(a) The Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, the	

- 1 appointee shall serve during the entire unexpired term in the office in which
- 2 the vacancy occurs if such office would in regular course be filled at the
- 3 next General Election if no vacancy had occurred. If such office would not
- 4 in regular course be filled at such next general election the vacancy shall
- 5 be filled as follows: At the next General Election, if the vacancy occurs
- 6 four months or more prior thereto, and at the second General Election after
- 7 the vacancy occurs if the vacancy occurs less than four months before the
- 8 next General Election after it occurs. The person so elected shall take
- 9 office on the 1st day of January following his election.
- 10 <u>(b) An appointee to fill a vacancy in the office of Lieutenant</u>
- 11 Governor shall serve during the entire unexpired term regardless of whether
- 12 the office would in regular course be filled at the next General Election if
- 13 <u>no vacancy had occurred.</u>

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- 15 SECTION 6. (a) No later than thirty (30) days after the effective
- 16 <u>date of this section</u>, the independent citizens commission shall conduct a
- 17 <u>study of the salary of the Lieutenant Governor to determine if new duties and</u>
- 18 <u>responsibilities under this amendment require an adjustment to the salary of</u>
- 19 <u>the position</u>.
- 20 <u>(b) The commission shall complete its study under subsection (a) of</u>
- 21 <u>this section no later than thirty (30) days after the date it begins the</u>
- 22 study.
- 23 (c)(1) If at the conclusion of its study under subsection (a) of this
- 24 <u>section the commission determines that a salary revision for the position of</u>
- 25 <u>Lieutenant Governor is appropriate, the commission shall propose an</u>
- 26 adjustment under Arkansas Constitution, Article 19, § 31(e).
- 27 (2) A salary revision for the position of Lieutenant Governor
- 28 resulting from the study under subsection (a) of this section is not subject
- 29 <u>to Arkansas Constitution</u>, Article 19, § 31(g)(3)(A).

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- 31 SECTION 7. EFFECTIVE DATE. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b)
- 32 <u>and (c) of this section, this amendment is effective on and after January 1,</u>
- 33 *2023*.
- 34 (b) Section 2 of this amendment shall become effective on January 1,
- 35 *2017*.
- 36 <u>(c) A candidate for Lieutenant Governor shall run jointly with a</u>

1	candidate for Governor, and his or her name shall appear jointly on the
2	ballot with the candidate for Governor, at the 2022 general election.
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4	SECTION 8. BALLOT TITLE AND POPULAR NAME. When this proposed
5	$\underline{\text{amendment}}$ is submitted to the electors of this state on the general election
6	<pre>ballot:</pre>
7	(1) The title of this joint resolution shall be the ballot
8	title; and
9	(2) The popular name shall be "A Constitutional Amendment
10	Concerning the Office of Lieutenant Governor and Amending the Method of
11	Election, Assignment of Duties, and Method of Filling a Vacancy for the
12	Office of Lieutenant Governor".
