| 27 | WHEREAS, Morgan's mother, Colleen Nick, formed the Morgan Nick               |
| 28 | Foundation in 1996 and serves as a full time Executive Director; and         |

| 30 | WHEREAS, the Morgan Nick Foundation believes that to reduce the number       |
| 31 | of child abductions, we must educate our children and empower them with the  |
| 32 | skills necessary to protect them from the possible dangers of abduction, and |
| 33 | the foundation is proactive with prevention education programs for children, |
| 34 | communities, and schools; and  |

| 36 | WHEREAS, the Morgan Nick Foundation strives to be an organization            |

| 12 | WHEREAS, Ms. Nick is a nationally recognized spokesperson and advocate        |
| 13 | for missing children and she has spoken at Quantico (the Federal Bureau of    |

| 16 | General Janet Reno; and   |

| 23 | Technical College, the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children,    |
