 32 Services, and in the event that additional general revenue funding is
 33 provided by the General Assembly for these purposes. Should additional
 34 funding provided for these purposes be insufficient to provide for the
 35 increases in full, the increases shall be provided to the extent that funding
 36 is made available.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014
2 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

4 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

6 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - ALLOCATION RESTRICTION AND TRANSFER PROVISION.

7 Of the amounts allocated in the BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - ALLOCATION

8 RESTRICTIONS section above, it is the intent of the General Assembly that

9 such amounts are to be the maximum expended in the applicable fiscal year

10 from the funds as appropriated for State Assistance in the Behavioral Health

11 Services - Community Mental Health Centers appropriation for the benefit of

12 the appropriate program so enumerated. Provided, however, in the event that

13 unforeseen circumstances occur in the fiscal year which would necessitate a

14 transfer of the maximum allocation provided the BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES -

15 ALLOCATION RESTRICTIONS section above from one or more programs to another

16 program or programs as enumerated in the BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES -

17 ALLOCATION RESTRICTIONS section above, the Behavioral Health Services

18 Division with the approval of the Director of the Department of Human

19 Services shall make its request known, and the reasons thereof, to the Office

20 of Budget, Department of Finance and Administration in such form and detail

21 as may be required by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State. If approved,

22 such transfer approval shall be transmitted to the Bureau of Legislative

23 Research who shall make a report of the transfer and the reasons thereof to

24 the Arkansas Legislative Council at least quarterly.

28 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

30 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - LEGISLATIVE AUDIT OF MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS.

31 Every Mental Health Center eligible to receive any of the funds appropriated

32 for State Assistance in the Behavioral Health Services - Community Mental

33 Health Centers appropriation in this Act shall, as a condition of receiving

34 any such funds, be subject to an annual audit of the overall operation of

35 such Mental Health Center by the Division of Legislative Audit. The Mental

36 Health Centers shall submit a budget to the Behavioral Health Services

12 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. All funds appropriated
13 under the provisions of the State Assistance line item in the Behavioral
14 Health Services - Community Mental Health Centers appropriation in this Act
15 shall be apportioned on the basis of three dollars and six cents (\$3.06) per
16 capita for fiscal year ~~2014-2015~~ 2015-2016 or so much thereof as funds shall
17 become available. Additional funds shall be apportioned on the basis of fifty
18 cents (\$.50) per capita or a one-to-one State/Local funds matching basis for

27 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - GRANTS-IN-AID CONDITIONS FOR RECEIVING FUNDS.

28 Only locally-operated Centers and Clinics licensed or certified by the
29 Behavioral Health Services Division are eligible to receive funds
30 appropriated for State Assistance in the Behavioral Health Services -
31 Community Mental Health Centers appropriation in this Act, and as a condition
32 of receiving such funds they shall:

33 (1) Meet minimum standards of performance in the delivery of Mental Health
34 Services as defined by the Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health
35 Services Division. Such standards will identify priority and/or target
36 populations to be served. The standards shall describe procedures for

1 assuring timely service delivery to clients who are within the custody of the
2 Department of Human Services when such clients are referred to a duly
3 certified center or clinic. Provided further, all such priorities, policies
4 and procedures shall be reviewed by the House Aging, Children & Youth,
5 Legislative and Military Affairs Committee and the Senate Children and Youth
6 Committee.

7 (2) Supply statistical data to the Department of Human Services,
8 Behavioral Health Services Division.

9 (3) Establish and maintain a sound financial management system in
10 accordance with guidelines as set forth by the Department of Human Services,
11 Behavioral Health Services Division.

12 (4) Establish and maintain community support programs designed to provide
13 coordinated care and treatment to ensure ongoing therapeutic involvement and
14 individualized treatment for persons with long-term, severe mental illness.
15 Every community support program shall use a coordinated case management
16 system and shall provide or assure access to services for persons with long-
17 term, severe mental illness who reside within the respective catchment area
18 of the Center. At a minimum, each community support program shall provide
19 assessment, diagnosis, identification of persons in need of services, case
20 management, crisis intervention, psychiatric treatment including medication
21 services and supervision, counseling and psychotherapy, activities of daily
22 living, housing, protection and advocacy, and psychosocial rehabilitation
23 which may include services provided by day treatment programs.

24 (5) The Board of Directors of each Center or Clinic licensed or certified
25 by the Department of Human Services, Behavioral Health Services Division,
26 shall adopt and submit to the Director, Behavioral Health Services Division,
27 in the form and according to the procedures specified by the Director,
28 Behavioral Health Services Division, an annual plan for the delivery of
29 community support services for persons with long-term, severe mental illness.
30 Each Center's plan must be approved by the Director, Behavioral Health
31 Services Division.

35 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - FEDERAL FUNDS. It is the specific intent of the
2 General Assembly that in the event of the availability of federal funding for
3 the Division of Behavioral Health Services during the fiscal year ending June
4 30, ~~2015~~ 2016, that such funding be utilized to conserve or reduce the
5 expenditure of general revenue except where prohibited by law.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~

9 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

11 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES. Pay rates for physicians and chief psychologists
12 within the Division of Behavioral Health Services may include the special
13 allowances available to UAMS physicians and professional faculty as described
14 in the special language of the UAMS appropriation. Part of the salaries of
15 such staff will come from the receipt of professional income in the care of
16 patients and/or funds received from federal agencies, foundations and other
17 private sponsors in the support of research. Provided that any such allowance
18 shall not exceed, for any employee, an amount equal to two and one half times
19 the salary authorized by the General Assembly. The specific Division of
20 Behavioral Health classifications covered by this language are:

26 Prior to these allowances being made available for an individual, they
27 will be approved by the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and reviewed by the

29 Committee.

30 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
31 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

32

33 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

35 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - VOCATIONAL TRAINEES. The Division of Behavioral
36 Health Services of the Department of Human Services is hereby authorized to

1 provide employment opportunities for some of the working residents who are
2 separate from the currently authorized regular vocational trainee positions.
3 The positions authorized herein shall not be incorporated into the present
4 classification system but shall be provided for by each Community Mental
5 Health Center, or State Hospital, on a cash account basis. It is the intent
6 of the General Assembly that the authorization of these positions shall
7 facilitate the Agency's ability to provide for residents who are not part of
8 a regular vocational training program.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~

12 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

14 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - JOB SHARE. The Division of Behavioral Health
15 Services can utilize job share for positions within the nursing
16 classification (RN, LPN/LPTN, BHA/CNA) for up to 24 hours per week per
17 individual. This will allow the Division to offer weekend option shifts to
18 nursing personnel without increasing the number of positions.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
20 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

21
22 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

24 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - STATE HOSPITAL CONTINGENCY POSITIONS. If the
25 Department of Human Services determines, and after prior review by the
26 Legislative Council, it shall be determined that it is in the best interest
27 of the State of Arkansas to discontinue a management contract with a private
28 provider and it is deemed necessary to utilize Department staff to provide
29 the required services, the Director of the Department of Human Services may
30 request the Department of Finance and Administration to approve the
31 establishment of one or more additional positions at salary rates not to
32 exceed the maximum salaries established for comparable positions in the
33 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, the Department of Human
34 Services' Appropriation Act, and the University of Arkansas for Medical
35 Sciences' Appropriation Act. Upon approval by the Department of Finance and
36 Administration and after review by the Legislative Council, the Department of

1 Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services may establish such
2 positions.

3 If the agency requests continuation of a "Growth Pool" position(s) as
4 established herein, the position(s) must be requested as a new position(s) in
5 the agency's budget request.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014

9 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS
11 HEALTH CENTER. (A) The Department of Human Services shall not close the
12 Arkansas Health Center that provides skilled nursing through specialized
13 services and programs.

14 (B) The Department of Human Services shall continue to accept clients for
15 whom it has determined that skilled nursing and specialized services are
16 needed at the Arkansas Health Center.

17 (C) No funds shall be transferred or reduced from the Arkansas Health
18 Center, except for use as federal matching funds, below the approved funding
19 level on March 1, 2003 without the prior approval of the Arkansas Legislative
20 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

21 (D) Determining the maximum amount of appropriation and general revenue
22 funding for a state agency each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General
23 Assembly. This is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the
24 appropriation act(s) for a state agency and the general revenue allocations
25 authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue
26 Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that the
27 Department of Human Services may operate more efficiently if some flexibility
28 is provided to the Department of Human Services authorizing broad powers
29 under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the
30 General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the
31 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section.
32 The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
33 Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of

9 for a comparable position as authorized under § 21-5-201 et seq. during any
10 fiscal year, nor shall such an employee be employed for a period of time to
11 exceed one thousand eight hundred (1,800) hours in any single fiscal year.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014

15 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
17 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - APPORTIONMENT OF FUNDS. Each Community Mental
18 Health Center shall contract with one or more facilities of its choice
19 (excluding Arkansas State Hospital) to provide the inpatient care for
20 indigent patients which the Community Mental Health Center has determined to
21 be necessary after prompt screening by the Community Mental Health Center.
22 Payment for patients screened and approved by the Community Mental Health
23 Center who receive care at these inpatient facilities shall be provided to
24 the inpatient facilities at the contract rate unless the funds available for
25 this purpose have been exhausted. Available funding as determined by the
26 Director of the Department of Human Services shall be apportioned on a per
27 capita basis up to a maximum of three dollars and forty-eight cents (\$3.48)
28 per capita for fiscal year ~~2014-2015~~ 2015-2016. The most recently available
29 federal population census shall be used in determining the population of each
30 catchment area of the thirteen Community Mental Health Centers. All amounts
31 appropriated under this section shall be used by Community Mental Health
32 Centers for residents of each center's catchment area and such funds shall
33 only be accessed as the payment of last resort.

34 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,

3 REPORTING. The Division of Behavioral Health Services shall develop an
4 evaluation and monitoring program that will assure all expenditures are made
5 consistent with the intent of these appropriations. As a condition for
6 receiving funds under this Act, Community Mental Health Centers (CMHCs) shall
7 report quarterly to the Division of Behavioral Health Services the following
8 data:

9 (1) The number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent
10 admissions referred by CMHCs to community-based settings;

11 (2) The number of involuntary commitments and medically indigent
12 admissions to community-based settings receiving assistance from the acute
13 mental health services funds;

14 (3) The total number of acute bed days utilized by these involuntary
15 commitments;

16 (4) The total number of bed days utilized by these medically indigent
17 admissions;

18 (5) The average length of stay of admissions for these involuntary
19 commitments per catchment area;

20 (6) The average length of stay of admissions for these medically indigent
21 admissions per catchment area;

22 (7) The number of medically indigent admissions per catchment area unable
23 to receive assistance from the acute mental health services funds due to such
24 funds being depleted by prior admissions;

25 (8) The number of re-admissions per catchment area for involuntary
26 commitments and medically indigent admissions to community-based settings
27 receiving assistance from the acute mental health services; and

28 (9) Identify any steps taken by CMHCs to improve access to acute mental
29 health services.

30 The Department of Human Services - Division of Behavioral Health Services
31 shall report quarterly the data collected from the CMHCs to the House and
32 Senate Subcommittees on Public Health.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
34 2015 through June 30, 2016.

35
36 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ACUTE
2 MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES – PER CAPITA - LEGISLATIVE FINDINGS AND INTENT. The
3 General Assembly recognizes that the state encouraged the treatment of
4 mentally ill residents within community-based settings over two decades ago
5 and has taken various approaches to funding since then. The General Assembly
6 also recognizes that there are inherent problems within the current public
7 mental health system that create disincentives for proper treatment and care.
8 The purpose of the Acute Mental Health Services – Per Capita appropriation is
9 to provide an appropriation for acute mental health services to be utilized
10 within community-based settings for the treatment and care of medically
11 indigent persons 18 years of age and older and involuntary commitments to the
12 public mental health system. The appropriation for acute mental health
13 services provided in this Act shall only be used for Community Mental Health
14 Centers licensed and certified by the Division of Behavioral Health of the
15 Department of Human Services for use within community-based settings and
16 facilities.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
18 2015 through June 30, 2016.

19
20 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
22 BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES - PROCEEDS FOR SALES OF TIMBER AND HAY - CAPITAL
23 IMPROVEMENTS AND EQUIPMENT. The Division of Behavioral Health Services is
24 authorized to use administrative operating account for capital improvements
25 to the physical plant, and for the purchase of capital equipment, and for the
26 operation of the Arkansas Health Center, operated by the Department of Human
27 Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services. The funds shall be held by
28 the Department of Human Services, Division of Behavioral Health Services,
29 from the proceeds of the sale of timber and hay that may be harvested from
30 land owned by the Division of Behavioral Health Services. All funds deposited
31 and all expenses shall be tracked separately. The harvesting of timber and
32 hay is specifically authorized to provide funds to finance capital
33 improvements to the physical plant, for the purchase of major capital
34 equipment, and for the operation of the Arkansas Health Center. The Division
35 of Behavioral Health Services shall report all income derived from the sale
36 of timber and hay to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the

1 Legislative Council. Any contracts initiated for the harvesting of timber and
2 hay shall be submitted to the Review Subcommittee of the Arkansas Legislative
3 Council for prior review. All expenditures of funds derived from the sale of
4 timber and hay will be expended in accordance with relevant state purchasing
5 laws.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2014
7 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

8

9 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
11 RATES OF PAY AND EMPLOYMENT WORK DAYS. For employees hired on or after July
12 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State Hospital in the classifications listed below,
13 the Division of Behavioral Health Director shall implement salary adjustments
14 utilizing the approved pay grid for teachers employed by the Arkansas Schools
15 for the Blind and Deaf.

16 To achieve the salary adjustments, the Division of Behavioral Health is
17 authorized to pay special rates of pay for classifications at the Arkansas
18 State Hospital listed below:

22 Funding for the minimum compensation provided for in this section that
23 is supported in whole or in part from general revenues, shall, if required,
24 be provided by a transfer from the Merit Adjustment Fund to the proper fund
25 or fund account and in such amounts as determined by the Chief Fiscal Officer
26 of the State. The Division of Behavioral Health shall in addition to the
27 funds provided in this Act for Annual Career Service Recognition Payments
28 from the Merit Adjustment Fund, make available any funding generated from
29 agency salary savings for such purposes from the funds or fund accounts as
30 provided by law.

31 For employees hired on or after July 1, 2013, at the Arkansas State
32 Hospital in the classifications listed above, the Division of Behavioral
33 Health Director shall set the number of work days for the employment year to
34 equal the number of days worked by those employed in the same classifications
35 at the Arkansas Schools for the Blind and Deaf. The accrual, use, and
36 carryover of sick days, personal days, and holidays of the employees at the

1 Arkansas State Hospital that are hired on or after July 1, 2013, or current
2 employees choosing to adopt this plan, shall be treated in the same manner as
3 those employed in the same classifications at the Arkansas Schools for the
4 Blind and Deaf.

5 Those currently employed at the Arkansas State Hospital in the
6 classifications listed above as of June 30, 2013, have the one-time option of
7 adopting this language or continuing to operate under the same salary, leave
8 and benefit plans they are currently receiving. Employees must make their
9 decision by June 30, 2013.

10 Accrued annual and holiday leave, up to 240 hours, as of June 30,
11 2013, will be paid out to current employees choosing to adopt this plan. Any
12 additional accrued annual and holiday leave will be forfeited. Accrued sick
13 leave, as of June 30, 2013, shall be retained on file and shall be exhausted
14 before any newly accrued sick leave may be taken.

15 All employees affected by this section shall be eligible to receive
16 hazardous duty pay for time worked in eligible areas.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
18 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

19

20 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
21 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
22 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
23 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
24 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
25 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
26 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
27 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
28 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

29

30 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
31 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
32 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
33 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
34 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
35 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or

3 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
4 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
5 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
6 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
7 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
8 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
9 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
10 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
11 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
12 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
13 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
