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20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

24 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP - OPERATIONS. There is hereby authorized, for

25 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences for the 2015-2016 fiscal

26 year, the following maximum number of part-time or temporary employees, to be

27 known as "Extra Help", payable from funds appropriated herein for such

28 purposes: six hundred twenty-five (625) temporary or part-time employees,

29 when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the Uniform

30 Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act for the

31 appropriate classification.

32

33 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA

35 HELP - UNIVERSITY HOSPITAL PRN POOL. There is hereby authorized, for the

36 University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-

1 time or temporary positions, to be known as "PRN Extra Help", payable from
2 funds appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing RN's and LPN's in a
3 Nursing PRN Pool: four hundred ten (410), when needed, at rates of pay not
4 to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this Act.
5 If the agency requests continuation of a "PRN Extra Help" position(s) as
6 established herein during the next fiscal year, the extra help position(s)
7 must be requested as a new extra help position(s) in the agency's budget
8 request.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
10 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

11
12 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EXTRA
14 HELP - UAMS TEMPS. There is hereby authorized for the University of Arkansas
15 for Medical Sciences, the following number of part-time or temporary
16 positions, to be known as "UAMS TEMPS/EXTRA HELP", payable from funds
17 appropriated herein, for the purpose of employing qualified individuals in a
18 UAMS Temporary Pool: Five hundred thirty (530), when needed, at rates of pay
19 not to exceed the rate of pay for comparable positions authorized by this
20 Act.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
22 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

5 SECTION 45. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ABUSED
7 CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS SERVICES PROGRAM FUNDING PROVISION. In the event
8 the amount of general revenue distributed to the University of Arkansas
9 Medical Center Fund for the Department of Pediatrics and the Psychiatric
10 Research Institute each fiscal year is at least equal to the amount
11 distributed during the 2012-13 fiscal year, an amount not less than seven
12 hundred thousand dollars (\$700,000) shall be allocated and made available as
13 follows: four hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$450,000) each fiscal year
14 shall be made available exclusively to support the purposes and goals to
15 improve screening, monitoring and care for abused children and adolescents
16 through the Child Safety Centers or the University of Arkansas for Medical
17 Sciences as referred by the Child Safety Centers. Maintenance of statewide
18 screening and assessment protocols as well as evidence-based training of
19 mental health professionals are to be considered critical components of the
20 overall goals. For the provision of assessment and therapeutic services,
21 these funds are to be provided to the Child Safety Centers through contracts
22 from the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences. The contracts will
23 stipulate the terms of the agreement and reporting requirements; an amount
24 not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) may be utilized for
25 administrative costs as may be necessary to administer the program or if
26 determined not to be needed for administrative costs may be placed in reserve
27 for future needs of the program. The remaining two hundred thousand dollars
28 (\$200,000) shall be allocated and made available to the Department of
29 Pediatrics for expenses for medical examinations, consultation, education and
30 training as stipulated in the terms of agreement between the Chancellor of
31 the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and the Department of
32 Pediatrics.

36 SECTION 46. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds

1 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
 2 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
 3 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
 4 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
 5 Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures

 7 State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of
 8 Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied

 11 SECTION 47. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
 12 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
 13 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
 14 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
 15 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
 16 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
 17 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
 18 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

 20 SECTION 48. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
 21 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
 22 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
 23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
 24 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
 25 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
 26 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
 27 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
 28 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
 29 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
 30 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
