| 27 | SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 23, is amended to add an           |    |

| 32 | 6-23-1001. Application for adult education charter school.                   |    |
| 33 | (a)(1) A eligible entity may apply to the authorizer for adult               |    |
| 34 | education charter school status for an adult education program that offers a |    |
| 35 | curriculum that culminates in:   |    |
| 36 | (A) A high school diploma; and   |    |

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| 2  | (2) An adult education charter school shall be recognized by the             |
| 3  | State Board of Education as an open-enrollment public charter school.        |
| 4  | (3) An adult education charter school does not count toward the              |

| 6  | (b) A nonprofit entity's application for an adult education charter          |

| 5  | 6-23-1002. Authorization for adult education public charter.                  |
| 6  | The authorizer shall review the application for an adult education            |
| 7  | public charter school pilot program and may approve an application that:      |
| 8  | (1) Provides an acceptable plan for meeting the industry needs                |
| 9  | for a sufficiently trained workforce in the state;                            |
| 10 | (2) Includes a set of performance criteria objectives for the                 |
| 11 | terms of the charter and the means for measuring the performance criteria     |
| 12 | objectives on a yearly basis;   |
| 13 | (3) Includes a comprehensive strategy for engaging the                        |
| 14 | community, including business leaders, in the process of meeting the goals    |
| 15 | and objectives of the charter;  |
| 16 | (4) Includes an agreement to provide an annual report to the                  |

| 22 | 6-23-1003. Resubmission of applications.                                      |
| 23 | (a) The authorizer may allow an applicant to resubmit the application         |
| 24 | for an adult education charter school if the original application was, in the |
| 25 | opinion of the authorizer, deficient in one (1) or more respects.             |
| 26 | (b) The Department of Education may provide technical assistance to           |
| 27 | the adult education charter school applicant in the creation or modification  |

| 30 | 6-23-1004. Enrollment in an adult education charter school.                   |
| 31 | (a) An approved adult education charter school shall have an                  |
| 32 | enrollment cap of no more than one hundred fifty (150) students.              |
| 33 | (b) A person who is at least nineteen (19) years of age and no more           |
| 34 | than fifty (50) years of age may enroll in an adult education charter school  |
| 35 | if the person has:  |

| 31 | appropriate for assessing adult education charter school program participants |
