20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
21

22 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of
23 Education, to be payable from the Department of Education Public School Fund
24 Account, for grants and aid to local school districts and special programs
25 of the Department of Education for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016, the
26 following:

 24 hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education, to be payable from the

7 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BROADBAND
9 FACILITIES MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - RESTRICTIONS AND MATCHING FUNDS. (i) The
10 appropriation in this Act for the Broadband Facilities Matching Grant Program
11 shall not be used for Arkansas Research and Education Optical Network (AREON)
12 or Middle Mile Connectivity.

13 (ii) The funds appropriated for state match for the Broadband
14 Facilities Matching Grant Program in this Act shall be paid on a one-to-one
15 state/local matching basis.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
17 ~~2014~~ 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

18
19 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. Any
21 unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Broadband Facilities Matching
22 Grant Program remaining on June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016, in the Department of Education
23 Public School Fund Account shall be designated and retained for the Broadband
24 Facilities Matching Grant Program.

25 Any carry forward of unexpected balance of funding as authorized herein, may
26 be carried forward under the following conditions:

27 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016 the Agency shall by written statement
28 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
29 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

30 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
31 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the
32 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting
33 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or
34 Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name
35 or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the
36 written request set forth in item (1) above;

1 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a
2 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
3 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written
4 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc.
5 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty
6 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution
7 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
8 Committee; and

9 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall
10 include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals
11 and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or
12 Institution.

13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
14 ~~2014~~ 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

15
16 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
17 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND
18 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1
19 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated
20 Funding that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for
21 Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act and shall be used
22 there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code
23 §6-20-604 on a pro rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro
24 rata basis is defined as providing each district qualifying for additional
25 funding under subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how
26 each district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional
27 funding amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and
28 appropriation remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of
29 Arkansas Code §6-20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the
30 provisions of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the
31 available funds are exhausted.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
33 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

34
35 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO

1 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School
2 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a
3 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state
4 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district
5 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is
6 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir
7 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend
8 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to
9 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or
10 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school
11 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the
12 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act
13 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating
14 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The
15 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such
16 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department
17 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation
18 as is deemed necessary.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
20 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

21

22 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL
24 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special
25 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide
26 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such
27 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are
28 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of
29 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute
30 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
32 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

33

34 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

36 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each

1 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time
2 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
3 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the
4 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation
5 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State
6 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-
7 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount
8 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public
9 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or
10 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public
11 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
13 2015 through June 30, 2016.

14

15 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
17 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
18 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
19 established by the State Board of Education.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
21 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

22

23 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
25 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
26 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
27 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
29 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

30

31 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
33 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval
34 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas
35 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to
36 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related

1 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,
2 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than
3 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

4 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
5 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
6 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
7 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
8 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
9 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
10 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently
11 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of
12 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision
13 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General
14 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative
15 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The
16 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
17 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by
18 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional
19 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
21 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

22
23 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN
25 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds
26 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each
27 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each
28 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -
29 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the
30 Quiz Bowl.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
32 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

33
34 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
36 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item

1 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for
2 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school
3 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to,
4 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by
5 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based
6 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving
7 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be
8 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that
9 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be
10 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or
11 school district participating in the program.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
13 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

14

15 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

17 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School
18 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any
19 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the
20 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for
21 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the
22 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,
23 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the
24 Department of Correction.

25 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
26 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

27

28 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
29 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OPEN-
30 ENROLLMENT VIRTUAL CHARTER SCHOOL PROVISIONS.

31 (a)(1) Regardless of any provision of law to the contrary, a school
32 district or public charter school shall remit to the Department of Education
33 the foundation funding amount for the ~~2014~~ 2015 ~~2015~~ 2016 school year and
34 each school year thereafter for a student who is counted in the school
35 district's or public charter school's average daily membership for the
36 previous school year but who is attending an open-enrollment public virtual

1 charter school that uses internet, long-distance, or virtual technology as
2 the primary method of teaching.

3 (2)(A) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, for each new student
4 enrolled pursuant to subdivision (d) of this section, an open-enrollment
5 public virtual charter school shall:

6 (i) Maintain a record of each school district the newly
7 enrolled student attended by quarter in the school year immediately before
8 enrolling in the open-enrollment public virtual charter school; and

9 (ii) Update the record maintained in subdivision (a)(2)(A) of
10 this section quarterly.

11 (B) Quarterly, beginning April 1, 2014, an open-enrollment
12 public virtual charter school shall submit to the department a copy of all
13 records required under subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section.

14 (3) Beginning April 1, 2014, an open-enrollment public virtual charter
15 school shall not receive per-student state foundation funding aid for a new
16 student enrolled pursuant to subdivision (d) of this section if the open-
17 enrollment public virtual charter school does not maintain and submit the
18 record required in subdivision (a)(2) of this section.

19 (b) As of school year 2012-13, the State Board of Education has
20 approved a maximum enrollment of 500 for the open-enrollment public virtual
21 charter school.

22 (c) Beginning in school year 2013-14 and thereafter, for an
23 open-enrollment public charter granted to a virtual school, the school may
24 enroll an eligible student in any grade, kindergarten through grade twelve
25 (K-12), up to a total school enrollment of three thousand (3,000) students.

26 (d)(1) A student is eligible to enroll in the additional two thousand
27 five hundred (2,500) slots authorized by subsection (c) of this section if
28 the student was enrolled in an Arkansas public school, other than an open-
29 enrollment public virtual charter school, for the first three quarters of the
30 prior school year.

31 (2) Subdivision (d)(1) does not apply to a student who is enrolling
32 in kindergarten.

33 (e) A student who is enrolled in an open-enrollment public virtual
34 charter school on or before January 1, 2014 is presumed to be legally
35 enrolled.

36 (f) The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July

1 1, ~~2014~~ 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

2
3 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER
5 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby
6 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for
7 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds
8 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to
9 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of
10 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek
11 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget
12 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the
13 Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds
14 that will be expended. The Department may contract with the Division of Child
15 Care and Early Childhood Education to administer the program.

16 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
17 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
18 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
19 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
20 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
21 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary
22 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring
23 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as
24 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative
25 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.
26 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
27 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
28 this entire section is void.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
30 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

31
32 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AVERAGE
34 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to
35 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical
36 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is

1 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National
2 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers.
3 The Arkansas Department of Education shall submit this data annually to the
4 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's
5 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which
6 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
8 2015 through June 30, 2016.

9

10 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
12 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated for the Arkansas Better
13 Chance for School Success Program remaining on June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016, in the
14 Department of Education Public School Fund Account shall be designated and
15 retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program.

16 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,
17 may be carried forward under the following conditions:

18 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016 the Agency shall by written statement set
19 forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
20 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

21 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall
22 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the
23 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting
24 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or
25 Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name
26 or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the
27 written request set forth in (1) above;

28 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written
29 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
30 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written
31 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for
32 which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30)
33 days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents
34 its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget
35 Committee; and

36 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall include

1 all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals and/or a
2 statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
4 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

5

6 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. PUBLIC
8 SCHOOL RETIREE HEALTH INSURANCE. The Employee Benefits Division of the
9 Department of Finance and Administration may use up to eleven dollars and
10 twenty cents (\$11.20) from each contribution made under Arkansas Code
11 §6-17-1117 (a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible
12 members electing to participate in the public school employees' health
13 insurance program as a retiree.

14 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,
15 2015 through June 30, 2016.

16

17 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
18 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
19 ARKANSAS/STRIVE PROGRAM TRANSFER. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
20 shall transfer on his books and those of the State Treasurer and the State
21 Auditor, the sum of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) during each
22 fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to
23 the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, specifically to provide
24 funding for the Arkansas/STRIVE Program. The total amount of funds
25 transferred each fiscal year pursuant to this section shall not be subject to
26 any indirect costs by the University of Arkansas at Little Rock.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
28 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

29

30 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HEALTH
32 INSURANCE. The appropriation contained herein for Public School Employee
33 Insurance each fiscal year shall be used to provide the state contribution
34 for insurance premiums for employees of the Cooperative Education Services
35 Areas, Vocational Centers, and the school operated by the Department of
36 Correction who participate in the Arkansas Public School Life and Health

1 Insurance Program.

2 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
3 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

4

5 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
6 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

7 ALTERNATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. The Department of Education may provide
8 funding for Alternative Learning Environment Programs in excess of the
9 regulatory limitation of six (6) hours per day for those programs that
10 operate more than twelve hours per day, in a proportionate manner and upon
11 special request to the Department of Education.

12 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
13 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

14

15 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
16 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STATE
17 FUND RESTRICTIONS. No state funds shall be used for abortion referral in
18 public schools, or for abortion services. Funds shall be expended in
19 accordance with Arkansas Code Annotated §6-18-703.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
21 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

22

23 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

25 ADDITIONAL PUBLIC SCHOOL EMPLOYEE HEALTH INSURANCE FUNDING PROVISION.

26 Effective for the plan year beginning January 1, ~~2014~~ 2015, if ninety-eight
27 percent (98%) of the uniform rate of tax used in the calculation of State
28 Foundation Funding Aid for fiscal year ~~2013-2014~~ 2015-2016 exceeds nine
29 hundred twenty million seven hundred thirty-one thousand eight hundred
30 nineteen dollars (\$920,731,819), the Department of Education shall pay up to
31 fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000) of the total increase over the nine
32 hundred twenty million seven hundred thirty-one thousand eight hundred
33 nineteen dollars (\$920,731,819) to the Employee Benefits Division of the
34 Department of Finance and Administration in additional health insurance
35 contributions for eligible employees electing to participate in the public
36 school employees' health insurance program administered by the State and

1 Public School Life and Health Insurance Board.

2 The Department of Education shall make the contributions by transferring
3 funds to the division in quarterly installments. Funds provided by the
4 Department of Education to the division under this section shall be
5 administered by the board for the benefit of the employee participants of the
6 public school employees' health insurance program.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
8 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

9

10 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ARKANSAS
12 GOVERNOR'S SCHOOL FUNDING. The Department of Education shall allocate, budget
13 and commit for expenditure two hundred fifty thousand dollars (\$250,000), in
14 addition to funds already being provided for the Arkansas Governor's School,
15 to fund the appropriation authorized from general revenue for the Gifted and
16 Talented program as appropriated in Section 1 herein. With this additional
17 funding the duration of the Arkansas Governor's School shall be extended from
18 four (4) weeks to six (6) weeks.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~
20 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

21

22 SECTION 29. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
23 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
24 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
25 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
27 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
28 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
29 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
30 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

31

32 SECTION 30. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
34 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
35 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

1 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
2 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
3 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.
4

5 SECTION 31. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
7 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
