28	to add an additional section to read as follows:

30	(a)(1) Annually, beginning June 30, 2016, the Depar	<u>tment of Workforce</u>
31	Services shall prepare or contract with an entity to prepa	<u>re an economic</u>
32	security report of employment and earning outcomes for deg	rees and
33	certificates earned at state-supported institutions of hig	her education.
34	(2) The report shall be made available online	and shall be
35	easily accessible and readable by the public.	
36	(3) The report shall (A) Be broken down by ed	<u>ucational sector</u>

2	(B) Use data available to the Department of Higher
3	Education relating to the employment and earnings of graduates of degree or
4	certificate programs from a state-supported institution of higher education;
5	(C) Use an integrated postsecondary education data system
6	for calculating the average student loan debt of a graduate of a degree or
7	certificate program from a state-supported institution of higher education;
8	(D) Include data on the employment of graduates of a
9	degree or certificate program from a state-supported institution of higher
10	education beginning the year after the degree or certificate is earned,
11	including graduates employed full-time, by:

14	(E) Include data on the earnings of graduates of a degree
15	or certificate program at a state-supported institution of higher education

18	(b) Annually, beginning July 1, 2016, a four-year state-supported
19	institution of higher education and a two-year state-supported institution of
20	higher education shall provide an enrolled student with electronic access to
21	the economic security report of employment and earnings outcomes prepared by
22	the Department of Workforce Services before the student registers for
23	<u>classes.</u>
24	(c) Each four-year state-supported institution of higher education and
25	each two-year state-supported institution of higher education shall provide
26	each student electronic access to the following information annually before
27	the student registers for classes:
28	(1) The top twenty-five percent (25%) of certificates and
29	degrees reported by the four-year state-supported institution of higher
30	education in terms of the highest full-time job placement and highest average
31	annual earnings in the year after certificate or degree completion; and
32	(2) The bottom ten percent (10%) of certificates and
33	degrees reported by the four-year state-supported institution of higher
34	education in terms of the lowest full-time job placement and lowest average
35	annual earnings in the year after certificate or degree completion.
36	(d) Annually, beginning August 1, 2016, a public school student a

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1	grade seven through grade twelve (7-12) or the student's parent or guardian
2	shall receive a two-page summary of and electronic access to the Department
3	of Workforce Service's economic security report of employment and earnings
4	outcomes prepared under this section.
