3	of the state, and each institution of higher education shall provide on a		
4	quarterly basis a statement of the reasons for any vacant budgeted positions.		
5	(3) The information shall be compiled on forms developed by the		
6	Bureau of Legislative Research and submitted to the Legislative Council on a		
7	calendar-quarterly basis.		
8	(b)(1) On or before the twentieth day of each month, each executive,		
9	judicial, legislative, and other state agency shall provide to the Bureau of		
10	Legislative Research the following information as of the last day of the		
11	<pre>immediately preceding month:</pre>		
12	(A) The number of appropriated positions, including		
13	without limitation all positions appropriated in a state agency's current		
14	appropriation act and any additional positions approved during the interim;		
15	(B) The number of temporary transition pool positions		
16	created in the interim and active for the month;		
17	(C)(i) The number of full-time employees, including part-		
18	time employees in full-time positions.		
19	(ii) If two (2) or more part-time employees share a		
20	full-time position, only one (1) employee shall be included in the number;

23	(F) The number of appropriated extra-help positions,

15	from the payroll but are still considered to be employed by the institution		
16	of higher education and are assumed to return the next semester shall be		
17	included in the number during the months that they are not on the payroll;		
18	(C) The number of appropriated full-time positions that		
19	are vacant;		
20	(D) The number of part-time and extra-help positions that		
21	are appropriated and any additional part-time and extra-help positions		
22	approved during the interim;		
23	(E)(i) The number of part-time and extra-help employees,		
24	including without limitation faculty and graduate assistants.

5	(A) One (1) report containing an average for each state		
6	agency for the quarter; and		
7	(B) One (1) report containing an average for each		
8	institution of higher education for the quarter.		
9	(4) Each executive, judicial, legislative, and other state		
10	agency and each institution of higher education shall provide in the fourth		
11	quarter of each fiscal year a list of all positions vacant for at least one		
12	(1) year.		
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
