8	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
9	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that most public school students		
10	and private school students have access to interscholastic sports; that home		
11	schooled students and some private school students are currently denied		
12	equitable access to these sports; and that this act is immediately necessary		
13	to allow adequate time for the development of rules and allow scheduling for		
14	the 2015-2016 academic year. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist,		
15	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
16	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
17	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
18	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
19	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
20	<pre>bill; or</pre>		
21	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
22	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
