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5	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
6	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the safety of public school		
7	and postsecondary institution students is of critical importance; that the		
8	disclosure of emergency and security plans by public schools and		
9	postsecondary institutions threatens student safety and inhibits the school's		
10	or institution's ability to plan for crisis situations; and that this act		
11	should become effective at the earliest opportunity to prevent such		
12	disclosures and promote the safety of students. Therefore, an emergency is		
13	declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the		
14	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective		
15	<u>on:</u>		
16	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
17	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
18	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
19	bill; or		
20	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
21	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
