Arkansas Code § 6-15-404(g)(1), program implementation of 10 the Arkansas Comprehensive Testing, Assessment, and Accountability Program 11 Act, is amended to read as follows: 12 (g)(1) The department shall develop and implement an augmented, 13 criterion-referenced, or norm-referenced assessment program that is valid, 14 reliable, externally linked to a national norm, and vertically scaled for 15 public school students in grades three through eight (3-8), which measures 16 application of knowledge and skills in reading and writing literacy and 17 mathematics. 18 19 SECTION 5. 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25 SECTION 18. Arkansas Code § 6-15-2009(b), concerning public school
 26 assessments and remediation, is amended to read as follows:

(b)(1) Each <u>A</u> student identified as not meeting the satisfactory pass levels in the immediate previously administered benchmark <u>state-mandated</u> assessment shall participate in the remediation activities as required in the student's individualized academic improvement plan beginning in the school year the assessment results are reported.

(2) The Department of Education may determine that an
individualized education program for a student with disabilities identified
under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, 20 U.S.C. § 1400 et
seq., meets the requirements of an individualized academic improvement plan
under this section if the individualized education program addresses one (1)

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or more academic areas in which the student is not proficient on state-mandated augmented, criterion referenced, or norm referenced assessments. (3)(A) The public school district where the student is enrolled shall notify the student's parent, guardian, or caregiver of the parent's role and responsibilities as well as the consequences for the student's failure to participate in the plan. (B) This notice may be provided via student handbooks issued to students. (4) A student in grades three through eight (3-8) identified as not passing a benchmark state-mandated assessment and who fails to participate in the subsequent academic improvement plan shall be retained and shall not be promoted to the next appropriate grade until: (A) The student is deemed to have participated in an academic improvement plan; or (B) The student passes the benchmark state-mandated assessment for the current grade level in which the student is retained.
