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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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20	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 18-61-101, concerning actions to recover
21	land, tenements, or hereditaments, is amended to add an additional subsection
22	to read as follows:
23	(e)(1) Subsections (a)-(c) of this section do not apply to the
24	circumstances set forth in subdivision (e)(2) and subdivision (e)(3) of this
25	<u>section.</u>
26	(2) The public's right to use an unpaved road established by an
27	easement is abandoned if:
28	(A) Access is denied by a gate across the road; and
29	(B) The gate is closed and locked continuously, other than
30	briefly to allow access by the owner or others with the owner's express
31	permission, for one (1) year.
32	(3) An action to assert the public's right to use an unpaved
33	road established by an easement is barred after the easement is abandoned
34	under subdivision (e)(2) of this section.
35	(4) This subsection does not apply to:
36	(A) A road or highway maintained by the State of Arkansas;

T	(b) A road maintained or accepted for perpetual
2	maintenance by a county;
3	(C) A road maintained by an improvement district;
4	(D) A road within the jurisdictional limits of a city of
5	the first class or city of the second class; or
6	(E) The claim or right of any person, his or her heirs,
7	successors, assigns, or tenants who use the unpaved road as a means of
8	ingress and egress to lands owned or leased by that person, his or her heirs,

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11	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 18-61-102 is amended to read as follows:
12	18-61-102. Entry upon land or tenements — Exception for unpaved road
13	easements.
14	(a) No $\underline{\mathrm{An}}$ entry upon lands or tenements shall $\underline{\mathrm{not}}$ be deemed sufficient
15	or valid as a claim unless an action is commenced thereon within one (1) year
16	after the entry and within seven (7) years from the time when the right to
17	make the entry descended or accrued.
18	(b) This section does not apply to the circumstances set forth in §
19	18-61-101(e)(2) and (3).
