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University of Arkansas System (40) SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that institutions of higher education may receive revenue from sources other than general revenue; that revisions to the number of provisional positions may be necessary to serve the students enrolled for the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 academic years; and that this act is immediately necessary to prevent the unnecessary delay in "meeting the educational needs" of students. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on: (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bil<u>l; or</u> (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. /s/E.
