21	<u>(a) The Genera</u>	l Assembly finds that is it necessary	for Arkansas to
22	properly evaluate and	address the workforce training needs	of our state in
23	order to compete with	an aggressive and effective economic	<u>development</u>
24	strategy for the twen	ty-first century.	
25	<u>(b) Considerat</u>	ion of secondary and postsecondary edu	ucation, including
26	career and technical	programs, is essential for creating a	successful

28	<u>(c) Encouragin</u>	g Arkansans to pursue high-demand jobs	s, including
29	without limitation in	dustry-recognized credentials, career	and technical

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1	(e)(1) Institutions and organizations will unite around shared		
2	regional sector strategies that support an employer demand-driven workforce		
3	system.		
4	(2) This system should support:		
5	(A) Creation of state and regional industry-sector driven		
6	partnerships that employers lead and to which education institutions respond;		
7	(B) Data-driven decisions on development and deployment of		
8	workforce training and education programs;		
9	(C) Development of articulated education pathways, from		
10	grades K-12 to baccalaureate, that are aligned with employment career		
11	pathways that include industry-recognized credential and employment step-out		
12	points; and		
13	(D) Increased diversity and representation from all		
14	regions of the state.		
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16	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 60, Subchapter 1, is amended		
17	to add an additional section to read as follows:		
18	6-60-105. Workforce initiative funding.		
19	(a)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall act as the disbursing		
20	entity for all funds for the Workforce Initiative Act.		
21	(2) The Department of Higher Education shall establish		
22	procedures for the request for proposals under subdivision (b)(2) of this		
23	section that shall:		
24	(A) Be approved by the Governor;		
25	(B) Include input from the Department of Education, the		
26	Department of Workforce Services, the Arkansas Economic Development		
27	Commission, and the Department of Career Education; and		
28	(C) Be reported to the Legislative Council.		
29	(3) The Department of Higher Education shall establish a grant		
30	application review and award process under this section that shall:		
31	(A) Be approved by the Governor; and		
32	(B) Include recommendations from the Department of		
33	Education, the Department of Workforce Services, the Arkansas Economic		
34	Development Commission, and the Department of Career Education.		
35	(b)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall set funding priorities		
36	in three (3) phases.		

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1	(2)(A)(i) Phase one shall seek requests for proposals from
2	alliances consisting of technical institutes, community colleges,
3	universities, the kindergarten through grade twelve (K-12) education system,
4	educational cooperatives, or employers, with input from local workforce
5	investment boards, to receive planning grants of up to one hundred thousand
6	dollars (\$100,000).
7	(ii)(a) The local workforce investment boards shall
8	identify the industry sectors for each of their ten (10) areas.
9	(b) The identification process shall include a
10	comprehensive data analysis of employer skill requirements in each sector in
11	each region.
12	(c) The identified industry sectors and
13	employment skills shall serve as the basis for an application to a request
14	for proposal from the Department of Higher Education.
15	(B) A request for proposal shall include an education and
16	employer alignment plan that includes state-approved, employer-driven career
17	pathways that are supported by a secondary center that awards concurrent
18	credit courses that can be applied to a certificate of proficiency, technical
19	certificate, Associate of Applied Science degree, or Bachelor of Applied
20	Science degree or a similarly designed bachelor degree.
21	(C) Recognizing the limited state resources, the priority
22	for planning grants shall be given to the applicants that best enhance
23	regional efforts, including collaboration between community colleges,
24	universities, public schools, education service cooperatives, the local
25	workforce investment boards, career and technical education programs,
26	multidistrict vocational centers, and private partnerships with clearly
27	defined and measurable performance and effectiveness objectives.
28	(3)(A) Phase two shall provide implementation grants in an
29	amount necessary to provide the resources to implement approved projects
30	concluded and approved by the Department of Higher Education from phase one.
31	(B) Implementation grants shall include clearly defined
32	outcome measures and last for up to two (2) years.
33	(4)(A) Phase three shall provide continuation grants for phase
34	two recipients that meet or exceed the outcome measures.
35	(B) Continuation grants shall be used to align the
36	performance and relevance of programs to ever changing workforce training

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3	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 12, is
4	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
5	19-5-1255. Workforce Initiative Act of 2015 Fund.
6	(a) There is created on the books of the Treasurer of State, the
7	Auditor of State, and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State a miscellaneous
8	fund to be known as the "Workforce Initiative Act of 2015 Fund".
9	(b) The fund shall consist of those general revenues as may be
10	authorized by law and other nonfederal funds as may be provided by law.
11	(c) The fund shall be used by the Department of Higher Education for
12	distributing grants to programs identified under § 6-60-105.
