1 (a) All land or a city lot or town lot belonging to an insane Land 2 owned by a person under a mental incapacity, a minor, or a member of the United States Armed Forces during time of war person, or person in 3 4 confinement that is sold for taxes may be redeemed within two (2) years after 5 the expiration of the person's disaility mental incapacity is removed, the 6 minor reaches majority, or the person is released from active duty with the 7 United States Armed Forces during time of war. 8 (b)(1) In redemption of any land described in subsection (a) of this 9 section by any person after the expiration of a disability described in 10 subsection (a) of this section, the purchaser shall be required to account 11 for all timber, gas, oil, or mineral substance taken from the land while 12 holding under the tax title and protect the rights of any person under 13 disability as provided in this section. 14 (2)(A) A person desiring to take any timber, gas, oil, or 15 mineral substance from any land held under tax title within ten (10) years 16 after the sale for taxes shall first execute a bond in sufficient amount to 17 cover the substance to be removed, with good and sufficient sureties, 18 conditioned that the holder of the land will pay for all substances removed 19 from the land if the land is redeemed under the provisions of this section. 20 (B) The bond shall be filed with and approved by the 21 county clerk in the county where the land is located. 22 (c)(1) Any person removing timber, gas, oil, or a mineral substance from any land contrary to the provisions of this section and without first 23 24 executing the bond provided for in this section shall be guilty of a 25 violation and shall be fined in any sum not less than twenty-five dollars 26 (\$25.00) and not more than double the amount of the substance removed. 27 (2) A person may remove timber from land cleared in good faith 28 for cultivation without becoming liable to the penalty provided in this 29 section. 30 (d)(1) The county clerk shall keep a record of all certificates of redemption of lands or city lots or town lots, or parts of lands or city lots 31 32 or town lots, which were sold for delinquent taxes and redeemed and shall 33 retain the record of them for ten (10) years from the date on which the 34 redemption certificates were issued. 35 (2) Thereafter, unless a court order shall have been issued with respect to any such redemption certificate, the county clerk may destroy the 36

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
