20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
21

34 SECTION 18. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the

35 Department of Higher Education, to be payable from the General Improvement

36 Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, the following:

2 a sum not to exceed.....\$2,000,000.

3  
4 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY  
6 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an  
7 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus  
8 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the  
9 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an  
10 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the  
11 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and  
12 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in  
13 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing  
14 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement  
15 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted  
16 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions.  
17 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help  
18 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be  
19 assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus  
20 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor  
21 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help  
22 pool positions.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
24 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

25  
26 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
28 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon  
29 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher  
30 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or  
31 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary  
32 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or  
33 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have  
34 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between  
35 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution,  
36 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget

1 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used  
2 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General  
3 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve  
4 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education  
5 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.  
6 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no  
7 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal  
8 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the  
9 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions  
10 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or  
11 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.  
12 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of  
13 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher  
14 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This  
15 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation  
16 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue  
17 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the  
18 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that  
19 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some  
20 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad  
21 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate  
22 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of  
23 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this  
24 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint  
25 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement  
26 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled  
27 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is  
28 void.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
30 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

31

32 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In  
34 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in  
35 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide  
36 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds

1 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official  
2 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall,  
3 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from  
4 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds  
5 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid  
6 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
8 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

9

10 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK  
12 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made  
13 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out  
14 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2), such documents as may be necessary shall be  
15 processed so that funds may be transferred from the Work Force 2000  
16 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account from which the  
17 technical college draws its general revenue support. Such funds as may be  
18 transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds available from the  
19 Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year.

20 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning  
21 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as  
22 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and  
23 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies  
24 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force  
25 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational  
26 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of  
27 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

28 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
29 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

31 SECTION 23. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BUILDING  
33 MAINTENANCE FUND. After the sum of \$13,200,000 has been deposited into the  
34 Higher Education Building Maintenance Fund, any additional deposits are to be  
35 transferred to the Research Development Fund there to be used as provided by  
36 law.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
2 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

3  
4 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. REFUND TO  
6 EXPENDITURES. Proceeds derived from the repayment of loans, grants, or  
7 scholarships funded by the Higher Education Grants Fund Account shall be  
8 deposited into the State Treasury fund from which it originated.

9 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
10 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

11  
12 SECTION 25. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
13 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. NATIONAL  
14 GUARD TUITION INCENTIVE PROGRAM. In addition to any other provisions of law,  
15 any student who receives assistance from the appropriation made for the  
16 "National Guard Tuition Incentive Program" in this Act shall repay any loans  
17 and/or assistance if the student receives a discharge that is a less than  
18 Honorable Discharge. Priority for funding shall be given to students already  
19 receiving assistance from the National Guard Tuition Incentive Program.

20 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
21 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

22  
23 SECTION 26. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HEALTH  
25 EDUCATION GRANTS AND LOANS - PRIORITIES. The Arkansas Higher Education  
26 Coordinating Board, after consulting with the recognized associations of each  
27 of the applicable medical professions and other interested persons, shall  
28 determine the priorities for the applicable programs enumerated in the  
29 appropriation made for "Health Education Grants and Loans" in this Act. The  
30 Arkansas Department of Higher Education, if necessary, shall re-adjust the  
31 number of positions for entering students to be funded for each applicable  
32 program based upon the priorities determined by the board.

33 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~

36 SECTION 27. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

1 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FINANCIAL  
2 AID PROGRAMS REPORTING. The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall  
3 report by May 30 to the House and Senate Interim Committees on Education the  
4 budgeted allocation for each financial aid program funded through the Higher  
5 Education Grants Fund Account for the upcoming fiscal year and projections  
6 for the following year.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
8 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

9  
10 SECTION 28. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
12 AUDIT/REVIEW OF STATE SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS. Any post-secondary institution that  
13 receives state scholarship funds administered by the Arkansas Department of  
14 Higher Education shall be subject to audit/review of such funds by the  
15 Division of Legislative Audit, upon approval of the Legislative Joint Audit  
16 Committee.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
18 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

19  
20 SECTION 29. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AUDIT  
22 DATA. All post-secondary institutions shall provide to the Arkansas  
23 Department of Higher Education a copy of the Integrated Post-Secondary  
24 Education Data System (IPEDS) data within three weeks following the IPEDS due  
25 date, which shall be subject to audit by the Arkansas Department of Higher  
26 Education.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
28 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

29  
30 SECTION 30. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING  
32 FOR SALARY INCREASES. New funding through the Revenue Stabilization Act  
33 determined by the Arkansas Department of Higher Education to have been for  
34 salary increases for the fiscal year for Institutions of Higher Education  
35 shall be used exclusively for salary increases. New funding actually received  
36 for salary increases shall be spent exclusively for salary increases based

1 upon the state general revenue portion of total unrestricted educational and  
2 general revenue. Funding received under this provision shall be used for no  
3 purpose other than to provide such salary increases. Any designated funds not  
4 used for salary increases shall be recouped at the end of each fiscal year  
5 and transferred to the General Revenue Allotment Reserve Fund.

6 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~

11 PROGRAM COORDINATOR FUNDING. The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall  
12 transfer sufficient funding for the fiscal year from the Higher Education  
13 Grants Fund Account to the Department of Higher Education Fund Account in  
14 order to finance the personal services costs of a DHE Program Coordinator.

15 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
16 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

17  
18 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
19 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
20 PROVISION. Upon certification by the Director of the Department of Higher  
21 Education that transfers are needed to make maximum utilization of funds and  
22 appropriations provided for financial aid programs, and with the approval of  
23 the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and a review by the Arkansas  
24 Legislative Council, funds and appropriations may be transferred between  
25 financial aid programs to more adequately align the appropriation with the  
26 number of eligible students.

27 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
28 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

29  
30 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
31 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER  
32 OF HIGHER EDUCATION GRANTS FUND APPROPRIATIONS - HEALTH EDUCATION GRANTS AND  
33 LOANS. Upon certification to and with the approval of the Chief Fiscal  
34 Officer of the State, surplus funds and appropriations may be transferred  
35 between the appropriations provided for "Health Education Grants and Loans"  
36 by this Act by the General Assembly for Dental Aid Grants and Loans,

1 Optometry Aid, Veterinary Aid, Podiatry Aid, Chiropractic Aid and Osteopathy  
2 Aid.

3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
4 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

5

6 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

8 CONTINGENCY APPROPRIATIONS - TRANSFERS AND REPORTS. (a) Upon approval by  
9 the Department of Higher Education and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State,  
10 institutions of higher education may transfer appropriation from the cash  
11 contingency appropriation to any other appropriation made to the institution  
12 from cash funds including the establishment of commitment items, and may  
13 transfer appropriation from the contingency appropriation made payable from  
14 each institution's State Treasury Fund to the state operations appropriation  
15 made payable from each institution's State Treasury Fund including the  
16 establishment of commitment items, and may transfer appropriation from the  
17 contingency appropriation made payable from the Tobacco Settlement Program  
18 Fund Accounts to any other appropriation made to the institution from Tobacco  
19 Settlement Program Fund Accounts including the establishment of commitment  
20 items.

21 (b) Contingency appropriation transfers shall only establish and  
22 supplement commitment items that were recommended by the Higher Education  
23 Coordinating Board in the budget manuals presented to the Legislative Council  
24 and Joint Budget Committee.

25 (c) The Department of Higher Education shall report contingency  
26 appropriation transfers and the establishment of any commitment items  
27 authorized by this Section to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
28 Committee for review during its July meeting. The report shall include, by  
29 institution, the establishment of, and the amounts transferred to, each  
30 commitment item, the reasons therefor and the source of funds. Institutions  
31 shall submit contingency appropriation transfer and commitment item  
32 establishment requests authorized by this Section to the Department of Higher  
33 Education no later than July 1. Upon the failure of an institution to submit  
34 the required information by the July 1 deadline, the Department of Higher  
35 Education shall immediately notify by written notification the chairpersons  
36 of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.

3  
4 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. STUDENT  
6 UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH FELLOWSHIP (SURF) PROGRAM. The focus of the Student  
7 Undergraduate Research Fellowship (SURF) Program is the continued development  
8 of undergraduate academic research efforts at Arkansas colleges and  
9 universities. The Arkansas Department of Higher Education shall adopt rules  
10 and regulations necessary for the proper administration of the Student  
11 Undergraduate Research Fellowship Program. Administrative functions and  
12 responsibilities may include, but not necessarily be limited to, the  
13 development of eligibility criteria, collection of applications, coordination  
14 of student evaluations, distribution of public notices, and funding of grants  
15 for academic research purposes. Staff of the Arkansas Department of Higher  
16 Education shall administer this program. The Arkansas Department of Higher  
17 Education shall be authorized to expense costs associated with the  
18 administration of the program, from funds made payable from the Higher  
19 Education Grants Fund Account for the Student Undergraduate Research  
20 Fellowship Program as authorized in Section 4 of this Act.

21 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015  
22 through June 30, 2016.

23  
24 SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
25 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
26 COOPERATION AGREEMENTS. Any institution of Higher Education that has its main  
27 campus, satellite campus, or center located within a twenty five mile radius  
28 of any other main campus of an institution of higher education shall enter  
29 into a written agreement with that institution which must address duplication  
30 of services between the institutions.

31 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
32 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

33  
34 SECTION 37. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COST  
36 ALLOCATION. The Department of Higher Education may refund to the Higher

1 Education Fund Account or the Higher Education Grants Fund Account such  
2 amounts determined by the Department to be reimbursements received from the  
3 Arkansas Lottery Commission for costs related to the administration of the  
4 Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program.

5 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015  
6 through June 30, 2016.

7  
8 SECTION 38. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
9 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

10 APPROPRIATION TRANSFER PROCEDURES - AR GEOGRAPHICAL CRITICAL NEEDS MINORITY  
11 TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM. The Director of the Arkansas Department of  
12 Higher Education shall determine the amount available, up to \$200,000 per  
13 fiscal year, to fund the Arkansas Geographical Critical Needs Minority  
14 Teacher Scholarships and shall certify to the Chief Fiscal Officer of the  
15 State and the State Treasurer such amount as is required to be transferred  
16 from the Higher Education Grants Fund Account. Upon receiving such  
17 certification, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and the State Treasurer  
18 shall cause to be transferred the necessary funds and appropriation to the  
19 fund account of the University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff for implementation  
20 of this program. The University of Arkansas at Pine Bluff may use up to  
21 twenty percent (20%) of the funds and appropriation for administration of the  
22 program.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
24 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

25  
26 SECTION 39. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HIGHER  
28 EDUCATION CENTRAL POOL POSITIONS. (a) Universities - (1) The Department of  
29 Higher Education shall establish and maintain a central pool of three hundred  
30 (300) positions to be used to establish additional positions when an  
31 institution does not have sufficient positions available to meet  
32 unanticipated enrollment growth, industry training demands, and its mandated  
33 responsibilities.

34 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the  
35 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the  
36 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of

1 the institution's operating appropriation act.

2 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of  
3 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position  
4 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating  
5 appropriation act.

6 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher  
7 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.

8 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool  
9 until specific positions are requested by the institution, recommended by the  
10 Department of Higher Education and approved by the Arkansas Legislative  
11 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

12 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued  
13 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new  
14 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

15 (b) Colleges - (1) The Department of Higher Education shall establish and  
16 maintain a central pool of two hundred fifty (250) positions to be used to  
17 establish additional positions when an institution does not have sufficient  
18 positions available to meet unanticipated enrollment growth, industry  
19 training demands, and its mandated responsibilities.

20 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the  
21 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the  
22 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of  
23 the institution's operating appropriation act.

24 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of  
25 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position  
26 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating  
27 appropriation act.

28 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher  
29 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.

30 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool  
31 until specific positions are requested by the institution, recommended by the  
32 Department of Higher Education and approved by the Arkansas Legislative  
33 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

34 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued  
35 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new  
36 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

1 (c) Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of  
2 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher  
3 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This  
4 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation  
5 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue  
6 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the  
7 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that  
8 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some  
9 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad  
10 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate  
11 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of  
12 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this  
13 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint  
14 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement  
15 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled  
16 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is  
17 void.

18 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
19 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

20  
21 SECTION 40. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
22 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. OUTCOME-  
23 CENTERED FUNDING AWARDS. Upon certification of the Director of the  
24 Department of Higher Education, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall  
25 transfer to the Department of Higher Education Fund Account certified amounts  
26 based upon the outcome-centered funding policy of the Arkansas Higher  
27 Education Coordinating Board from the State Treasury funds of the  
28 Institutions of Higher Education. The Department of Higher Education will  
29 distribute funds from the Outcome-Centered Funding Awards Appropriation based  
30 upon the outcome-centered funding policy of the Arkansas Higher Education  
31 Coordinating Board.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
33 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

34  
35 SECTION 41. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

1 ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Higher Education is authorized to  
2 recover non-refundable administrative fees related to the institutional  
3 certification and exemption process for out-of-state, non-public, and for-  
4 profit colleges and universities. These fees include a notification fee, an  
5 application processing fee, and travel expenses for the certification review  
6 teams.

7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2014~~  
8 2015 through June 30, ~~2015~~ 2016.

9  
10 *SECTION 42. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code §6-61-228(d)(4)(B)(ii),*  
11 *concerning the funding formula model for universities, is amended to read as*  
12 *follows:*

13  
14 *(ii) The sum of the teaching salaries at the three (3) instructional levels*  
15 *plus a fringe benefits rate that will be determined by the department staff*  
16 *shall constitute the teaching salaries need of the university.*

17  
18 *SECTION 43. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS*  
19 *CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.*  
20 *NONTRADITIONAL STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS AGGREGATE AMOUNT. Aggregate amounts of*  
21 *scholarships awarded to nontraditional students, under the provisions of the*  
22 *Arkansas Academic Challenge Scholarship Program - Part 2, ACA 6-85-201 et*  
23 *seq., for the 2015-16 fiscal year shall be limited to thirteen million*  
24 *dollars (\$13,000,000).*

25 *The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015*  
26 *through June 30, 2016.*

27  
28 *SECTION 44. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds*  
29 *authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency*  
30 *and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and*  
31 *the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and*  
32 *Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary*  
33 *Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal*  
34 *control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by*  
35 *the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be*  
36 *strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.*

1  
2 SECTION 45. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General  
3 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations  
4 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for  
5 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive  
6 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget  
7 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or  
8 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative  
9 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

10  
11 SECTION 46. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
12 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
13 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
14 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2015 is essential to the operation of  
15 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
16 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
17 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2015 could work irreparable harm  
18 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
19 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
20 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
21 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2015.
