8	IN SUPPORT OF EXPANDED LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS EXPORTS
9	FROM THE UNITED STATES.

13	IN SUPPORT OF EXPANDED LIQUEFIED NATURAL
14	GAS EXPORTS FROM THE UNITED STATES.
15	
16	
17	WHEREAS, plentiful natural gas supplies and unprecedented advances in
18	technology have provided a historic opportunity for the United States to
19	achieve energy self-sufficiency while creating jobs and wealth for our
20	economy; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, pioneering exploration and extraction methods have opened such
23	vast natural gas resources to development that demand on United States
24	natural gas markets can grow with little impact to domestic prices; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, the United States Department of Energy estimates natural gas
27	production levels by 2035 will be 55% more than it estimated only four years
28	ago, a growth trend that can support all domestic demand while allowing the
29	United States to capitalize on the economic benefit of exporting abundant
30	natural gas to other nations; and
31	
32	WHEREAS, expanding exports of liquefied natural gas is a key component
33	in helping the United States realize its potential as a global energy leader
34	while creating hundreds of thousands of jobs and strengthening the United
35	States economy; and

1	WHEREAS, global demand for liquefied natural gas is expected to grow
2	significantly over the next two decades; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, liquefied natural gas exports will create tens of thousands of
5	construction and operations jobs and will support fifty thousand jobs in the
6	exploration and production sectors for every two billion cubic feet per day
7	of exports; and
8	
9	WHEREAS, according to recent studies, expanding markets for liquefied
10	natural gas are expected to generate as much as \$86 billion in net benefits
11	to the United States economy, which could create more than 450,000 American
12	jobs and help reduce the United States trade deficit by as much as \$60
13	billion by 2038; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, expanded liquefied natural gas exports would promote stability
16	in natural gas pricing and spur increased investments by the natural gas
17	industry, providing more jobs and revenue for roads and schools here in
18	Arkansas; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, creating additional markets for United States liquefied
21	natural gas is also consistent with national trade and security policy
22	because failure to create those markets would force our allies to continue to
23	rely on regimes hostile to United States interests for their energy needs;
24	and
25	
26	WHEREAS, construction and operation of liquefied natural gas export
27	facilities would incentivize new direct infrastructure investments worth
28	billions of dollars and generate royalties and local tax revenues directly
29	into communities across the country; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, nearly 30 liquefied natural gas production facilities have
32	applied to the United States Department of Energy for licenses to export, yet
33	only one project has received final permitting approval; and
34	
35	WHEREAS, a diverse coalition of liquefied natural gas producers, energy
36	and petroleum companies, business groups, service companies, elected

1	officials, and others have expressed their support for figurified natural gas
2	exports,
3	
4	NOW THEREFORE,
5	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE NINETIETH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE
6	OF ARKANSAS:
7	
8	THAT the Senate of the Ninetieth General Assembly of the State of
9	Arkansas endorses expanded markets for liquefied natural gas exports from the
10	United States and encourages regulatory and legislative policies designed to
11	streamline and simplify the permitting process.
12	
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon its adoption, a copy of this
14	resolution be presented by the Secretary of the Senate to members of the
15	United States Congress representing Arkansas as an expression of the Arkansas
16	Senate's support for expanded liquefied natural gas exports and the
17	streamlining of permit approval for pending export facilities so that the
18	economic benefits of liquefied natural gas exports can be magnified
19	throughout the United States.
