The Disbursing Officer for the Arkansas Department of 2 Health is hereby authorized to transfer all unexpended funds relative to the Home Health Services that pertain to reimbursement, as certified by the Chief 3 4 Fiscal Officer of the State, to be carried forward and made available for 5 expenditures for the same purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2016 6 2017. It is the intent of the General Assembly that with approval of the 7 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee that the Arkansas 8 Department of Health shall have the authority to transfer funds from the fund balance of the Home Health appropriation. 9

10 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein, may11 be carried forward under the following conditions:

(1) Prior to June 30, 2016 2017 the Agency shall by written statement set
forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the
Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

(2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name or line item, the funding source and a copy of the written request set forth in (1) above;

22 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a written 23 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee 24 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written 25 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose etc. for 26 which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty (30) 27 days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution presents 28 its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget 29 Committee; and

Provided however, 24 no compensation shall be paid to any employee required to be on-call and/or 25 standby who fails to respond after the second notification that their 26 services are needed. In the event of equipment or paging device malfunction, 27 such penalty shall not apply. All compensated services shall be provided as 28 directed by the Arkansas Department of Health. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016. /s/Joint Budget Committee
