SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER

PROVISION — LINE ITEMS. The Legislative Auditor is hereby authorized to

direct the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State to transfer appropriation

- 1 between the line items of the appropriation in Section 2 of this Act in such
- 2 amounts determined necessary. In no event, however, shall the Regular
- 3 Salaries line item in Section 2 be increased or decreased by such transfers
- 4 authorized herein, until the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
- 5 reviews such transfers.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, <del>2015</del> 7 2016 through June 30, <del>2016</del> 2017.

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- 9 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 10 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SALARIES.
- 11 Employees of  $\frac{1}{2}$  Employees of  $\frac{1}$
- 12 cost-of-living increases on July 1, in an amount equal to that granted to all
- 13 other state agency, board, commission or institution of higher education
- 14 employees on those dates. Any additional adjustments in annual salary rates
- 15 for <del>Division</del> employees, labor market adjustments, merit pay adjustments or
- 16 employee retention or recruitment requirements shall be made at the
- 17 discretion of the Legislative Auditor. In addition, the Legislative Auditor
- 18 may implement a merit program to reward employees of the Division for
- 19 exceptional service. The plan shall be approved by the Legislative Joint
- 20 Auditing Committee prior to its implementation. In order that exceptionally
- 21 well-qualified personnel may be recruited and retained, the Division of
- 22 Arkansas Legislative Audit may exceed the maximum salary levels by no more
- 23 than twenty percent (20%) for no more than one-third (1/3) of the positions
- 24 authorized in the appropriation act after receiving approval from the
- 25 Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. Salary payments in
- 26 accordance with this section shall not be restricted to maximum amounts
- 27 authorized by law.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2015}{2016}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2016}{2017}$ .

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- 31 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDS.
- 33 In the event the Division of Arkansas Legislative Audit of the Legislative
- 34 Joint Auditing Committee should receive any funds in connection with
- 35 performing their duties as prescribed by the Arkansas Scholarship Lottery
- 36 Act, such funds shall be deposited into the State Central Services Fund to be

1 utilized solely by the Division of Arkansas Legislative Audit of the 2 Legislative Joint Auditing Committee in performing such duties. 3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015 4 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017. 5 6 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds 7 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency 8 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and 9 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and 10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary 11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal 12 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by 13 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be 14 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds. 15 16 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General 17 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations 18 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for 19 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive 20 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget 21 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or 22 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative 23 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption. 25 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 26 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the

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appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.

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
