- 6 Correction is hereby authorized to transfer appropriations between any line
- 7 items authorized herein but only for the purpose of financing construction or
- 8 equipment for a facility of the department. Any transfers authorized by this
- 9 section shall require the approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State
- 10 after prior review and approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
- 11 Committee.
- 12 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
- 13 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year
- 14 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by
- 15 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and
- 16 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by
- 17 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly
- 18 has determined that the Department of Correction may operate more efficiently
- 19 if some flexibility is provided to the Department of Correction authorizing
- 20 broad powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and
- 21 appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior
- 22 approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by
- 23 this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or
- 24 Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If th
- 25 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee
- 26 is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire
- 27 section is void.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2015}{2016}$  through June 30,  $\frac{2016}{2017}$ .

- 31 SECTION 31. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 32 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. COUNTY
- 33 JAIL INVOICE SUMMARY. The Departments of Correction and Community
- 34 Correction, shall at a minimum and on a fiscal year basis, prepare and post
- 35 on the applicable agency web site, a monthly summary of county jail
- 36 reimbursement invoices prepared and forwarded to each county sheriff for

- l verification by the Departments and for payment from the County Jail
- 2 Reimbursement Fund. In addition, the report shall include a summary of
- 3 invoices returned by each county for payment for previous months within the
- 4 fiscal year, the amounts paid, and any balances owed. Each fiscal year-end
- 5 report shall be maintained on the web sites for a period of no less than
- 6 three (3) years.
- 7 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July  $1, \frac{2015}{}$
- 8 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

- 10 SECTION 32. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MOTOR
- 12 VEHICLE PURCHASE PROVISION. The Department of Correction is hereby
- 13 authorized to purchase motor vehicles as may be approved for the purpose of
- 14 equipping new bed additions at the various institutions from the
- 15 appropriations authorized for Capital Outlay in Section 3 of this Act.
- 16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2015}{}$
- 17 <u>2016</u> through June 30, <u>2016</u> <u>2017</u>.

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- 19 SECTION 33. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER
- 21 OF APPROPRIATION TO THE COUNTY JAIL REIMBURSEMENT FUND. If any savings of
- 22 general revenue appropriation and funds accrue during the 2015-2016-2017
- 23 fiscal year in the operations of the Department of Correction, the Director
- 24 of the Department of Correction may request a transfer of appropriation from
- 25 any line item appropriation in the Inmate Care and Custody Fund Account to
- 26 the County Jail Reimbursement Fund in order to meet obligations to counties
- 27 for housing state inmates. Such transfer request shall be made upon the
- 28 approval of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and prior review and
- 29 approval by the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015
- 31 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

- 33 SECTION 34. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 34 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOCAL
- 35 GOVERNMENT INMATE COST REPORT. Each calendar year, the Association of
- 36 Arkansas Counties shall compile and submit a report to the Arkansas

- 1 Legislative Council, of all costs incurred, excluding construction costs, by
- 2 local government units housing inmates sentenced to the Department of
- 3 Correction and Department of Community Correction. The cost report shall be
- 4 a representative sample of all counties housing and caring for state inmates.
- 5 The report shall be submitted no later than July 1 of the calendar year
- 6 immediately following the reporting year.
- 7 The Association of Arkansas Counties in coordination with Legislative
- 8 Audit shall determine which counties will be included in the sample and shall
- 9 include a sufficient number of counties from each classification based upon
- 10 population and each congressional district to ensure a fair representation of
- 11 costs incurred. Guidelines for preparing this cost report shall be developed
- 12 by the Division of Legislative Audit in coordination with the Association of
- 13 Arkansas Counties. The Division of Legislative Audit shall test the accuracy
- 14 of the information submitted during the routine audit of the applicable
- 15 county.
- 16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2015}{1}$
- 17 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

- 19 SECTION 35. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. ESSENTIAL
- 21 SERVICES STIPEND. The Arkansas Department of Correction (ADC) may award
- 22 additional compensation to those exempt employees who are members of the
- 23 emergency response unit. These employees are eligible to receive up to 3% per
- 24 hour additional compensation for the actual number of hours that an employee
- 25 spends on an emergency response action.
- 26 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1,  $\frac{2015}{}$
- 27 2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

- 29 SECTION 36. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MARKETING
- 31 AND REDISTRIBUTION PROCEEDS FROM SALE OF STATE PROPERTY. The proceeds from
- 32 the sale of state property through the Marketing and Redistribution Section
- 33 of the Department of Finance and Administration, may be deposited into the
- 34 Cash in State Treasury fund in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 there to be
- 35 used for operating expenses for the Paws in Prison program.
- 36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July  $1, \frac{2015}{}$

2016 through June 30, 2016 2017.

SECTION 37. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 39. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
