20 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

21

22 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated, to the  
23 Department of Education, to be payable from the Department of Education  
24 Public School Fund Account, for grants and aid to local school districts and  
25 special programs of the Department of Education for the fiscal year ending  
26 June 30, 2017, the following:

10 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 11 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BROADBAND  
 12 FACILITIES MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - RESTRICTIONS AND MATCHING FUNDS. (i) The  
 13 appropriation in this Act for the Broadband Facilities Matching Grant Program  
 14 shall not be used for Arkansas Research and Education Optical Network (AREON)  
 15 or Middle Mile Connectivity.

16 (ii) The funds appropriated for state match for the Broadband  
 17 Facilities Matching Grant Program in this Act shall be paid on a one-to-one  
 18 state/local matching basis.

19 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
 20 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

21

22 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 23 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BROADBAND  
 24 FACILITIES MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - CARRY FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of  
 25 monies allocated for the Broadband Facilities Matching Grant Program  
 26 remaining on June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017, in the Department of Education Public School  
 27 Fund Account shall be designated and retained for the Broadband Facilities  
 28 Matching Grant Program.

29 Any carry forward of unexpected balance of funding as authorized herein, may  
 30 be carried forward under the following conditions:

31 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017 the Agency shall by written statement  
 32 set forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the  
 33 Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget;

34 (2) The Department of Finance and Administration Office of Budget shall  
 35 report to the Arkansas Legislative Council all amounts carried forward by the  
 36 September Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee meeting

1 which report shall include the name of the Agency, Board, Commission or  
2 Institution and the amount of the funding carried forward, the program name  
3 or line item, the funding source of that appropriation and a copy of the  
4 written request set forth in item (1) above;

5 (3) Each Agency, Board, Commission or Institution shall provide a  
6 written report to the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee  
7 containing all information set forth in item (2) above, along with a written  
8 statement as to the current status of the project, contract, purpose, etc.  
9 for which the carry forward was originally requested no later than thirty  
10 (30) days prior to the time the Agency, Board, Commission or Institution  
11 presents its budget request to the Arkansas Legislative Council/Joint Budget  
12 Committee; and

13 (4) Thereupon, the Department of Finance and Administration shall  
14 include all information obtained in item (3) above in the budget manuals  
15 and/or a statement of non-compliance by the Agency, Board, Commission or  
16 Institution.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
18 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

19

20 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
22 ALLOCATION. The appropriation for the Isolated Funding line item in Section 1  
23 of this Act may be fully funded. Any funding and appropriation for Isolated  
24 Funding that is not utilized shall be transferred to the appropriation for  
25 Special Needs Isolated Funding in Section 1 of this Act and shall be used  
26 there for fully funding each subsection (c) through (f) of Arkansas Code  
27 §6-20-604 on a pro rata basis until the available funds are exhausted. Pro  
28 rata basis is defined as providing each district qualifying for additional  
29 funding under subsections (c) through (f) a proportionate share based on how  
30 each district's additional funding amount bears to the total additional  
31 funding amounts for all qualifying districts. If any funding and  
32 appropriation remains after funding each subsection (c) through (f) of  
33 Arkansas Code §6-20-604 the remaining balance shall be used to fund the  
34 provisions of Arkansas Code §6-20-604 (h) on an equal basis until the  
35 available funds are exhausted.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~

1 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

3 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO  
5 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School  
6 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a  
7 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state  
8 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district  
9 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is  
10 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir  
11 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend  
12 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to  
13 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or  
14 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school  
15 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the  
16 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act  
17 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating  
18 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The  
19 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such  
20 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department  
21 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation  
22 as is deemed necessary.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
24 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

25

26 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL  
28 EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special  
29 Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide  
30 extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such  
31 services, to provide special education services to foster children who are  
32 wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of  
33 special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute  
34 such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
36 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

2 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
4 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each  
5 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time  
6 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the  
7 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the  
8 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation  
9 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State  
10 Treasurer, after making those deductions as set out in Arkansas Code 19-5-  
11 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount  
12 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public  
13 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or  
14 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public  
15 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
17 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

18  
19 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
21 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation  
22 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations  
23 established by the State Board of Education.

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
25 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

26  
27 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
29 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for  
30 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with  
31 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
33 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

34  
35 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER

1 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval  
2 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas  
3 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to  
4 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related  
5 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,  
6 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than  
7 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.

8 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of  
9 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year  
10 is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This is usually accomplished by  
11 delineating such maximums in the appropriation act(s) for a state agency and  
12 the general revenue allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by  
13 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly  
14 has determined that the Department of Education may operate more efficiently  
15 if some flexibility is provided to the Commissioner of the Department of  
16 Education authorizing broad powers under the Transfer Authority provision  
17 herein. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate that the General  
18 Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of the Legislative  
19 Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this section. The  
20 requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee  
21 is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement of approval by  
22 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled unconstitutional  
23 by a court jurisdiction, this entire section is void.

24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
25 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

26  
27 SECTION 15. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. AETN  
29 DOCUMENTED QUIZ BOWL COSTS. Of the total amount of appropriation and funds  
30 authorized herein to the Department of Education for the Quiz Bowl each  
31 fiscal year, an amount not to exceed forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) each  
32 fiscal year may be made available to the Department of Education -  
33 Educational Television Division for its documented costs associated with the  
34 Quiz Bowl.

35 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
36 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

1  
2 SECTION 16. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
4 DISTRESSED SCHOOL DISTRICT SUPPORT. The funds appropriated in the line item  
5 "Distressed School District Support" in Section 1 of this Act may be used for  
6 technical assistance offered by the Department of Education to school  
7 districts in academic distress that can include, but is not limited to,  
8 teacher specialists, principal specialists, and other personnel assigned by  
9 the department. These funds may also be used for alternative research-based  
10 technical assistance or programs. Criteria for selecting and approving  
11 alternative research-based technical assistance or programs are to be  
12 promulgated as a rule by the State Board of Education, provided that  
13 alternative staffing and/or compensation programs for teachers shall be  
14 approved by at least a majority of the teachers in the school, schools, or  
15 school district participating in the program.

16 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
17 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

18  
19 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.  
21 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School  
22 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any  
23 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the  
24 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for  
25 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the  
26 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,  
27 Vocational Centers, Arkansas Easter Seals and the school operated by the  
28 Department of Correction.

29 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
30 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

31  
32 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BETTER  
34 CHANCE PROGRAM ADMINISTRATIVE FEES. The Department of Education is hereby  
35 authorized to expend a maximum of two percent (2%) of available funds for  
36 administration of the Better Chance Program. Up to 1.8% of available funds

1 shall be used to administer the program and to monitor program grantees to  
2 ensure compliance with programmatic standards. Prior to the utilization of  
3 the remaining 0.2% of available funds, the Department of Education shall seek  
4 prior review and approval of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
5 Committee by providing a written request to include the following: a) the  
6 Department's reason(s) for the use of the funds and b) the amount of funds

14 amendment to the Revenue Stabilization law. Therefore, it is both necessary  
15 and appropriate that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring  
16 prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as  
17 provided by this section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative  
18 Council or Joint Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section.  
19 If the requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget  
20 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,  
21 this entire section is void.

27 TEACHER SALARY. The Arkansas Department of Education is requested to  
28 calculate Average Teacher Salary in the Department's Annual Statistical  
29 Report to not include extra duty funds. Specifically, the Department is  
30 requested to calculate the Average Teacher Salary amount using the National  
31 Education Association definitions for Average Salary for Classroom Teachers.  
32 The Arkansas Department of Education shall submit this data annually to the  
33 National Education Association in accordance with that organization's  
34 deadlines for submission for their report "Rankings and Estimates" which  
35 includes state-by-state teacher salary comparisons.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~

1 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

3 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY  
5 FORWARD - ARKANSAS BETTER CHANCE. Any unexpended balance of monies allocated  
6 for the Arkansas Better Chance for School Success Program remaining on June  
7 30, ~~2016~~ 2017, in the Department of Education Public School Fund Account  
8 shall be designated and retained for the Arkansas Better Chance for School  
9 Success Program.

10 Any carry forward of unexpended balance of funding as authorized herein,  
11 may be carried forward under the following conditions:

12 (1) Prior to June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017 the Agency shall by written statement set  
13 forth its reason(s) for the need to carry forward said funding to the

5 §6-17-1117(a) to offset the cost of health insurance premiums to eligible  
6 members electing to participate in the public school employees' health

16 fiscal year from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account to  
17 the University of Arkansas at Little Rock Fund, specifically to provide  
18 funding for the Arkansas/STRIVE Program. The total amount of funds  
19 transferred each fiscal year pursuant to this section shall not be subject to

29 Areas, Vocational Centers, and the school operated by the Department of  
30 Correction who participate in the Arkansas Public School Life and Health  
31 Insurance Program.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~  
33 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

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35 SECTION 24. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.

1 ALTERNATIVE LEARNING ENVIRONMENT. The Department of Education may provide  
2 funding for Alternative Learning Environment Programs in excess of the  
3 regulatory limitation of six (6) hours per day for those programs that  
4 operate more than twelve hours per day, in a proportionate manner and upon  
5 special request to the Department of Education.

21 percent (98%) of the uniform rate of tax used in the calculation of State  
22 Foundation Funding Aid for fiscal year ~~2015-2016~~ 2016-2017 exceeds nine  
23 hundred twenty million seven hundred thirty-one thousand eight hundred  
24 nineteen dollars (\$920,731,819), the Department of Education shall pay up to

3 year for the annual expenses of the Quiz Bowl, thirteen thousand five hundred  
4 dollars (\$13,500) each fiscal year for Creativity in Arkansas, Inc. for  
5 grants up to \$1,000 each for students and chaperones, thirteen thousand five

30 become the base year funding for fiscal year 2015-2016 if a school district  
31 meets the following requirements in the 2014-2015 fiscal year and all of the  
32 following requirements except for population density ratio in the 2015-2016  
33 fiscal year:

2 (b) If after the 2015-2016 fiscal year, an increase in a school

22 **SECTION 32. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS.** Disbursement of funds

26 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary

32 **SECTION 33. LEGISLATIVE INTENT.** It is the intent of the General  
33 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations

36 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

5 SECTION 34. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
6 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits  
7 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the  
8 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of  
9 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
10 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the  
11 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm  
12 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental  
13 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act  
14 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health  
15 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
