CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. BROADBAND

FACILITIES MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - RESTRICTIONS AND MATCHING FUNDS. (i) The

appropriation in this Act for the Broadband Facilities Matching Grant Program

shall not be used for Arkansas Research and Education Optical Network (AREON)

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SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 4 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. GRANTS TO 5 SCHOOL DISTRICTS. For the purposes of distributing the Grants To School 6 Districts appropriation in Section 1 of this Act, "school district" means a 7 school district which contracts with a school district in an adjoining state 8 for the education of some of the pupils within the Arkansas school district 9 because the portion of the school district wherein such pupils live is 10 completely separated from the remainder of the school district by a reservoir 11 covering at least 12,000 acres at normal water level, and where to attend 12 school in their own district, the pupils of said portion would be required to 13 travel or to be transported a distance (measured by the nearest highway or 14 road route) of more than 35 miles round trip and pass through another school 15 district or districts. The Department of Education shall distribute the 16 monies appropriated for Grants to School Districts in Section 1 of this Act 17 to such school districts as reimbursement for expenses incurred in educating 18 the pupils residing in the separated portion of the school district. The 19 payments are to be limited to the amount of available appropriation. Such 20 school districts shall file a request for reimbursement with the Department 21 of Education and provide the Department of Education with such documentation 22 as is deemed necessary. 23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015

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SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SPECIAL EDUCATION SERVICES. The funds appropriated in the line item "Special Education Services" in Section 1 of this Act shall be used to provide extended year summer programs for handicapped students in need of such services, to provide special education services to foster children who are wards of the State, and to provide funds for the payment of salaries of special education supervisors. The Department of Education shall distribute such funds in the manner necessary to carry out the intent of this Section. The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015

- 2 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 3 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 4 DESEGREGATION EXPENSES. (A) For the fiscal year ending June 30, and for each
- 5 fiscal year thereafter, the Department of Education shall from time to time
- 6 as needed, certify to the State Treasurer and the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
- 7 State, the amount of funds disbursed or approved to be disbursed by the
- 8 Department of Education for desegregation expenses under any "Desegregation
- 9 Settlement Agreement". Upon the receipt of such certification, the State

- 11 202(b)(2)(B), shall also deduct from the net general revenues the amount
- 12 certified and transfer this amount to the Department of Education Public
- 13 School Fund Account there to be used exclusively for payment of or
- 14 reimbursement for expenses incurred from the Department of Education Public
- 15 School Fund Account under any "Desegregation Settlement Agreement".

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- 19 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 21 CONSOLIDATION INCENTIVE. The appropriation contained herein for Consolidation
- 22 Incentive shall be allocated in accordance with rules and regulations
- 23 established by the State Board of Education.
- 24 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015
- 25 <u>2016</u> through June 30, 2016 <u>2017</u>.

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- 27 SECTION 13. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 28 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 29 RESIDENTIAL CENTERS/JUVENILE DETENTION. The funds appropriated herein for
- 30 Residential Centers/Juvenile Detention shall be allocated in accordance with
- 31 rules and regulations established by the State Board of Education.
- 32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, $\frac{2015}{1}$
- 33 <u>2016</u> through June 30, 2016 <u>2017</u>.

- 35 SECTION 14. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TRANSFER

- 1 AUTHORITY. The Commissioner of the Department of Education, with the approval
- 2 of the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State and after approval by the Arkansas
- 3 Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee, is hereby authorized to
- 4 request necessary appropriation transfers and any other budget related
- 5 adjustments necessary within the Department of Education. Provided, however,
- 6 that the Department of Education shall be limited to submitting no more than
- 7 two transfer requests during any fiscal year.
- 8 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
- 9 appropriation and general revenue funding for a state agency each fiscal year

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- 19 SECTION 17. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
- 21 RETIREMENT MATCHING. Beginning with the 1996-97 school year, Local School
- 22 Districts shall pay the teacher retirement employer contribution rate for any
- 23 eligible employee in accordance with rules and regulations established by the
- 24 Teacher Retirement Board of Directors. The appropriation contained herein for
- 25 Teacher Retirement Matching each fiscal year shall be used to provide the
- 26 employer matching for employees of the Cooperative Education Services Areas,

SECTION 33. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget

1	manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
2	summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
3	Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

5	SECTION 34. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
6	General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
7	the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
8	effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of
9	the agency for which the appropriations in this \mbox{Act} are provided, and that in
10	the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
11	effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm
12	upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
13	programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
14	being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
15	and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
