20 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS 21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. 22 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon 23 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher 24 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or 25 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary 26 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or 27 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have 28 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between 29 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution, 30 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget 31 The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used Committee. 32 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General 33 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve 34 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education 35 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee. 36 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no

1 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal 2 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the 3 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions 4 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or 5 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section. 6 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of 7 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher 8 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This 9 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation 10 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue 11 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the 12 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that 13 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some 14 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad 15 powers under this Section. Such 12 funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds 13 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year. 14 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning 15 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as 16 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and 17 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies 18 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force 19 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational 20 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of 21 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund. 22 The funds distributed under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of 23 those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be 24 deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for personal 25 services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of occupational, 26 vocational, technical, and workforce development programs by the Department 27 of Career Education - Office of Skills Development. It is found and determined by the 16 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits 17 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of 18 19 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in 20 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm 21 22 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental 23 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health 24 25 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016. 26 27 /s/Joint Budget Committee 28 29 30 31 32 33 34 35

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
