34 SECTION 18. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 35 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EMERGENCY
 36 GRANTS & EXTRA HELP POOL. An Institution of higher education that suffers an

1 emergency/disaster event resulting in all or a significant portion of campus
2 operations being interrupted, may request disaster assistance through the
3 Arkansas Department of Higher Education. Upon the declaration of an
4 emergency by the Governor, the institution may request, subject to the
5 recommendation of the Director of the Department of Higher Education and
6 approval of the Governor, a grant from the Disaster Relief Fund to assist in
7 returning that campus to operation and/or to a sister campus providing
8 services to the students from the affected campus. Certified law enforcement
9 officers employed by an institution of higher education may be granted
10 jurisdiction at the sister institution, upon agreement of both institutions.
11 The Department of Higher Education is authorized a pool of 500 extra help
12 positions for use in such emergency situations. These positions may be
13 assigned to the campus suffering the disaster event or to a sister campus
14 providing services to the students from the affected campus. The Governor
15 may waive the 1,500 hour limit of ACA 6-63-314 on these assigned extra help
16 pool positions.

17 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2015
18 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

19
20 SECTION 19. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
21 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
22 REALLOCATION OF RESOURCES FOR INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION. Upon
23 determination by the president or chancellor of an institution of higher
24 education that a reallocation of resources for purposes of reorganization or
25 consolidation of administrative functions within the institution is necessary
26 for efficient and effective operations of the institution, the president or
27 chancellor, with approval of the institution's board of trustees, may have
28 the authority to transfer positions, appropriations and related funds between
29 campuses, divisions, branches, and other budgetary units of the institution,
30 after receiving prior approval of the Legislative Council or Joint Budget
31 Committee. The transfers of positions, programs, or activities shall be used
32 for those purposes for which the appropriations were approved by the General
33 Assembly. The transfers, consolidations, or reorganizations which involve
34 academic programs shall be reviewed by the Department of Higher Education
35 prior to submission to the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee.
36 Provided, however, that the institution shall be limited to submitting no

1 more than two (2) individual transaction transfer requests during any fiscal
2 year and shall be further limited to no more than five percent (5%) of the
3 total General Revenue and Special Revenue appropriation, funding, positions
4 specific to each institution, and no Tobacco Settlement funds or
5 appropriations may be reallocated pursuant to this section.

6 Determining the maximum number of employees and the maximum amount of
7 appropriation and general revenue funding for institutions of higher
8 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This
9 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation
10 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue
11 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the
12 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that
13 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some
14 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad
15 powers under this Section. Therefore, it is both necessary and appropriate
16 that the General Assembly maintain oversight by requiring prior approval of
17 the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee as provided by this
18 section. The requirement of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint
19 Budget Committee is not a severable part of this section. If the requirement
20 of approval by the Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee is ruled
21 unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, this entire section is
22 void.

23 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~
24 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

25
26 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
27 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. LOANS. In
28 order to provide timely payments under financial aid appropriations made in
29 this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State is authorized to provide
30 loans from the Budget Stabilization Trust Fund to make available all funds
31 attributable to the financial aid programs under the then current official
32 revenue estimates. In the event of an unanticipated state revenue shortfall,
33 any such loans remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall be repaid from
34 revenues distributed in the first two months of the next fiscal year. Funds
35 for appropriations made in this Act for purposes other than financial aid
36 shall not be affected by the application of this provision.

1 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~
2 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

3
4 SECTION 21. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
5 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORK
6 FORCE 2000 DEVELOPMENT FUND PROCEDURES. After the amounts to be made
7 available to the various technical colleges have been determined as set out
8 in Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B), such documents as
9 may be necessary shall be processed so that funds may be transferred from the
10 Work Force 2000 Development Fund to the State Treasury fund or fund account
11 from which the technical college draws its general revenue support. Such
12 funds as may be transferred shall not exceed 93.691% of the total funds
13 available from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund during the fiscal year.
14 In the event that a technical institute or comprehensive lifelong learning
15 center which receives support from the Work Force 2000 Development Fund as
16 determined by law transfers or merges into the Arkansas Technical College and
17 Community College System for which Work Force 2000 Development Fund monies
18 are determined by law, then the actual amount of support from the Work Force
19 2000 Development Fund in the preceding fiscal year for such educational
20 institution shall be made available irrespective of any other provision of
21 law which sets out maximum levels of support from such fund.

22 The funds distributed under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of
23 those amounts collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall be
24 deposited into the Skills Development Fund to be used only for personal
25 services, grants, operation, support, and improvement of occupational,
26 vocational, technical, and workforce development programs by the Department
27 of Career Education - Office of Skills Development. The distributions of
28 funds under Arkansas Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(C) in excess of those amounts
29 collected and distributed prior to June 30, 2014 shall not apply to proceeds
30 allocated to schools, colleges and educational institutions under Arkansas
31 Code 26-51-205(d)(2)(A) and 26-51-205(d)(2)(B).

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2015~~
33 2016 through June 30, ~~2016~~ 2017.

34
35 SECTION 22. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS

6 (3) No position established under this section may exceed the salary rate of
7 the highest maximum annual salary rate or the highest grade level position
8 authorized by the General Assembly in the requesting institution's operating
9 appropriation act.

10 (4) The institution shall provide justification to the Department of Higher
11 Education for the need to allocate positions from the central pool.

12 (5) Titles shall not be assigned to the institution from the central pool
13 until specific positions are requested by the institution, recommended by the
14 Department of Higher Education and approved by the Arkansas Legislative
15 Council or the Joint Budget Committee.

16 (6) If an institution requests any central pool position to be continued
17 during the subsequent fiscal year, the position must be requested as a new
18 position in the institution's subsequent fiscal year budget request.

19 (b) Colleges - (1) The Department of Higher Education shall establish and
20 maintain a central pool of two hundred fifty (250) positions to be used to
21 establish additional positions when an institution does not have sufficient
22 positions available to meet unanticipated enrollment growth, industry
23 training demands, and its mandated responsibilities.

24 (2) Central pool positions are to be used by the institutions if the
25 personnel service needs exceed the number of positions authorized by the
26 General Assembly and that were not anticipated at the time of the passage of
27 the institution's operating appropriation act.

7 education each fiscal year is the prerogative of the General Assembly. This
8 is usually accomplished by delineating such maximums in the appropriation
9 act(s) for institutions of higher education and the general revenue
10 allocations authorized for each fund and fund account by amendment to the
11 Revenue Stabilization law. Further, the General Assembly has determined that
12 institutions of higher education may operate more efficiently if some
13 flexibility is provided to institutions of higher education authorizing broad

20 Workforce Initiative Act of 2015 Fund in order to finance the distribution of

2 (2) The purposes of subdivision (b)(1) of this section are
3 typically accomplished by:

4 (A) Identifying the purpose in the appropriation act;

5 (B) Delineating such maximums in the appropriation act for
6 a publicly supported institution of higher education; and

7 (C) Delineating the general revenue allocations authorized
8 for each fund and fund account by amendment to the Revenue Stabilization Law,

10 (3) It is both necessary and appropriate that the General

17 encourage enrollment in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, the Health
18 Care Independence Program, or the Arkansas Works Program, including without
19 limitation:

20 (A) Unsolicited communications mailed to potential
21 recipients;

22 (B) Television, radio, or online commercials;

23 (C) Billboard or mobile billboard advertising;

24 (D) Advertisements printed in newspapers, magazines, or
25 other print media; and

26 (E) Internet websites and electronic media.

27 (2) This subsection does not prohibit the publicly supported
28 institutions of higher education from:

29 (A) Direct communications with licensed insurance agents;

30 (B) Solicited communications with potential recipients;

31 (C)(i) Responding to an inquiry regarding the coverage for
32 which a potential recipient might be eligible, including without limitation
33 providing educational materials or information regarding any coverage for
34 which the individual might qualify.

35 (ii) Educational materials and information
36 distributed under subdivision (c)(2)(C)(i) of this section shall contain only

1 factual information and shall not contain subjective statements regarding the
2 coverage for which the potential recipient might be eligible; and

3 (D) Using an Internet website for the exclusive purpose of
4 enrolling individuals in the Arkansas Health Insurance Marketplace, the
5 Health Care Independence Program, or the Arkansas Works Program.

6 (d) The publicly supported institutions of higher education shall not
7 apply for or accept any funds, including without limitation federal funds,
8 for the purpose of advertisement, promotion, or other activities designed to

19 (ii) Subdivision (e)(1)(A)(i) of this section does
20 not apply to regulatory and training responsibilities related to navigators,

1 (g) The provisions of this section are severable, and the invalidity
2 of any subsection or subdivision of this section shall not affect other
3 provisions of the section that can be given effect without the invalid
4 provision.

5 (h) This section expires on June 30, 2017.

6
7 SECTION 43. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds
8 authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency
9 and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and
10 the restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and
11 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
12 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
13 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
14 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
15 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

16
17 SECTION 44. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General
18 Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations
19 contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for
20 which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive
21 Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget
22 manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or
23 summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative
24 Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

25
26 SECTION 45. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
27 General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits
28 the appropriation of funds for more than a one (1) year period; that the
29 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2016 is essential to the operation of
30 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
31 the event of an extension of the legislative session, the delay in the
32 effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2016 could work irreparable harm
33 upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental
34 programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act
35 being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health
36 and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2016.
