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1 unanticipated shortfalls in state general revenue.

(2) Or the Chief Fiscal Officer of the State may transfer funds
from the Arkansas Rainy Day Fund Long Term Reserve Fund to the Economic
Development Superprojects Project Fund for projects authorized under Arkansas
Constitution, Amendment 82, as approved by the Governor and the Legislative
Council or Joint Budget Committee.
