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22	SECTION 1. Ar	kansas Constitution, Amendment 51, § 5(b), concerning

25	(b)(1) The Se	cretary of State is designated as the ch	ief election
26	official. The Secret	ary shall prepare and distribute the pre	-addressed
27	postcard mail voter	registration application forms described	l in 51-6 [section
28	6] of this amendment	. Mail registration application forms sh	all serve for
29	purposes of initial	applications to register and shall also	serve for changes
30	of name, address, or	party affiliation. Bilingual (Spanish/E	inglish) forms,
31	braille forms, and 1	arge print forms shall be available upon	request. The

chall provide voter registration opportunities to those obtaining or renewing drivers licenses, personal identification cards, duplicate or corrected licenses or cards, or changing address or name whether in person or by mail. The Office of Driver Services and State Revenue Offices shall use a computer process, which combines the drivers license and voter registration applications, minimizing duplicative information, and shall have available the federal or state mail voter registration application form, which may be used upon request or when the computer process is not available. If a person declines to apply to register to vote, the Office of Driver Services or State Revenue Office shall retain the record of declination for two (2) years.

(3) All public assistance agencies shall provide a federal or state mail voter registration application form with each application for assistance, and with each recertification, renewal or change of address or

state mail voter registration application form with each application for assistance, and with each recertification, renewal or change of address or name relating to such assistance. Public assistance agencies shall provide voter registration application forms as part of the intake process, or as a combined computer process when a computer process is available. Public assistance agencies shall use a process or form that combines the application for assistance with the voter registration application when available. Public assistance agencies shall also provide declination forms as described in 51-6 [section 6] of this amendment, which shall be retained for two (2) years if an applicant declines to apply to register to vote.

(4)(3) All disabilities agencies shall provide a federal or state mail voter registration application form with each application for services and with each recertification, renewal or change of address or name relating to such services. Disabilities agencies shall provide voter registration application forms as part of the intake process, or as a combined computer process when a computer process is available. Disabilities agencies may use a form that combines the application for services or assistance with the voter registration application when available. If the disabilities agency provides services in a person's home, then the agency shall also provide voter registration services at the person's home. Disabilities agencies shall also provide declination forms as described in 51-6 [section 6] of this amendment, which shall be retained for two (2) years if an applicant declines to apply to register to vote.

1	SECTION 2. Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 51, § 5 is amended to add		
2	an additional subsection to read as follows:		
3	(f)(1) The Office of Driver Services with the advice, assistance, and		
4	approval of the Secretary of State shall establish a schedule and method for		
5	the Office of Driver Services to electronically provide to the Secretary of		
6	State the records specified in this section.		
7	(2)(A) The Office of Driver Services shall provide to the		
8	Secretary of State, in the manner and method agreed upon by the Office of		
9	Driver Services and the Secretary of State, the following information		
10	associated with each person who obtains or renews a drivers license, personal		
11	identification card, or duplicate or corrected license or card or changes his		
12	or her address or name whether in person or by mail:		
13	(i) Name;		
14	(ii) Date of Birth;		
15	(iii) Either or both of the following, as contained		
16	in the Office of Driver Service's records:		
17	(a) Residence address; or		
18	(b) Mailing address;		
19	(iv) Telephone number;		
20	(v) Email address, if available;		
21	(vi) Political party preference;		
22	(vii) Whether or not the person affirmatively		
23	declined to become registered to vote during a transaction with the Office of		
24	<u>Driver Services</u> ;		
25	(viii) A notation that the person has attested that		
26	he or she is eligible to register to vote; and		
27	(ix) Any other information required to be submitted		
28	by rule.		
29	(B)(i) Records provided to the Secretary of State under		
30	this subsection shall be used only for the purposes of outreach and education		
31	to eligible voters conducted by the Secretary of State.		
32	(ii) The Secretary of State shall provide materials		
33	created for purposes of outreach and education as described in this paragraph		
34	in languages other than English, as required by 52 U.S.C. § 10503 of the		
35	Voting Rights Act of 1965, 52 U.S.C. § 10301 et seq.		
36	(3) The Secretary of State shall not sell, transfer, or allow		

1	any third party access to the information acquired from the Office of Driver		
2	Services pursuant to this subsection without approval of the Office of Driver		
3	Services, except as specifically permitted by law.		
4	(4)(A) The records of a person collected and transmitted under		
5	this subsection shall constitute a completed affidavit of registration.		
6	(B) The Secretary of State shall immediately submit the		
7	records collected and transmitted under this subsection to the appropriate		
8	county clerk.		
9	(C) The appropriate county clerk shall register the person		
10	to vote unless any of the following conditions are satisfied:		
11	(i) The person's records under this subsection		
12	reflect that he or she affirmatively declined to become registered to vote		
13	during a transaction with the Office of Driver Services;		
14	(ii) The person's records under this subsection do		
15	not reflect that he or she has attested to meeting all voter eligibility		
16	requirements; or		
17	(iii) The county clerk determines that the person is		
18	ineligible to vote.		
19	(D) If a person who is registered to vote under this		
20	subsection does not provide a party preference, his or her party preference		
21	shall be designated as "Unknown", and he or she shall be treated as having no		
22	party preference.		
23	(5) A person registered to vote under this subsection may cancel		
24	his or her voter registration at any time by any method available to any		
25	other registered voter.		
26	(6) The Office of Driver Services and the Secretary of State		
27	shall adopt rules in furtherance of this section including without limitation		
28	the following:		
29	(A) A process for canceling the registration of a person		
30	who is ineligible to vote, but becomes registered under this subsection;		
31	(B) The method for electronically transmitting the records		
32	under this subsection; and		
33	(C) An education and outreach campaign to be conducted by		
34	the Secretary of State informing voters about voter registration under this		
35	subsection.		

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
