Arkansas Code § 5-52-107 is amended to read as follows: 24 25 5-52-107. Abuse of office. 26 (a) A person commits the offense of abuse of office if, being a public 27 servant, or being a person elected, appointed, or otherwise designated to 28 become a public servant although not yet occupying that position, and with 29 the purpose of benefiting in a pecuniary fashion or obtaining a sexual favor for himself or herself or another person or of harming another person, the 30 31 person knowingly: 32 (1) Commits an unauthorized act which purports to be an act of his or her office; or 33 34 (2) Omits to perform a duty imposed on him or her by law or 35 clearly inherent in the nature of his or her office. 36 (b) Abuse of office is a Class B misdemeanor.:
