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19	SECTION 1. Arkar	nsas Code § 17-84-104 is amended	to read as follows:

4	(b) Additionally, the The dispenser of an in-office assembled hearing		
5	instrument shall deliver to the person supplied with the in-office assembled		
6	hearing instrument an instruction booklet for the in-office assembled hearing		
7	instrument.		
8	(c) The Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers may require by		
9	rule a dispenser to provide instructions to a person supplied with a hearing		
10	instrument on how to file a complaint.		
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12	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-84-304(a), concerning the qualifications		
13	for licensure and internship, is amended to read as follows:		
14	(a) An applicant for a license by examination or for an internship		
15	shall:		
16	(1) Submit an application on the form and within the time		
17	prescribed by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers;		
18	(2) Pay an application fee in the amount prescribed by the		
19	board; and		
20	(3) Show to the satisfaction of the board that he or she:		
21	(A) Is twenty (20) years of age or older;		
22	(B) Has an education equivalent of two (2) or more years		
23	of accredited college-level course work from a regionally accredited college		
24	or university; and		
25	(C) Is of good moral character.		
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27	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-84-304(b)(1), concerning the		
28	qualifications for licensure and internship, is amended to read as follows:		
29	(1)(A) Complete a valid one-year employment internship during		
30	which he or she is under the direct personal and physical supervision of a		
31	sponsor who has continuously held in good standing for a period of not less		
32	than three (3) years either a valid Arkansas hearing instrument dispenser's		
33	license or a valid Arkansas audiology license;.		
34	(B) The board shall determine by rule what constitutes a		
35	valid one-year employment internship;		

- 1 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-84-304(d), concerning the qualifications 2 for licensure and internship, is amended to read as follows:
- determined by the board under subdivision (b)(1)(B) of this section may take the licensing examination, written or practicum, or both, upon written recommendation of his or her sponsor after successfully completing six (6) months in the internship program.
- 8 (2) If the person successfully passes the examination, he or she 9 may complete the one-year internship program under the oversight of the 10 sponsor without <u>direct</u> personal and physical supervision if he or she works 11 out of the same place of business as the sponsor.
- 12 (3) If the person fails <u>any part of</u> the examination, he or she 13 shall complete the full one-year internship before reexamination.
- (4) (A) Any examination taken during an internship shall be considered as one (1) of three (3) attempts to pass the examination allowed under § 17-84-305(d).
- 17 (B) After three (3) failed attempts to pass the

  18 examination allowed under § 17-84-305(d), the person shall repeat the

  19 internship application.
- 20 (5) It is a violation of this chapter for any person during the 21 course of his or her internship to practice the dispensing of hearing 22 instruments except under:
- 23 (A) The direct personal and physical supervision of his or 24 her sponsor; or
- (B) The conditions set out in this subsection.

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SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-84-306(c)(2)(C), concerning delinquent fees for license renewal, is amended to read as follows:

- (C) If the license renewal fee is or other requirements for
  license renewal under this chapter, or both, are delinquent by at least sixty
  (60) days, the licensee shall be reexamined prior to before the renewal of
  the license.
- SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 17-84-306(d), concerning the requirement of continuing education for renewal of licenses, is amended to read as follows:

  (d)(1) The board shall require that all applicants seeking renewal of

1 their licenses shall: 2 (A) show Show proof of attending during the preceding year a minimum of twelve (12) hours of board-approved continuing education in the 3 4 methods and techniques of testing for and fitting hearing instruments, 5 including at least one (1) hour of ethics.; 6 (2)(B) The board shall require that all applicants seeking 7 renewal of their licenses shall present Present written evidence of annual 8 calibration of all audiometers and tympanometers to current national 9 standards; and 10 (C) Provide a blank copy of the currently used bill of 11 sale or comparable document provided to patients under § 17-84-104. 12  $\frac{(3)}{(2)}$  The board shall require that all new applicants and all 13 applicants seeking renewal of their licenses shall state whether they are 14 engaged in the practice of dispensing in-office assembled hearing 15 instruments. 16 17 SECTION 7. Arkansas Code Title 17, Chapter 84, Subchapter 3, is 18 amended to add additional sections to read as follows: 19 17-84-310. Hearing instrument dispensing establishment license. 20 (a) A person shall not conduct, maintain, manage, or operate a hearing instrument dispensing establishment or test, repair, sell, or dispense 21 22 hearing instruments in a hearing instrument dispensing establishment unless 23 the hearing instrument dispensing establishment has obtained a license issued 24 by the Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers. 25 (b)(1) Upon application and fulfillment of the provisions of § 17-84-306, the board shall issue a license to maintain or operate a hearing 26 27 instrument dispensing establishment. 28 (2) The hearing instrument dispensing establishment license, to 29 be known as "the license", is for the testing, repairing, selling, or 30 dispensing of hearing instruments. 31 (3) The services provided in a hearing instrument dispensing 32 establishment shall be done in the presence of a hearing instrument dispenser or audiologist licensed in Arkansas. 33 34 (4) Application for a license shall be made in such a manner and

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in such a form as the board may determine.

(5) When the same person or entity owns multiple hearing

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T	instrument dispensing establishments, each location shall have a separate		
2	<u>license.</u>		
3	(6) A license shall expire on June 30.		
4	(7) The license shall at all times be displayed in a conspicuous		
5	place in the hearing instrument dispensing establishment for which the		
6	license is issued.		
7	(c)(l) The board shall not issue a license to a hearing instrument		
8	dispensing establishment without a manager or person in charge of the hearing		
9	instrument dispensing establishment.		
10	(2) The name of the manager or person in charge of the hearing		
11	instrument dispensing establishment shall be on file with the board.		
12	(3) Notification of any changes in the manager or person in		
13	charge of the hearing instrument dispensing establishment shall be sent by		
14	certified mail to the board within two (2) weeks of the change.		
15	(d)(1) The hearing instrument dispensing establishment shall be		
16	available for inspection by the board during regular hours of operation.		
17	(2) The hours of operation for the hearing instrument dispensing		
18	establishment shall be posted on the premises where the hours of operation		
19	can be easily seen by the public.		
20	(3) The board may:		
21	(A) Inspect the hearing instrument dispensing		
22	establishment at any time during regular hours of operation; and		
23	(B) Suspend, revoke, or otherwise remove the license of a		
24	hearing instrument dispensing establishment if violations of this chapter or		
25	violations of rules regarding hearing instrument dispensing establishments		
26	are found.		
27	(e) A hearing instrument dispensing establishment that is part of a		
28	multi-unit enterprise within the state shall:		
29	(1) Employ only one (1) full-time manager who is licensed in		
30	Arkansas as a hearing instrument dispenser or audiologist for a branch of		
31	hearing instrument dispensing establishments; and		
32	(2) Ensure that the full-time manager is reasonably accessible		
33	to all branches that he or she is managing.		
34	(f) A hearing instrument dispensing establishment shall have:		
35	(1) A testing room or area that does not exceed fifty-five		
36	decibels (55 dB) of ambient noise:		

1	(2) A calibrated audiometer and a calibrated tympanometer; and		
2	(3) The equipment necessary to provide verification of the		
3	fitting, sound field, or real ear measurement.		
4	(g)(l) A notification of license renewal is not the responsibility of		
5	the board.		
6	(2) The manager or person in charge of the hearing instrument		
7	dispensing establishment shall have full responsibility of licensure renewal		
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9	17-84-311. Mobile units.		
10	(a) As used in this section, "mobile unit" means a hearing instrument		
11	dispensing establishment that is moveable from a location to another		
12	location.		
13	(b) Each mobile unit shall obtain a separate hearing instrument		
14	dispensing establishment license under § 17-84-310.		
15	(c)(1) A manager or person in charge of a mobile unit shall notify the		
16	Arkansas Board of Hearing Instrument Dispensers thirty (30) days in advance		
17	of conducting business as a mobile unit.		
18	(2) The notification shall include the dates of operation of the		
19	mobile unit, times of operation of the mobile unit, and locations of		
20	operation of the mobile unit.		
21	(d) A mobile unit shall meet all requirements of the board as		
22	established by rule.		
23	(e)(l) This section shall apply to the testing of hearing and the		
24	dispensing of hearing instruments regardless of where the service occurs.		
25	(2) Failure to comply with this section is a violation of this		
26	<u>chapter under §§ 17-84-103 and 17-84-308.</u>		
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
