18	TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS HEALTHY FOOD	
19	IMPROVEMENT ACT.	
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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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24	SECTION 1. <u>Legislative findings and intent.</u>	
25	(a) The General Assembly finds that:	
26	(1) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly	
27	known as the food stamp program, assists eligible low-income individuals w	<u>ith</u>
28	the purchase of food;	
29	(2) Overconsumption of excessively sugared foods, food produc	ts,
30	and beverages increases the risk of obesity and other diseases;	
31	(3) People living in poverty are more likely to consume	
32	nutrient-poor food; and	
33	(4) The rate of obesity in Arkansas has increased while the	
34	obesity rate across the United States have remained level, according to a	
35	recent study.	
36	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that:	

1	(1) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly
2	known as the food stamp program, align with other programs and initiatives
3	aimed at improving the health and welfare of Arkansas citizens; and
4	(2) Insufficient nutritional value foods, food products, and
5	beverages are endangering the health of Arkansas residents.
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7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 76, Subchapter 2, is
8	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
9	20-76-215. Use of food stamps for healthy food.
10	(a) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as
11	the food stamp program, shall only allow benefits to be used only for foods,
12	food products, and beverages that have sufficient nutritional value.
13	(b)(1) The Department of Human Services shall identify specific foods,
14	food products, and beverages or general categories of foods, food products,
15	and beverages that have sufficient nutritional value.
16	(2) The Department of Human Services shall use the federal
17	guidelines for the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and
18	Children as a basis for identifying foods, food products, and beverages with
19	sufficient nutritional value.
20	(c) The Department of Human Services shall prohibit the use of
21	benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known
22	as the food stamp program, for foods, food products, and beverages with
23	insufficient nutritional value.
24	(d) The Department of Human Services shall request a waiver from the
25	Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture to allow the
26	implementation.
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
