12	AN ACT TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS HEALTHY FOOD
13	IMPROVEMENT ACT; TO RESTRICT THE FOOD STAMP BENEFITS
14	TO HEALTHY FOODS; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

17	Subtitle
18	TO CREATE THE ARKANSAS HEALTHY FOOD
19	IMPROVEMENT ACT.
20	
21	
22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
23	
24	SECTION 1. Legislative findings and intent.
25	(a) The General Assembly finds that:
26	(1) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly
27	known as the food stamp program, assists eligible low-income individuals with
28	the purchase of food;
29	(2) Overconsumption of excessively sugared foods, food products,
30	and beverages increases the risk of obesity and other diseases;
31	(3) People living in poverty are more likely to consume
32	nutrient-poor food; and
33	(4) The rate of obesity in Arkansas has increased while the
34	obesity rate across the United States have remained level, according to a
35	recent study.
36	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly that:

1	(1) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly
2	known as the food stamp program, align with other programs and initiatives
3	aimed at improving the health and welfare of Arkansas citizens; and
4	(2) Insufficient nutritional value foods, food products, and
5	beverages are endangering the health of Arkansas residents.
6	
7	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 76, Subchapter 2, is
8	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
9	20-76-215. Use of food stamps for healthy food.
10	(a) The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known as
11	the food stamp program, shall only allow benefits to be used only for foods,
12	food products, and beverages that have sufficient nutritional value.
13	(b)(1) The Department of Health shall identify specific foods, food
14	products, and beverages or general categories of foods, food products, and
15	beverages that have sufficient nutritional value.
16	(2) The Department of Health shall use the federal guidelines
17	for the Special Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants, and Children as
18	a basis for identifying foods, food products, and beverages with sufficient
19	nutritional value.
20	(3) The Department of Health shall adopt rules to implement this
21	section pursuant to the Arkansas Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201 et
22	seq., and legislative review and approval under § 10-3-309.
23	(c) The Department of Human Services shall prohibit the use of
24	benefits under the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program, formerly known
25	as the food stamp program, for foods, food products, and beverages with
26	insufficient nutritional value based on rules implemented by the Department
27	<u>of Health.</u>
28	(d) The Department of Human Services shall request a waiver from the
29	Secretary of the United States Department of Agriculture to allow the
30	implementation.
