13	(4) Bayou Bartholomew runs approximately parallel to U.S.	
14	Highway 65 from Pine Bluff, Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and	
15	Louisiana and is:	
16	(A) The longest bayou in the world;	
17	(B) The second most biologically diverse stream in North	
18	America, inhabited by 117 aquatic species; and	
19	(C) A national treasure with a historical legacy of	
20	American folklife;	
21	(5) Other regional bayous such as Bayou Macon, reportedly the	
22	second longest bayou in the United States, make up a network of streams in	
23	the Southeast Arkansas Delta which maintain historical, cultural, and	
24	ecological significance;	
25	(6) The combination of musical heritage and bayou folk	
26	traditions make the region an ideal tourist destination for music, nature,	
27	and history lovers; and	
28	(7) The designation of U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff,	
29	Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana as the "Delta Rhythm &	
30	Bayous Highway" is essential to preserve the region's history and to promote

34	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 67, Subchapter 2, is	
35	amended to add a new section to read as follows:	
36	27-67-226. Delta Rhythm & Bayous Highway.

1	(a) The route along U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff, Arkansas,
2	to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana is designated the "Delta Rhythm
3	& Bayous Highway".
4	(b) The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department shall
5	erect appropriate signs along U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff,
6	Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana designating the route
7	as the "Delta Rhythm & Bayous Highway", including without limitation a sign
8	in or near each of the following cities:
9	(1) Dermott;
10	(2) Dumas;
11	(3) Gould;
12	(4) Lake Village; and
13	(5) Pine Bluff.
14	(c) If the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department does
15	not have the funds available to erect the signs required under subsection (b)
16	of this section, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department may
17	accept and use gifts, grants, and donations received from private, public,
18	and nonprofit sources, including without limitation a city street department
19	or a county road department for:
20	(1) Acquiring and installing the signs required under subsection
21	(b) of this section; and
22	(2) Maintaining, replacing, or reconstructing the signs required
23	under subsection (b) of this section.
