10 *THE "DELTA RHYTHM & BAYOUS HIGHWAY"; AND FOR OTHER*

*AS THE "DELTA RHYTHM & BAYOUS HIGHWAY".*

19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

20

21 SECTION 1. DO NOT CODIFY. Legislative findings.

22 The General Assembly finds that:

23 (1) The southeast Arkansas Delta lowlands have a rich culture  
24 due in part to a varied musical heritage and the ecology and folklife of  
25 Bayou Bartholomew, Bayou Macon, and the many surrounding bayous in the  
26 region;

27 (2) Some of the most influential musicians, writers, and  
28 producers, largely in the development of blues, but also in soul, county,  
29 rockabilly, rhythm & blues, gospel, and folk music were from, or achieved  
30 musical milestones in, the Arkansas Delta lowlands;

31 (3) Significant musical contributions were made to several  
32 cities in the region, including Pine Bluff, Gould, Dumas, Grady, Dermott, Lake  
33 Village, Tillar, McGehee, and Eudora, Arkansas, by many  
34 great music legends including:

35 (A) "Big" Bill Broonzy;

36 (B) Jim Ed Brown;

 13                  (O) Sippie Wallace;

14                  (4) Bayou Bartholomew runs approximately parallel to U.S.  
 15 Highway 65 from Pine Bluff, Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and  
 16 Louisiana and is:

- 17                   (A) The longest bayou in the world;  
 18                   (B) The second most biologically diverse stream in North  
 19 America, inhabited by 117 aquatic species; and  
 20                   (C) A national treasure with a historical legacy of  
 21 American folklife;

22                  (5) Other regional bayous such as Bayou Macon, reportedly the  
 23 second longest bayou in the United States, make up a network of streams in  
 24 the Southeast Arkansas Delta which maintain historical, cultural, and  
 25 ecological significance;

26                  (6) The combination of musical heritage and bayou folk  
 27 traditions make the region an ideal tourist destination for music, nature,  
 28 and history lovers; and

29                  (7) The designation of U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff,  
 30 Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana as the "Delta Rhythm &  
 31 Bayous Highway" is essential to preserve the region's history and to promote  
 32 the economic development of cities in close proximity to U.S. Highway 65  
 33 South.

 35                  SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 67, Subchapter 2, is  
 36 amended to add a new section to read as follows:

1 27-67-226. Delta Rhythm & Bayous Highway.

2 (a) The route along U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff, Arkansas,  
3 to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana is designated the "Delta Rhythm  
4 & Bayous Highway".

5 (b) The Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department shall  
6 erect appropriate signs along U.S. Highway 65 South from Pine Bluff,  
7 Arkansas, to the border between Arkansas and Louisiana designating the route  
8 as the "Delta Rhythm & Bayous Highway", including without limitation a sign  
9 in or near each of the following cities:

10 (1) Dermott;

11 (2) Dumas;

12 (3) Gould;

13 (4) Lake Village;

14 (5) Pine Bluff; and

15 (6) Tillar.

16 (c) If the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department does  
17 not have the funds available to erect the signs required under subsection (b)  
18 of this section, the Arkansas State Highway and Transportation Department may  
19 accept and use gifts, grants, and donations received from private, public,  
20 and nonprofit sources, including without limitation a city street department  
21 or a county road department for:

22 (1) Acquiring and installing the signs required under subsection  
23 (b) of this section; and

24 (2) Maintaining, replacing, or reconstructing the signs required  
25 under subsection (b) of this section.
