29	SECTION 1. DO	NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative findings and</u>	intent.
30	(a) The Genera	1 Assembly finds that:	
31	<u>(1) Adva</u>	nced practice registered nurses are n	urses with advanced
32	education and clinica	l competencies in providing care to d	iverse populations
33	in a variety of setti	ngs;	
34	<u>(2) Adva</u>	nced practice registered nurses are n	ationally certified
35	and practice in all f	ifty (50) states;	
36	(3) Tran	tw-one (21) states authorize advanced	practice

1	registered nurses to have full practice authority that includes full		
2	prescriptive authority without supervision;		
3	(4) Nearly fifty (50) years of research consistently support the		
4	high quality and cost-effectiveness of advanced practice registered nurses;		
5	(5) Since the 1960s, studies have found no difference in health		
6	outcomes, including patient health status, number of prescriptions written,		
7	return visits requested, or referral to other providers, of care delivered by		
8	an advanced practice registered nurse or physician;		
9	(6) Collaborative practice agreements do not add patient safety		
10	or added value to the healthcare system, but add to the cost of care for the		
11	<pre>consumer;</pre>		
12	(7) Negative impacts of mandatory collaborative practice		
13	agreements include without limitation:		
14	(A) Potential interruption or closing of an advanced		
15	practice registered nurse-operated clinic due to a loss of a collaborative		
16	practice physician;		
17	(B) Significant added cost to overhead of the practice due		
18	to higher fees charged by many collaborative physicians;		
19	(C) Added paperwork for the advanced practice registered		
20	nurse and the physician, which adds to the cost of care;		
21	(D) Decreased healthcare access by adding a barrier for		
22	advanced practice registered nurses who would like to establish a new clinic;		
23	(E) Inhibits the establishment of new healthcare access		
24	points in rural and medically underserved areas of the state; and		
25	(F) Acts as a disincentive to remain in the state to		
26	practice for new graduates of Arkansas advanced practice registered nurse		
27	programs;		
28	(8) The following major groups and organizations support full		
29	practice authority for advanced practice registered nurses:		
30	(A) The National Governors Association;		
31	(B) The Institute of Medicine;		
32	(C) The American Association of Retired Persons; and		
33	(D) The Federal Trade Commission; and		
34	(9) The State of Arkansas should modernize scope of practice		
35	laws for advanced practice registered nurses by removing the mandatory		
36	collaborative practice agreement.		

1	(b) It is the intent of the General Assembly to:		
2	(1) Increase patient access to health care, reduce healthcare		
3	costs, and promote efficient and timely health care in the State of Arkansas;		
4	<u>and</u>		
5	(2) Authorize advanced practice registered nurses to have full		
6	practice authority without a collaborative practice agreement.		
7			
8	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 17-87-102(2), concerning the definition of		
9	collaborative practice agreement, is repealed.		
10	(2) "Gollaborative practice agreement" means a written plan that		
11	identifies a physician who agrees to collaborate with an advanced practice		
12	registered nurse in the joint management of the health care of the advanced		
13	practice registered nurse's patients and that outlines procedures for		
14	consultation with or referral to the collaborating physician or other		
15	healthcare professional as indicated by a patient's healthcare needs;		
16			
17	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 17-87-205(b), concerning the Prescriptive		
18	Authority Advisory Committee, is amended to read as follows:		
19	(b) The board shall appoint $\frac{\text{six}}{\text{(6)}}$ five (5) members, to be approved		
20	by the Governor, who have the following qualifications:		
21	(1) Four (4) members shall be advanced practice registered		
22	nurses, at least three (3) of whom hold certificates of prescriptive		
23	authority and an active <u>United States</u> Drug Enforcement Administration		
24	<u>registration</u> number;		
25	(2) One (1) member shall be a licensed physician who has been		
26	involved in a collaborative practice with an advanced practice registered		
27	nurse for at least five (5) years; and		
28	$\frac{(3)}{(2)}$ One (1) member shall be a licensed pharmacist who has		
29	been licensed for at least five (5) years.		
30			
31	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-87-310 is amended to read as follows:		
32	17-87-310. Prescriptive authority.		
33	(a) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing may grant a certificate of		
34	prescriptive authority to an advanced practice registered nurse who+		
35	(1) Submits submits proof of successful completion of an		
36	Arkansas State Board of Nursing-approved advanced pharmacology course

- 2 preceptorial experience in the prescription of drugs, medicines, and
- 3 therapeutic devices; and
- 4 (2) Has a collaborative practice agreement with a practicing
- 5 physician who is licensed under the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-
- 6 201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq., and § 17-95-401 et seq., and who has
- 7 training in scope, specialty, or expertise to that of the advanced practice
- 8 registered nurse on file with the Arkansas State Board of Nursing.
- 9 (b)(1) An advanced practice registered nurse with a certificate of
- 10 prescriptive authority may receive and prescribe drugs, medicines, or
- 11 therapeutic devices appropriate to the advanced practice registered nurse's
- 12 area of practice in accordance with rules established by the Arkansas State
- 13 Board of Nursing.
- 14 (2) An advanced practice registered nurse's prescriptive
- 15 authority shall extend only to drugs listed in Schedules III V and, if
- 16 expressly authorized by the collaborative practice agreement, also to those

- 19 (3)(A) The Arkansas State Board of Nursing shall promptly adopt
- 20 rules applicable to an advance practice registered nurse that are consistent
- 21 with the Arkansas State Medical Board's rules governing the prescription of
- 22 dangerous drugs and controlled substances.
- 23 (B) Prior to approval of the Arkansas State Board of
- 24 Nursing's rules, the Arkansas State Medical Board shall review the proposed
- 25 rules and verify that the proposed rules are consistent with the Arkansas
- 26 State Medical Board's rules concerning the prescription of dangerous drugs
- 27 and controlled substances.
- 28 (c) A collaborative practice agreement shall include, but not be
- 29 limited to, provisions addressing:
- 30 (1) The availability of the collaborating physician for
- 31 consultation or referral, or both;
- 32 (2) Methods of management of the collaborative practice, which
- 33 shall include protocols for prescriptive authority;
- 34 (3) Coverage of the healthcare needs of a patient in the
- 35 emergency absence of the advanced practice registered nurse or physician; and
- 36 (4) Quality assurance.

(d) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, § 17-95-201 et seq., § 17-95-301 et seq.,
and § 17-95-401 et seq., the Arkansas State Medical Board may review the role
of the physician in the collaborative practice to determine if the physician
is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the agreement without
an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
(e) If a collaborative practice results in complaints of violations of
this chapter, the Arkansas State Board of Nursing may review the role of the
advanced practice registered nurse in the collaborative practice to determine
if the nurse is unable to manage his or her responsibilities under the
agreement without an adverse effect on the quality of care of the patient.
