| 1 | (3) "Direct supervision" means the on-site, personal supervision |
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| 2 | by an anesthesiologist who is: |
| 3 | (A) Present in the office or surgical or obstetrical suite |
| 4 | when the procedure is being performed in that office or surgical or |
| 5 | obstetrical suite; and |
| 6 | (B) In all instances immediately available to provide |
| 7 | assistance and direction to the anesthesiologist assistant while anesthesia |
| 8 | services are being performed. |

| 10 | 17-95-1003. Powers and duties. |
| 11 | (a) The Arkansas State Medical Board shall: |
| 12 | (1) Examine, license, and renew the licenses of qualified |
| 13 | applicants; |
| 14 | (2)(A) Maintain an up-to-date list of every person licensed to |
| 15 | practice under this chapter. |
| 16 | (B) The list shall show the licensee's last known place of |
| 17 | employment, last known place of residence, and the date and number of the |
| 18 | license; |
| 19 | (3) Prosecute persons who violate this chapter and incur |
| 20 | necessary expenses of the prosecution; |
| 21 | (4) Keep a record of all proceedings of the board and make the |
| 22 | record available to the public for inspection during reasonable business |
| 23 | hours; |
| 24 | (5) Conduct hearings regarding discipline of a licensee or |
| 25 | denial, revocation, or suspension of a licensee; and |
| 26 | (6)(A) Share information on a case-by-case basis of a person |
| 27 | whose license has been suspended, revoked, or denied. |

| 24 | 17-95-1004. Licensing. |
| 25 | (a) A person applying for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant |
| 26 | shall submit an application to the Arkansas State Medical Board on forms |
| 27 | approved by the board. |
| 28 | (b)(1) The application shall not be effective for more than one (1) |
| 29 | year from the date of original submission of the application and fee. |
| 30 | (2) After one (1) year from the date that the original |
| 31 | application and fee have been received in the office of the board, a new |
| 32 | application and fee shall be required from any applicant who desires |
| 33 | licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant. |
| 34 | (c) Application information shall be submitted no later than fifteen |
| 35 | (15) days before the meeting at which the applicant desires the application |
| 36 | to be considered. |

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| 2 | 17-95-1005. Application for licensure. |
| 3 | (a)(1) An applicant for licensure as an anesthesiologist assistant |
| 4 | shall submit an application on a form approved by the Arkansas State Medical |
| 5 | Board. |
| 6 | (2)(A) The applicant shall submit two (2) personalized and |
| 7 | individualized letters of recommendation from anesthesiologists. |
| 8 | (B)(i) Letters of recommendation shall be composed and |
| 9 | signed by the applicant's supervising physician or, for recent graduates, the |
| 10 | faculty physician, and give details of the applicant's clinical skills and |
| 11 | ability. |
| 12 | (ii) Each letter shall be addressed to the board and |
| 13 | shall have been written no more than six (6) months before the filing of the |
| 14 | application for licensure. |
| 15 | (b)(1) The applicant shall have obtained a passing score on the |
| 16 | examination administered through the National Commission for Certification of |
| 17 | Anesthesiologist Assistants. |
| 18 | (2) The passing score shall be established by the National |
| 19 | Commission for Certification of Anesthesiologist Assistants. |
| 20 | (c) The applicant shall be certified in advanced cardiac life support. |

| 22 | 17-95-1006. Supervisory relationship. |
| 23 | (a) An anesthesiologist or a group of anesthesiologists, upon entering |
| 24 | into a supervisory relationship with an anesthesiologist assistant, shall |
| 25 | file with the Arkansas State Medical Board a written protocol, including |
| 26 | without limitation: |
| 27 | (1) The name, address, and license number of the |
| 28 | anesthesiologist assistant; |
| 29 | (2) The name, address, license number, and Drug Enforcement |
| 30 | Administration registration number of each anesthesiologist who will |
| 31 | supervise the anesthesiologist assistant; |
| 32 | (3) The address of the anesthesiologist assistant's primary |
| 33 | practice location and any other locations where the assistant may practice; |
| 34 | (4) The date the protocol was developed and the dates of all |
| 35 | revisions; |
| 36 | (5) The designation and signature of the primary supervising |

| 9 | (b) The protocol shall be: |
| 10 | (1) Filed with the board before the time that the |
| 11 | anesthesiologist assistant begins practice with the anesthesiologist or the |
| 12 | anesthesiology group; and |
| 13 | (2) Updated biennially. |
| 14 | (c) Anesthesiologist assistants may perform the following duties under |
| 15 | the direct supervision of an anesthesiologist: |
| 16 | (1) Obtain a comprehensive patient history and present the |
| 17 | history to the supervising anesthesiologist; |
| 18 | (2) Pretest and calibrate anesthesia delivery systems and |
| 19 | monitor, obtain, and interpret information from the systems and monitors; |
| 20 | (3) Assist the anesthesiologist with implementation of |
| 21 | monitoring techniques; |
| 22 | (4) Establish basic and advanced airway interventions, including |
| 23 | intubations of the trachea and perform ventilator support; |
| 24 | (5) Administer intermittent vasoactive drugs and start and |
| 25 | adjust vasoactive infusions; |
| 26 | (6) Administer anesthetic drugs, adjuvant drugs, and accessory |
| 27 | drugs; |
| 28 | (7) Assist the anesthesiologist with the performance of epidural |
| 29 | anesthetic procedures and spinal anesthetic procedures; |
| 30 | (8) Administer blood, blood products, and supportive fluids; |
| 31 | (9) Support life functions during anesthesia health care, |
| 32 | including induction and intubation procedures, the use of appropriate |
| 33 | mechanical supportive devices, and the management of fluid, electrolyte, and |
| 34 | blood component balances; |
| 35 | (10) Recognize and take appropriate corrective action for |
| 36 | abnormal nations recogned to anosthesia adjunctive medication or other |

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| 2 | (11) Participate in management of the patient while in the post- |
| 3 | anesthesia recovery area, including the administration of supporting fluids; |
| 4 | <u>and</u> |
| 5 | (12) Place special peripheral and central venous and arterial |
| 6 | lines for blood sampling and monitoring as appropriate. |
| 7 | (d)(1) The supervising anesthesiologist shall delegate only tasks and |
| 8 | procedures to the anesthesiologist assistant that are within the supervising |
| 9 | anesthesiologist's scope of practice. |
| 10 | (2) The anesthesiologist assistant may work in any setting that |
| 11 | is within the scope of practice of the supervising anesthesiologist's |
| 12 | practice. |
| 13 | (e) Continuity of supervision in practice settings requires the |
| 14 | anesthesiologist assistant to document in the anesthesia record any change in |
| 15 | supervisor. |
| 16 | (f) The tasks and procedures performed by the anesthesiologist |
| 17 | assistant shall be documented in the appropriate medical record. |

| 19 | 17-95-1007. Licensure without examination. |
| 20 | (a) A person who was engaged in anesthesiology work for at least one |
| 21 | (1) year before the effective date of this chapter is entitled to receive a |
| 22 | license without examination. |
| 23 | (b) A person seeking licensure under this section shall register with |
| 24 | the Arkansas State Medical Board before December 31, 2017, and shall pay the |
| 25 | license fee. |
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| 27 | SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This act shall become effective on and |
| 28 | after January 1, 2018. |
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
