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## For An Act To Be Entitled

8 AN ACT TO REQUIRE THE ARKANSAS TEACHER RETIREMENT  
9 SYSTEM TO CORRECT AN ERROR IN ITS RECORDS AT ANY TIME  
10 THAT UNDERSTATES THE SERVICE CREDIT OF A MEMBER; TO  
11 DECLARE AN EMERGENCY; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.  
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## Subtitle

14 TO REQUIRE THE ARKANSAS TEACHER  
15 RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO CORRECT AN ERROR  
16 THAT UNDERSTATES THE SERVICE CREDIT OF A  
17 MEMBER; AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.  
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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-7-205(c), concerning correction of  
24 errors contained in the records of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System, is  
25 amended to read as follows:

26 (c) A determination, review, administrative action, cause of action,  
27 request to enforce, change, or modify an obligation, duty, benefit  
28 calculation, designation, refund, contribution, service credit, or other  
29 right arising under this subchapter shall not be valid unless commenced  
30 within the look-back period unless the system determines that the  
31 justification to commence the process is due to intentional nondisclosure,  
32 fraud, misrepresentation, ~~or~~ criminal act, or an obvious or documented error  
33 by an employer or the system that understated the service credit of a member  
34 upon which all required contributions have been paid.  
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1           SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
2 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that an error in the records of the  
3 Arkansas Teacher Retirement System concerning a member's service credit may  
4 be detrimental to a member; that the ability to correct certain types of  
5 errors within the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System provides justice to a  
6 member; and that this act is immediately necessary to provide a remedy to a  
7 member of the Arkansas Teacher Retirement System. Therefore, an emergency is  
8 declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the  
9 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective  
10 on:

11                   (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

12                   (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
13 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
14 bill; or

15                   (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
16 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
