1	(b) In order to obtain a teaching license, Arkansas teachers will
2	demonstrate the ability to increase student academic achievement by
3	demonstrating competency on identified assessments of teaching methods
4	approved by the state board that result in increased student achievement.
5	
6	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1004(d)-(h), concerning unlicensed
7	teachers in a classroom for more than thirty (30) days, is amended to read as
8	follows:
9	(d) Effective at the beginning of the 2006-2007 school year, no \underline{A}
10	teacher shall \underline{not} be assigned to teach a grade level or a subject for which
11	he or she is not <u>fully or provisionally</u> licensed by the state <u>unless he or</u>
12	she meets one (1) of the following licensure exceptions as established by
13	rules promulgated by the state board:
14	(1)(A) An emergency teaching permit granted to a school district
15	for a position filled by a nonlicensed teacher who meets the Arkansas
16	Qualified Teacher Requirements promulgated by the State Board of Education.
17	(B) An emergency teaching permit may be granted annually
18	for not more than two (2) consecutive school years;
19	(2) An effective teacher licensure exception granted to a school
20	district for a position to be filled by an Arkansas licensed educator to
21	teach a content area related to the educator's current licensure content
22	area;
23	(3) A technical permit issued in cooperation with the Department
24	of Career Education;
25	(4) A licensure exception under:
26	(A) The District of Innovation Program, § 6-15-2801 et
27	seq.;
28	(B) The Arkansas Quality Charter Schools Act of 2013, § 6-
29	<u>23-101 et seq.; or</u>
30	(C) Section 6-15-103;
31	(5) A plan for adding an area to an existing Arkansas teaching
32	license while teaching in the content area to be added; or
33	(6) A waiver for a long-term substitute teacher granted under
34	subsection (e) of this section.
35	(e)(1) For purposes of this section, "long-term substitute" means an
36	individual who:

1	(A) Holds:
2	(i) A bachelor's degree from an accredited college
3	or university; or
4	(ii) An Arkansas teaching license; and
5	(B) Is substituting for a teacher of record for thirty-one
6	(31) or more consecutive school days in the same class during a school year.
7	(2) No class of students shall be under the instruction of $\frac{1}{2}$
8	(1) or more substitute teacher or teachers for more than thirty (30)
9	consecutive school days in the same class during a school year unless the
10	substitute teacher or teachers instructing the class have a bachelor's degree
11	awarded by an accredited college or university or have been licensed to teach
12	by the State of Arkansas school district has obtained a long-term substitute
13	waiver.
14	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ A <u>long-term</u> substitute teacher or teachers possessing a
15	bachelor's degree shall continue to teach the class from at least the thirty-
16	first consecutive day after the regular teacher is absent from the class
17	until the return of the regular teacher to that class.
18	$\frac{(f)(4)}{(6)}$ A person serving as a substitute teacher for thirty (30) days
19	or fewer shall:
20	(1)(A) Be a high school graduate; or
21	(2)(B) Hold a graduate equivalent degree.
22	(g) Subsections (e) and (f) of this section shall not apply to
23	substitutes for nondegreed vocational-technical teachers.
24	(h)(l) If subsections (e) and (f) of this section impose an undue
25	hardship on a school district, the school district may apply to the State
26	Board of Education for a waiver.
27	$\frac{(2)}{(5)}$ The state board shall develop rules and regulations for
28	granting a <u>long-term substitute</u> waiver.
29	(3)(6) Any school district granted a <u>long-term substitute</u> waiver
30	from this requirement shall be identified in the department's Department of
31	Education's annual school district report card.

33	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-17-402 is amended to read as follows:
34	6-17-402. Rules and regulations.
35	(a) The State Board of Education shall issue the license of a
36	classroom teacher, an administrator, a guidance counselor, or a library media

1	specialist in the public schools of this state.
2	(b) (l) The State Board of Education state board shall promulgate rules
3	and regulations for the issuance, licensure, relicensure, and continuance of
4	licensure of <u>public school</u> teachers <u>and administrators</u> in the public schools
5	of this state that:
6	(1) Require at a minimum that each in-state applicant for teacher
7	licensure:
8	(A) Completes an educator preparation program approved by
9	the Department of Education, which shall include without limitation:
10	(i) Educator preparation programs at institutions of
11	higher education leading to a bachelor's degree or higher; and
12	(ii) Alternative educator preparation programs under
13	§ 6-17-409; and
14	(B) Demonstrates:
15	(i) Licensure content area knowledge; and
16	(ii) Knowledge of teaching methods; and
17	(2) Require at a minimum that each in-state applicant for an
18	administrator's license demonstrates knowledge of state-adopted competencies
19	and standards for educational leaders.
20	(c) The state board may promulgate rules for a tiered system of
21	licensure, which may include without limitation:
22	(1) An emergency teaching permit;
23	(2) A technical permit;
24	(3)(A) A provisional license.
25	(B) The state board rules may provide that a provisional
26	license may be issued if the applicant:
27	(i) Meets the minimum qualifications under
28	subdivision (b)(1)-(2) of this section as applicable to an applicant for a
29	teaching or an administrator license; or
30	(ii) Partially meets full licensure requirements;
31	(4) A novice or first-time license;
32	(5) A standard license; and
33	(6)(A) A license with advanced requirements.
34	(B) The state board may authorize a teacher leader
35	advanced license or a teacher leader endorsement to a license.
36	(2)(A) In addition to other requirements, any person applying

- 1 for initial licensure as a teacher or administrator in the public schools or
- 2 a licensed teacher or administrator applying for a license in an additional
- 3 area shall take and complete a test recognized by the National Council for
- 4 Accreditation of Teacher Education and approved by the State Board of
- 5 Education and submit the scores to the Department of Education.
- 6 (B) No applicant for initial licensure or licensure in an
- 7 additional area shall receive a license after July 1, 2007, unless the
- 8 applicant scores at or above the minimum level set by the State Board of

11	(a) As used in this section, "alternative educator preparation
12	program" means a program of study approved by the Department of Education for
13	candidates holding a bachelor's degree who are preparing for licensure as
14	teachers and leaders in public schools in this state.
15	(b)(1) The State Board of Education may offer and operate $\frac{a}{b}$
16	nontraditional licensure an alternative educator preparation program.
17	$\frac{(b)(1)(2)(A)}{(b)(b)(b)}$ The Department of Education department may provide
18	grants of financial assistance to entities that train individuals seeking to
19	obtain $\frac{1}{2}$ nontraditional licensure through $\frac{1}{2}$ the $\frac{1}{2}$ nontraditional licensure process
20	an alternative educator preparation program administered by the department.
21	(2) (B) The department shall pay the grants from funds
22	appropriated by the General Assembly to the department for such purpose.
23	$\frac{(c)(1)(C)}{(C)}$ The state board shall promulgate rules and
24	regulations to determine eligibility for and amount of awards of the grants
25	concerning the operation of the nontraditional licensure alternative educator
26	preparation program authorized by this section and for such other purposes as
27	may be necessary in carrying out the intent of this section.
28	(2)(3) The department may refuse to admit for enrollment in the
29	nontraditional licensure alternative educator preparation program
30	administered by the department a person who has been dismissed from a teacher
31	education program at an institution of higher education.
32	$\frac{(d)}{(4)}$ If the state board requires an applicant for
33	$\frac{nontraditional}{nontraditional} \ \ \underline{licensure} \ \ \underline{through} \ \ \underline{an} \ \ \underline{alternative} \ \ \underline{educator} \ \ \underline{preparation} \ \ \underline{program}$
34	to complete one (1) or more additional college-level courses and the
35	applicant has obtained a bachelor's degree, the required course or courses
36	shall meet one (1) or more of the following conditions:

1	(1)(A) Each course shall be offered at every state-supported,
2	two-year institution of higher education.
3	(B) If more than one (1) course is required, all courses
4	shall be offered in a one-semester block; or
5	(2) Each course shall be available as an online course, a

7	instruction and part face-to-face instruction, as approved by the department
8	(e)(1) As used in this subsection, "accelerated teaching program"
9	means a program intended for college graduates that provides intensive
10	training and support for a period of two (2) or more years for teaching and
11	leading in schools.
12	(2) The state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching
13	license to an applicant if the applicant has:
14	(A) Either:
15	(i) Successfully completed an accelerated teaching
16	program, including:
17	(c) The state board may promulgate rules for the requirements for
18	educator licensure through other alternative educator preparation programs,
19	including without limitation:
20	(1) A teacher or leader academy;
21	(2) A residency program at a public school, which may be in
22	partnership with an educator preparation program at an institution of higher
23	education;
24	(a)(3) The Teach For America, Inc., program;
25	(b)(4) The Arkansas Teacher Corps program offered by of the
26	University of Arkansas at Fayetteville;
27	$\frac{(e)}{(5)}$ The American Board for the Certification of Teacher
28	Excellence program; or
29	(d)(6) Another accelerated teaching alternative educator
30	preparation program approved by the department; or
31	(ii)(7) Been awarded A program conferring a master's degree in
32	teaching from an accredited program at an institution of higher education;
33	and or
34	(8) An alternative educator preparation program or pathway for
35	an applicant who has professional work experience in the content area in
36	which the applicant desires to obtain a license.

1	(B) Successfully completed the criminal records checks and
2	Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410.
3	$\frac{(3)(A)(d)(1)}{(d)(1)}$ The state board shall issue to an applicant who is in an
4	accelerated teaching alternative educator preparation program a provisional
5	teaching license that is issued under the state board's rules governing
6	provisional licensure for nontraditional licensure applicants.
7	$\frac{(B)}{(2)}$ The provisional license is valid for the entire period
8	that the applicant is:
9	(i)(A) Participating Is participating in the accelerated
10	teaching alternative educator preparation program;
11	(B) Has not been determined to have an ethics violation
12	<u>under § 6-17-428;</u> and
13	(ii)(C) Teaching Is teaching in an Arkansas public school.
14	(4) (e) The state board may require an applicant who meets the criteria
15	of subdivision (e)(2) of for licensure under this section to submit proof of
16	the following academic eligibility:
17	$\frac{(A)(i)(1)(A)}{(1)(A)}$ Passing scores, as set by the state board, on
18	state-required basic skills, pedagogical, and content-area assessments, or
19	their substantial equivalents.
20	$\frac{(ii)(B)}{(B)}$ As used in this subdivision $\frac{(e)(1)}{(B)}$, "substantial
21	equivalents" includes <u>without limitation</u> the assessments required by the
22	American Board for the Certification of Teacher Excellence program <u>and an</u>
23	alternative method of demonstrating subject matter content competency
24	identified by the state board under § 6-15-1004;
25	(2) Successful completion of professional educator ethics
26	training identified by rules of the state board; and
27	$\frac{(B)(i)(3)}{(3)}$ If As required by state board rules for the grade
28	level and content area for which the applicant seeks licensure, successful
29	completion of courses in Arkansas history or reading and writing in content
30	areas, or both.
31	(ii) An applicant who has successfully completed an
32	accelerated teaching program is exempt from the requirement of courses in
33	reading and writing in content areas.
34	(5)(f) No academic or experience requirements for obtaining an
35	Arkansas teaching license in addition to those identified in this subsection
36	$\frac{\text{(e)}}{\text{subsections (c)-(e)}}$ of this section shall be imposed on an applicant who

1	has completed one of the programs under subdivision (c)(3)-(3) and who
2	otherwise meets the requirements of this subsection (e) section by:
3	(A) The state board;
4	(B) The department; or
5	(C) An Arkansas state-funded college or university.
6	(f)(1) The state board shall issue a nonrenewable three-year
7	provisional professional teaching license to an applicant who submits to the
8	department the following:
9	(A) Higher education transcripts evidencing the award of
10	at least a baccalaureate degree;
11	(B) Evidence of a minimum of three (3) years of employment
12	experience in the content area that the applicant seeks to teach;
13	(C) Evidence of an offer of employment to teach classes
14	for credit in an Arkansas public school;
15	(D) A statement of justification from the applicant
16	relating the applicant's experience to teaching in the content area in which
17	the applicant seeks to teach;
18	(E) Two (2) professional letters of recommendation
19	submitted by the applicant's references;
20	(F) Passing scores on the state-required basic-skills and
21	content knowledge tests for the content area in which the applicant seeks to
22	teach; and
23	(G) Successful completion of the criminal background
24	checks and Child Maltreatment Central Registry check under § 6-17-410.
25	(2)(A) An individual who receives a three year provisional
26	teaching license under this subsection shall have in the first year of
27	provisional licensure twenty-four (24) hours of training in pedagogy as
28	determined by the Department of Education.
29	(B) The twenty-four (24) hours of training in pedagogy are
30	in addition to and not considered a part of the professional development
31	required for teachers by their employing school district or public school.
32	(3) At the end of each year of provisional licensure, the
33	licensee shall undergo a summative evaluation as required by $\Lambda r kansas law$.
34	(4) At the end of three (3) years of provisional licensure, the
35	state board shall issue a standard five-year teaching license to the licensee
36	if the licensee:

Ţ	(A) Submits passing scores on the state-required
2	pedagogical assessment or its substantial equivalent for the content area in
3	which the applicant seeks to teach;
4	(B) Is identified by the employing school district as
5	proficient or above on a summative evaluation under § 6-17-2805 for the third
6	year of provisional licensure; and
7	(C) Is recommended for full licensure by the
8	superintendent of the employing school district.
9	(g) Each applicant for a provisional license under this section shall
10	successfully complete the criminal records checks and Child Maltreatment
11	Central Registry check under § 6-17-410 before the department may issue the
12	license.
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14	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-17-2403(a), concerning the minimum salary
15	schedule required of school districts, is amended to read as follows:
16	(a) (1) The board of directors in each school district in the state
17	shall pay classroom teachers upon a minimum salary schedule that provides:
18	$\frac{(1)}{(A)}$ Annual increments for education and experience;
19	(2)(B) A base salary; and
20	$\frac{(3)}{(C)}$ A minimum salary for a teacher with a master's
21	degree and at least fifteen (15) years' experience.
22	(2)(A) A school district may differentiate in the salary levels
23	of the minimum teacher compensation schedule to provide increased salaries
24	based on a tiered licensure system established by the State Board of
25	Education under § 6-17-402.
26	(B) The differentiated salary schedule shall not provide
27	for a salary that is below the minimum set out in this section.
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
