6-82-1802 Fetablichment - Fligibility	

1	(a) There is established the Arkansas Future Grant Program within the
2	Department of Higher Education.
3	(b) A student is eligible for an Arkansas Future Grant if the student
4	is an Arkansas resident who:
5	(1) Meets one (1) of the following requirements:
6	(A) Has either:
7	(i) Graduated from an Arkansas:
8	(a) Public high school;
9	(b) Private high school; or
10	(c) Home school under § 6-15-501 et seq.; or
11	(ii) Received a high school equivalency diploma
12	approved by the Department of Career Education; or
13	(B) Verifies that he or she has resided in Arkansas for
14	the three (3) years immediately preceding application for the grant and has
15	<pre>either:</pre>
16	(i) Graduated from an out-of-state:
17	(a) Public high school;
18	(b) Private high school; or
19	(c) Home school recognized by another state;
20	<u>or</u>
21	(ii) Received a high school equivalency diploma
22	approved by another state;
23	(2) Is enrolled part-time or full-time at an approved
24	institution of higher education in a program of study that leads to an
25	associate degree or a certification in a:
26	(A) Science, technology, engineering, or mathematics
27	field, including computer science; or
28	(B) Regional high-demand field; and
29	(3) Has completed and submitted to the United States Department
30	of Education a Free Application for Federal Student Aid or a subsequent
31	application required by the United States Department of Education for federal
32	financial aid.
33	(c) A student may continue to be eligible until the student has:
34	(1) Received the grant for five (5) academic semesters;
35	(2) Obtained an associate degree;
36	(3) Failed to maintain satisfactory academic progress, as

1	determined by the approved institution of higher education in which the
2	student is enrolled; or
3	(4) Failed to complete the mentoring or community service
4	requirements under § 6-82-1804.
5	
6	6-82-1803. Arkansas Future Grant.
7	(a)(1) An Arkansas Future Grant shall be in an amount equal to the
8	tuition, fees, and other charges incurred by a student who meets the
9	requirements under § 6-82-1802 to attend an approved institution of higher
10	education less the amount the student receives in:
11	(A) State-supported student financial assistance;
12	(B) Federal student financial assistance; and
13	(C) Private scholarships.
14	(2) If the approved institution of higher education in which the
15	student is enrolled is a four-year institution of higher education, the total
16	amount of tuition, fees, and other charges under subdivision (a)(1) of this
17	section shall be calculated as the average cost of tuition, fees, and other
18	charges at approved institutions of higher education that are two-year
19	institutions of higher education.
20	(b) The Department of Higher Education shall disburse the grant
21	directly to the approved institution of higher education.
22	(c) The department shall award grants under this subchapter in the
23	order in which the department receives applications from eligible students.
24	
25	6-82-1804. Recipients.
26	(a) A student who receives an Arkansas Future Grant shall enter into a
27	written agreement with the Department of Higher Education to:
28	(1)(A) Receive monthly mentoring from a mentor from an
29	organization determined by the Department of Higher Education.
30	(B) A mentor under subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section
31	shall:
32	(i) Receive annual mentoring training:
33	(a) Developed by the Department of Higher
34	Education; and
35	(b) Provided by a local volunteer group
36	approved by the Department of Higher Education; and

1	(ii) Certify to the Department of Higher Education
2	that at least one (1) time each calendar month the mentor has provided
3	mentoring services by telephone, email, or in person to each student he or
4	she is mentoring;
5	(2)(A) Complete at least fifteen (15) hours of community service
6	each semester the student receives a grant.
7	(B)(i) A student may select a community service project
8	that meets requirements developed by the Department of Higher Education.
9	(ii) An approved institution of higher education may
10	provide community services opportunities designed to benefit the approved
11	institution of higher education community or the broader local community.
12	(C) A student shall certify his or her community service
13	to the approved institution of higher education by the last regular day of
14	the semester the student received the grant; and
15	(3)(A) Reside in this state for three consecutive (3) years and
16	be employed beginning within six (6) months after receiving an associate
17	degree or a certification.
18	(B) The Department of Higher Education may defer the
19	requirement under subdivision (a)(3)(A) of this section if:
20	(i) The Department of Higher Education, in
21	consultation with the Department of Workforce Services, determines that there
22	was no employment position available that would reasonably enable the student
23	to meet this requirement; or
24	(ii) Special circumstances as determined by the
25	Department of Higher Education exist.
26	(C) After the period of deferral, the student shall begin
27	or resume working in this state or become subject to repayment under
28	subsection (b) of this section.
29	(b) The written agreement under subsection (a) of this section shall
30	provide that the grant converts into a loan and the student shall repay the
31	<pre>grant amount:</pre>
32	(1) On a pro rata basis at an interest rate and on a schedule as
33	determined by the Department of Higher Education for each year the student
34	does not reside in this state for three (3) consecutive years and become
35	employed beginning within six (6) months after receiving an associate degree
36	or a certification; or

1	(2) In its entirety at an interest rate and on a schedule as
2	determined by the Department of Higher Education if the recipient does not
3	comply with the written agreement under subsection (a) of this section.
4	
5	6-82-1805. Rules.
6	The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules to implement
7	this subchapter.
8	
9	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code §§ $6-82-1601-6-82-1610$ are repealed.
10	Subchapter 16 - Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Program
11	
12	6-82-1601. Legislative findings and intent - Purpose of subchapter.
13	(a)(1) The General Assembly, giving due consideration to the
14	historical and continuing interest of the people of Arkansas in encouraging
15	able and deserving students to realize their aspirations for postsecondary
16	education, finds and declares that postsecondary education for residents of
17	this state who desire an education and are properly qualified therefor is
18	important to the welfare and security of this state and nation and
19	consequently is an important public service.
20	(2) The General Assembly finds and declares that the state can
21	achieve its full economic and social potential only if every individual has
22	the opportunity to contribute to the full extent of his or her capabilities
23	and only when financial barriers to his or her economic, social, and
24	educational goals are removed.
25	(b)(1) The General Assembly recognizes the importance that Arkansans
26	of all ages continue to pursue educational opportunities.
27	(2) Arkansans who desire to pursue educational enrichment and to
28	improve present skills but who may be unable to attend postsecondary
29	educational institutions in the traditional manner are commended for their
30	initiative and persistence.
31	(c) It is the intent of this legislation to provide financial support
32	to adult students who are unlikely to receive meaningful financial aid from
33	traditional state or federal financial aid programs and to enhance the
34	education of the current work force in Arkansas.
35	
36	6-82-1602. Definitions.

1	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires:
2	(1) "Approved institution" means a public-supported or private,
3	non profit postsecondary institution with its primary headquarters located in
4	Arkansas that is eligible to receive Title IV federal student aid funds or
5	any nursing school with its primary headquarters located in Arkansas that is
6	eligible to participate in Title IV federal student aid programs;
7	(2) "Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant" means the amount of
8	money paid by the State of Arkansas to a qualified applicant under this
9	subchapter;
10	(3) "Gredit certificate" means certificate programs that are
11	taken for credit;
12	(4) "Department" means the Department of Higher Education;
13	(5) "Eligible student" means any student who meets the criteria
14	set out in this subchapter and who is eligible by rules and regulations
15	authorized by this subchapter and promulgated by the Arkansas Higher
16	Education Coordinating Board;
17	$(6)(\Lambda)$ "Financial need" means the difference between the
18	student's financial resources available as determined by the department and
19	the student's total educational expenses, including tuition, mandatory fees,
20	and board and room while attending an approved private or public institution
21	of postsecondary education.
22	(B) In determining need, the department shall employ a
23	formula of or a formula similar to a nationally recognized comprehensive
24	mechanism for determining need;
25	(7) "Full time student" means an individual resident of Arkansas
26	as defined by the department who:
27	(A) Is a student at an approved private or public
28	institution in a course of study leading to an associate's or bachelor's
29	degree or completion of an occupational training program; and
30	(B) Is enrolled in at least twelve (12) semester hours or
31	some other reasonable academic equivalent as defined by the department;
32	(8) "Program" means the Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant
33	Program;
34	(9) "Qualified student" means a student who meets eligibility
35	criteria and financial need as determined by the department and who has
36	demonstrated that an Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant is warranted; and

1	(10) "Tuition" means charges levied for attendance at an
2	approved institution, including mandatory fees.
3	
4	6-82-1603. Program established.
5	There is established the Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Program
6	to provide grants to residents of the State of Arkansas who:
7	(1) Are admitted to and in attendance as students at approved
8	private or public institutions of postsecondary education in this state; and
9	(2) Establish academic ability and financial need as provided in
10	this subchapter.
11	
12	6-82-1604. Administration — Authority of Department of Higher
13	Education.
14	The Department of Higher Education shall administer the Arkansas
15	Workforce Improvement Grant Program provided for in this subchapter and in so
16	doing shall have the following authority and responsibility with respect to
17	the program:
18	(1) To consider all applications for an Arkansas Workforce
19	Improvement Grant;
20	(2) To prepare application forms and other forms as it shall
21	deem necessary to properly administer and carry out the purposes of this
22	subchapter and to furnish the forms to persons desiring to make application
23	for a grant;
24	(3)(A) To determine the necessary procedures for the awarding of
25	grants should the number of eligible applicants exceed funds available,
26	giving priority to those students who exhibit financial need and who meet
27	academic eligibility requirements.
28	(B) To identify those students who exhibit financial need,
29	the department shall utilize the family contribution method or another
30	acceptable approved methodology;
31	(4) To determine a termination date for the acceptance of
32	applications;
33	(5) To require applicants to file such additional information
34	with the department as it may deem necessary and appropriate to carry out the
35	purposes of this subchapter and to prevent fraud or misrepresentation or
36	misleading representation by applicants;

1	(6) To disburse grants to qualified students;
2	(7) To adopt rules and regulations as the department deems
3	necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes of this subchapter;
4	(8) To cooperate with and receive the cooperation of the
5	approved private and public institutions of postsecondary education in the
6	state and their governing bodies in the administration of the program;
7	(9) To establish and consult as necessary an advisory committee
8	representing the private and public sectors of postsecondary education in
9	determining guidelines and regulations for administration of the program,
10	including, but not limited to, rules determining academic ability, financial
11	need, and residency;
12	(10) To employ or engage such professional, administrative,
13	elerical, and other employees as may be necessary to assist the department in
14	the performance of its duties and responsibilities;
15	(11) To provide fair and equitable treatment to all approved
16	institutions and students; and
17	(12) To approve a scholarship hold for a student for a period of
18	twenty-four (24) months or less for the following reasons without limitation:
19	(A) A medical condition of the student or of a member of
20	the student's immediate family that, on the basis of a physician's good-faith
21	judgment, necessitates that the student or the student's immediate family
22	member be hospitalized or receive outpatient or home-based medical care or
23	recuperate until released by the attending physician;
24	(B) A personal or family emergency that requires the
25	student to:
26	(i) Attend the funeral of an immediate family
27	member; or
28	(ii) Visit a relative of the student if the relative
29	has a medical condition in which death is possible or imminent;
30	(C) Military service under § 6-61-112; or
31	(D)(i) A commitment of twelve (12) to twenty-four (24)
32	months for service in a national or international humanitarian project
33	sponsored by a nonprofit corporation organized with a charitable or
34	educational purpose.
35	(ii) The student's commitment shall be expressed in
36	a written agreement with the nonprofit organization, including the terms of

1	completion for the student's service on the related project.
2	(iii) The department shall release a scholarship
3	hold if the department determines that the student did not complete the
4	commitment under the written agreement.
5	
6	6-82-1605. Eligibility.
7	A qualified student shall be eligible for an initial or renewed state
8	Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant only if the student:
9	(1) Is a citizen of the United States or a permanent resident
10	alien;
11	(2) Is a resident of the State of Arkansas as determined by the
12	Department of Higher Education for at least six (6) months immediately
13	preceding the date on which the student applies;
14	(3) Is accepted for admission at an approved institution of
15	postsecondary education of his or her choice to pursue a baccalaureate
16	degree, an associate degree, or a credit certificate;
17	(4) Is enrolled in no fewer than three (3) credit hours or the
18	equivalent as of the eleventh day of class at an approved institution that
19	the department has determined to be eligible to participate in the $\Delta r kansas$
20	Workforce Improvement Grant Program;
21	(5)(A) As an initial first-year student, meets satisfactory
22	academic progress standards required to receive other financial aid at the
23	institution to be attended as determined by the rules and regulations of the
24	department.
25	(B) After the initial first year, the student meets
26	satisfactory academic progress standards of the institution attended;
27	(6) Has not earned a baccalaureate degree;
28	(7) Does not owe a refund on a Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental
29	Educational Opportunity Grant, or State Student Incentive Grant award or is
30	not in default on a National Defense/Direct Student Loan, Federal Perkins
31	Loan, Stafford Loan, a supplemental educational loan, Parent Loan for
32	Undergraduate Students, Income Contingent Loan, William D. Ford Federal
33	Direct Loan, or a consolidated loan under the Federal Direct Student Loan
34	Program;
35	(8) Has not borrowed, as determined by the institution to be
36	attended, in excess of the annual loan limits under the Federal Family

Education Loan Program, William D. Ford Federal Direct Loan Program, Income 1 2 Contingent Loan Demonstration Program, Stafford Loan Program, Parent Loan for Undergraduate Students Program, or a supplemental educational loan in the 3 same academic year for which the student has applied for assistance under the 4 5 Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Program and has not borrowed in excess 6 of the aggregate maximum loan limits under the Arkansas Workforce Improvement 7 Grant Program; 8 (9) Is twenty four (24) years of age or older on or before the first day of the semester or summer sessions in which the grant has been 9 10 awarded; and 11 (10) Either: 12 (A)(i) Graduated from high school or passed a high school 13 equivalency test; and 14 (ii) Meets the ability-to-benefit criteria as 15 defined by federal regulations in existence on January 1, 2003; or (B) Enrolls in a combined general education development 16 17 program and postsecondary credential program. 18 19 6-82-1606. Qualified student entitled to grant. A qualified student who is enrolled or has been accepted for enrollment 20 21 at an approved private or public institution and who meets other eligibility 22 criteria shall be entitled to a Workforce Improvement Grant based on academic ability and financial need as determined by the Department of Higher 23 Education. 24 25 26 6-82-1607. Duties of applicant for grant. 27 In accordance with the provisions of this subchapter and the rules and 28 regulations of the Department of Higher Education adopted pursuant to this 29 subchapter, each applicant shall: 30 (1) Complete and file with the department either directly or through a service recognized by the department the appropriate application 31 32 for an Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant and other information and data as 33 may be requested by the department for its use and consideration in 34 determining the eligibility of the applicant; and 35 (2) Promptly furnish to the department information regarding any other financial aid received, any change in the financial status of the 36

1	applicant, and any other information that might have a direct bearing on the
2	eligibility of the applicant for assistance under this subchapter.
3	
4	6-82-1608. Amounts of grants.
5	(a) Each person awarded an Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant shall
6	receive the grant for one (1) academic year or its equivalent for part-time
7	students as defined by the Department of Higher Education.
8	(b) The grant may be renewable for up to three (3) academic years or
9	the equivalent for part-time students if the person applies and meets
10	continuing eligibility criteria established by the department.
11	(c)(1) The amount of the annual grant for full-time students shall not
12	exceed the lesser of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) per academic year or the
13	cost of tuition at the institution.
14	(2) The amount of the annual grant for part-time students shall
15	be prorated on the basis of the number of credit hours enrolled each term not
16	to exceed the lesser of two thousand dollars (\$2,000) or the cost of tuition
17	at the institution per academic year.
18	(3) The maximum total grant shall be eight thousand dollars
19	(\$8,000).
20	(4) The amount of any award under subdivisions (c)(1) or (2) of
21	this section shall be reduced by the amount of any Pell Grant received by the
22	student for the academic year.
23	(d) The enrollment hours shall be determined on the eleventh class day
24	or the official department counting day.
25	(e) The department may promulgate rules and regulations to allow
26	institutions to make emergency grants to students under the Arkansas
27	Workforce Improvement Grant Program.
28	
29	6-82-1609. Award made to student.
30	The Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant is to be awarded directly to
31	the student by an eligible postsecondary institution in the name of the
32	student and in a manner to be determined by the Department of Higher
33	Education.
34	
35	6-82-1610. Withdrawal and refunds.
36	If a recipient of a Workforce Improvement Grant at any time withdraws

1 from an approved private or public institution so that under the rules and 2 regulations of that institution he or she is entitled to a refund of any tuition, fees, or other charges, the institution shall pay the refund to 3 4 which the student may be entitled to the Department of Higher Education to 5 the extent of any amount the department has paid to the student for that 6 academic year. 7 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code §§ 6-82-1612 - 6-82-1614 are repealed. 8 9 6-82-1612. Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Advisory Committee. 10 (a) There is created the Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Advisory 11 Committee. 12 (b) The committee shall consist of eight (8) members to be appointed 13 by the Director of the Department of Higher Education as follows: 14 (1) Three (3) members who are representative of public or 15 private two-year educational institutions; 16 (2) Three (3) members who are representative of public or 17 private four-year educational institutions; (3) The Executive Director of the Arkansas Association of Two-18 19 Year Colleges or his or her designee; and (4) The President of the Arkansas Association of Student 20 21 Financial Aid Administrators. 22 (c)(1) The committee members shall initially be appointed for staggered terms so that the terms of one (1) member from a two-year 23 institution and one (1) member of a four year institution expire each year 24 25 for a period of three (3) years. 26 (2) Thereafter, each member shall be appointed to serve a term 27 of three (3) years. 28 (d) Vacancies on the committee shall be filled by appointment of the director to serve out the remainder of the term of the vacated position. 29 30 (e) A member of the committee shall not be entitled to compensation for his or her services and shall not receive expense reimbursement except 31 32 from the institution employing the member. 33 (f) The Department of Higher Education shall provide necessary staff 34 to assist the committee with the range and diversity of its charge. 35 (g)(1) The committee shall hold its first meeting within thirty (30) 36 days after its appointment to organize as necessary to carry out its purposes

1	as prescribed by this subchapter.
2	(2) The director shall designate a person on the committee to
3	call and preside at the first meeting.
4	(h) Four (4) of the members of the committee shall constitute a quorum
5	for the transaction of business.
6	(i) The committee shall select by majority vote one (1) of its members
7	to serve as chair and one (1) to serve as vice chair.
8	(j)(1) The committee shall meet as necessary to carry out the duties
9	of the committee.
10	(2) Meetings may be called by the chair or as provided by the
11	rules of the committee.
12	(k) The committee shall provide advice to the department concerning
13	the development of rules and regulations for the operation and administration
14	of the Arkansas Workforce Improvement Grant Program.
15	
16	6-82-1613. Rules and regulations.
17	(a)(1) The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules and
18	regulations for the administration of the Arkansas Workforce Improvement
19	Grant Program by the institutions of higher education consistent with the
20	purposes and requirements of this subchapter.
21	(2) The rules and regulations shall be reviewed by the Arkansas
22	Workforce Improvement Grant Advisory Committee and approved by the Arkansas
23	Higher Education Coordinating Board.
24	(b) The rules and regulations shall include:
25	(1) Student eligibility criteria based on the provisions of this
26	subchapter;
27	(2) The method for selecting grant recipients;
28	(3) Rules for determining continuing eligibility;
29	(4) Procedures for making payment to recipients;
30	(5) Satisfactory academic standards; and
31	(6) Other administrative procedures that may be necessary for
32	the implementation and operation of the program.
33	(c) The department shall file a report no later than December 1 of
34	each year with the Legislative Council stating the total annual number of
35	recipients in the program and the total annual amount of grants awarded.

T	0-82-1014. Funding.
2	(a) A Workforce Improvement Crant shall be awarded contingent on the
3	appropriation and availability of funds for the Arkansas Workforce
4	Improvement Grant Program.
5	(b)(1) The total funds available for the program shall be divided
6	among all approved institutions.
7	(2) The funds shall be divided pro rata based on each approved
8	institution's percentage of enrollment of undergraduate students over twenty-
9	five (25) years of age earning credit for the previous academic year.
10	(3) Each institution shall be responsible for administering the
11	program in accordance with rules and regulations as approved by the Arkansas
12	Higher Education Coordinating Board.
13	
14	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code Title 6, Chapter 82, Subchapter 17, is

16	Subchapter 17 - Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program
17	
18	6-82-1701. Legislative intent.
19	(a) The General Assembly finds that tuition assistance to low-income
20	students is a key contributor to college and workforce success.
21	(b) Tuition assistance will significantly enhance the ability of low-
22	income students to obtain college degrees and be productive citizens of
23	Arkansas and correspondingly benefit the State of Arkansas as a whole.
24	
25	6-82-1702. Definitions.
26	As used in this subchapter:
27	(1)(A) "Approved institution" means a public or private
28	institution of higher education located in Arkansas that:
29	(i) Is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission
30	of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools; or
31	(ii) Certifies to the Department of Higher Education
32	that its students are accepted for transfer at institutions accredited by an
33	accrediting agency recognized by the federal Department of Education.
34	(B) "Approved institution" does not include an institution
35	of higher education that discriminates against applicants, students, or
36	employees on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, age, handican, or

1	national origin consistent with the provisions of applicable state and
2	federal law;
3	(2) "Eligible student" means a student who meets the criteria
4	set out by this subchapter and is deemed to be eligible by rules authorized
5	by this subchapter and promulgated by the Department of Higher Education;
6	(3) "Financial need" means the family income of program
7	applicants as determined by the Department of Higher Education through
8	evaluation of program applications and supporting documentation;
9	(4) "Full-time undergraduate student" means a resident of
10	Arkansas who attends an approved institution of higher education and is
11	enrolled in at least twelve (12) credit hours or the equivalent the first
12	semester and fifteen (15) credit hours or the equivalent thereafter, as
13	defined by rule of the Department of Higher Education, in a program of study
14	that leads to or is creditable toward an associate degree or a baccalaureate
15	degree;
16	(5) "High school graduate equivalent" means a student who passes
17	a high school equivalency test in Arkansas;
18	(6) "Part-time undergraduate student" means a resident of
19	Arkansas who attends an approved institution of higher education and is
20	enrolled in at least six (6) credit hours per semester or the equivalent but
21	no more than twelve (12) credit hours or the equivalent the first semester
22	and fifteen (15) credit hours or the equivalent thereafter, as defined by
23	rule of the Department of Higher Education, in a program of study that leads
24	to or is creditable towards an associate degree or a baccalaureate degree;
25	and
26	(7) "Qualified certificate program" means a program that is:
27	(A) Offered by an approved institution of higher
28	education;
29	(B) Shorter in duration than an associate degree for which
30	credit hours are awarded that are creditable towards an associate degree; and
31	(C) Recognized by the United States Department of
32	Education for financial aid purposes.
33	
34	6-82-1703. Establishment.
35	The Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program is established to
36	increase the opportunities of low-income students to pursue higher education

1	opportunities.
2	
3	6-82-1704. Eligibility.
4	(a) Eligibility for the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program
5	shall be based on criteria established by rule of the Department of Higher
6	Education.
7	(b) The criteria established by the department shall include the
8	following:
9	(1) An applicant shall be a citizen of the United States or a
10	permanent resident alien;
11	(2) An applicant shall be a bona fide resident of the state as
12	defined by the department for a minimum of twelve (12) months immediately
13	before the date on which the student applies;
14	(3) An applicant shall be accepted for admission in a qualified
15	certificate program, associate degree program, or a baccalaureate program at
16	an approved institution of higher education as a full-time or part-time
17	student, as defined by the department;
18	(4) An applicant shall certify that he or she is drug-free and
19	shall pledge in writing on the application form to refrain from the use or
20	abuse of illegal substances; and
21	(5)(A) An applicant shall demonstrate financial need as
22	determined by the department.
23	(B) In determining financial need, the following criteria
24	shall be used:
25	(i) An applicant whose number in the household, as
26	reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, is "one (1)" shall
27	have an average family adjusted gross income not exceeding twenty-five
28	thousand dollars (\$25,000) per year at the time of application to the
29	program;
30	(ii) An applicant whose number in the household, as
31	reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid, includes more than
32	one (1) shall add an additional five thousand dollars (\$5,000) per additional
33	number in the household up to ten (10) additional household members, as
34	reported on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid to the base income
35	of twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000); and
36	(iii) The department shall have the authority to

1	adjust these financial need family income requirements on an annual basis,
2	using the federal Consumer Price Index to make any necessary changes. Other
3	financial need criteria necessary for the selection of recipients, including
4	those defined as emancipated or independent by federal student aid
5	regulations, shall be established through rules issued by the department.
6	
7	6-82-1705. Recipients.
8	(a) Students who receive grants under this subchapter shall be known
9	as Higher Education Opportunities Grant recipients.
10	(b) An eligible recipient shall receive a grant for one (1) academic
11	year, renewable for up to a total cumulative award amount of four thousand
12	dollars (\$4,000) if the recipient meets continuing eligibility criteria
13	established by rule of the Department of Higher Education.
14	(c) The amount of the annual grant awarded to each recipient shall be
15	one thousand dollars (\$1,000) for full-time students and five hundred dollars
16	(\$500) for part-time students.
17	(d) No student's total financial aid package, including multiple
18	scholarships, shall exceed the recognized cost of attendance at an
19	institution of higher education.
20	(e) Awards shall be applied only to a fall semester and a spring
21	semester.
22	
23	6-82-1706. Rules.
24	(a) The Department of Higher Education shall promulgate rules for the
25	administration of the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program consistent
26	with the purposes and requirements of this subchapter.
27	(b) The rules shall include:
28	(1) Student eligibility criteria incorporating the requirements
29	of this subchapter;
30	(2) A method for selecting grant recipients;
31	(3) A method for determining continuing eligibility;
32	(4) Procedures for making payment to recipients; and
33	(5) Other administrative procedures necessary for the
34	implementation and operation of the program.
35	
36	6-82-1707. Administrative costs.

1	The Department of Higher Education is authorized to expend each year up
2	to two percent (2%) of the amount appropriated for the Higher Education
3	Opportunities Grant Program for data processing and other administrative
4	costs of the program.
5	
6	6-82-1708. Informational materials.
7	The Department of Education and the Department of Higher Education
8	shall develop appropriate informational materials on the Higher Education
9	Opportunities Grant Program for distribution to all Arkansas students in
10	grades seven through twelve (7-12) each year as part of the packet of
11	materials on precollegiate preparation distributed by the Department of
12	Education.
13	
14	6-82-1709. Program evaluation.
15	The Director of the Department of Higher Education may review and
16	evaluate the operation of the Higher Education Opportunities Grant Program
17	with regard to eligibility criteria and size of the grant award to ensure
18	that the program's operation meets the intent of this legislation.
19	
20	6-82-1710. Scholarship hold.
21	The Department of Higher Education may approve a scholarship hold for a
22	student for a period of twenty-four (24) months or less for the following
23	reasons without limitation:
24	(1) A medical condition of the student or of a member of the
25	student's immediate family that, on the basis of a physician's good-faith
26	judgment, necessitates that the student or the student's immediate family
27	member be hospitalized or receive outpatient or home-based medical care or
28	recuperate until released by the attending physician;
29	(2) A personal or family emergency that requires the student to:
30	(A) Attend the funeral of an immediate family member; or
31	(B) Visit a relative of the student if the relative has a
32	medical condition in which death is possible or imminent;
33	(3) Military service under § 6-61-112; or
34	$(4)(\Lambda)$ A commitment of twelve (12) to twenty-four (24) months
35	for service in a national or international humanitarian project sponsored by
36	a nonprofit corporation organized with a charitable or educational purpose.

1	(B) The student's commitment shall be expressed in a
2	written agreement with the nonprofit organization, including the terms of
3	completion for the student's service on the related project.
4	(C) The department shall release a scholarship hold if the
5	department determines that the student did not complete the commitment under
6	the written agreement.
7	
8	SECTION 5. DO NOT CODIFY. An eligible student who is a Higher
9	Education Opportunities Grant recipient as of the effective day of this act
10	shall continue to receive the grant under § 6-82-1701 et seq., as it existed
11	on January 1, 2017.
12	
13	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
14	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the State of Arkansas is in
15	need of a more educated and skilled workforce; that the Arkansas Future Grant
16	Program created by this act will enable more Arkansas residents to obtain the
17	necessary skills and training to drive this state's economy forward; and that
18	this act is immediately necessary to ensure that the Arkansas Future Grant
19	Program is in place for the 2017-2018 academic year. Therefore, an emergency
20	is declared to exist, and this act being immediately necessary for the
21	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
22	on:
23	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
24	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
25	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
26	bill; or
27	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
28	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
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
