Arkansas Code § 6-14-106(a) and (b), concerning polling 13 places and qualifications and appointment of election commissioners and poll 14 workers, are amended to read as follows: 15 (a)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (a)(5) of this section, 16 the county board of election commissioners of each county shall designate all 17 the polling sites for each school district in its respective county, 18 including districts having territory in more than one (1) county but which 19 are domiciled in its county for administrative purposes, and shall provide 20 the election supplies and appoint the poll workers for holding all school 21 elections. 22 (2) The county board of election commissioners shall consult 23 with each school district regarding: 24 The number of polling sites to designate for each (A) 25 school district; and 26 (B) The location of the polling sites. 27 Polling sites for school elections shall be established by a 28 majority vote of the members of the county board of election commissioners 29 present. 30 $(4)(A)\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ Except as provided in subdivision (a)(4)(A)(ii) of 31 this section and unless changed by order of the county board of election 32 commissioners, the polling sites for each school election shall be the same 33 as those established for the immediately preceding school election. 34 (ii) (B) If no polling sites were opened in the 35 immediately preceding school election, the polling sites shall be the same as

1 were opened unless changed by order of the county board of election 2 commissioners. 3 (B) Each polling site for a school district's annual 4 school election shall be located within the school district. 5 (5) If the annual school election is held at the same time as 6 the preferential primary election or general election, the polling sites for 7 the annual school election shall be the same as the polling sites for the 8 preferential primary or general election. 9 (b) If the annual school election is held in September of any year or 10 in November of an odd-numbered year on a date on which no other elections are 11 held and a school district has territory in more than one (1) county, the 12 county board of election commissioners of the county in which the school 13 district is domiciled shall designate in a contested school election one (1) 14 or more polling sites in each county: 15 (1) In which the school district has territory; 16 (2) In which school district territory contains a city of the 17 second class or larger; and 18 (3) That has registered electors. 19 20 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 6-14-111(e)-(j), concerning candidate 21 filing procedures, is amended to read as follows: 22 The petition, affidavit of eligibility, and the candidate's 23 political practices pledge shall be filed with the clerk as follows: during a one-week period ending at 12:00 noon seventy (70) days before the annual 24 25 school election. 26 (1) During the party filing period as set forth in § 7-7-203 for 27 school elections held concurrently with a preferential primary election; or 28 (2) During a one-week period ending at 12:00 noon ninety (90) 29 days before the election for school elections held in odd years or 30 concurrently with a general election. 31 (f)(l) Candidates may begin circulating petitions not earlier than one 32 hundred (100) thirty (30) days before the annual school election filing 33 deadline under subsection (e) of this section. 34 (2) A signature dated more than one hundred (100) thirty (30) days before the school election filing deadline under subsection (e) of this 35 36 section shall not be counted by the clerk as a valid signature.

- (g) Votes for a write-in candidate for school district director shall not be counted or tabulated unless the candidate files with the county clerk during a the one-week period ending at 12:00 noon seventy (70) days before the annual school election under subsection (e) of this section:
- (1) A written notice of his or her intention to be a write-in candidate identifying the position sought, including without limitation the position number or other identifying information if applicable;
 - (2) An affidavit of eligibility; and
 - (3) The political practices pledge.
- (h) The county board of election commissioners shall place on the ballot as candidates for school district director the names of any qualified registered voters whose political practices pledges and affidavits of eligibility have been filed and whose petitions have been filed with and verified by the county clerk of the county in which the school district is domiciled for administrative purposes.
- (i)(1) On the day after the deadline for candidates to file for a position on the board of directors by petition, the county clerk shall certify to the board of election commissioners the names of those candidates who are registered voters in the school district and the electoral zone, if applicable, and who have qualified for the ballot by petition.
- (2) Immediately after the close of the write-in filing period, the county clerk shall certify to the county board of election commissioners any write-in candidates who have filed the affidavit of eligibility, the notice of write-in candidacy, and the political practices pledge with the county clerk.
- (j) The order in which the names of the respective candidates are to appear on the ballot shall be determined by lot at the public meeting of the county board of election commissioners held not later than sixty-seven (67) seventy-two (72) days before the annual school election.

SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 6-14-115(a)(1)(B), concerning the school elections and results, is amended to read as follows:

(B) Subdivision (a)(1)(A) of this section shall apply regardless of whether the date the annual school election is held on the third Tuesday in September or the first Tuesday following the first Monday in November.

2 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 6-14-118(b) and (c), concerning the expense of a school election, are amended to read as follows:

- (b)(1) If the school election is held in November of an even-numbered year, the school district shall reimburse each county in which the school election appears on the <u>preferential primary election or</u> general election ballot for additional costs incurred by the county when holding the school election in conjunction with the <u>preferential primary election or</u> general
- (2) Total reimbursement under subdivision (b)(1) of this section shall not exceed an amount equal to the amount the school district reimbursed one (1) or more counties in the aggregate for the last contested school election in an odd-numbered year.
- 14 (c) The school district shall reimburse a county for the entire cost 15 of a school runoff election if:
- 16 (1) The school election is held in November of an even-numbered 17 year; and
- 18 (2) The <u>preferential primary election or general election in</u>
 19 which the school election is held in conjunction with does not result in the
 20 holding of <u>a general primary election or</u> a general runoff election in the
 21 county so that the school runoff election is the only issue on the ballot.
