1	(3) Alpha-gal allergies most often occur in the central and
2	southern states such as Arkansas, where the lone star tick is more prevalent;
3	(4) A typical allergic reaction to Alpha-gal has a delayed
4	onset, occurring four to eight (4-8) hours after the consumption of mammalian
5	meat products, instead of the typical rapid onset with most food allergies;
6	(5) Since the reaction to eating mammal meat is delayed by
7	several hours, the proper diagnosis is often missed or the patient is
8	misdiagnosed;
9	(6) People who are affected by Alpha-gal have to be constantly
10	vigilant about the ingredients they consume, because an allergic reaction car
11	be severe and life-threatening; and
12	(7) As doctors are not required to report the number of patients
13	suffering with Alpha-gal, the true number of affected individuals is unknown.
14	(b) The purpose of this subchapter is to:
15	(1) Promote awareness and encourage efforts to treat Alpha-gal
16	in the state; and
17	(2) Ensure food safety for individuals with Alpha-gal allergies
18	through better food labeling.
19	(c) This section shall expire on December 31, 2020.

21	20-15-2202. Task Force on Alpha-gal — Creation.
22	(a) The Task Force on Alpha-gal is created.
23	(b) The task force shall be composed of the following seventeen (17)
24	members:
25	(1) One (1) senator appointed by the President Pro Tempore of
26	the Senate;
27	(2) Two (2) members of the House of Representatives appointed by
28	the Speaker of the House of Representatives;
29	(3) The Director of the Department of Health or his or her
30	designee, serving as an ex officio, nonvoting member;
31	(4) The Insurance Commissioner or his or her designee, serving
32	as an ex officio, nonvoting member;
33	(5) The Secretary of the Arkansas Agriculture Department or his
34	or her designee, serving as an ex officio, nonvoting member;
35	(6) Three (3) members who are employed by the Department of
36	Health and designated by the Director of the Department of Health:

1	(7) One (1) member who is designated by the Arkansas hospitality		
2	Association;		
3	(8) One (1) member who is designated by the Arkansas State Board		
4	of Nursing;		
5	(9) One (1) member who is designated by the Arkansas Pharmacists		
6	Association;		
7	(10) One (1) member who is designated by the American Academy of		
8	Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology;		
9	(11) One (1) member who is designated by the American College of		
10	Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology;		
11	(12) Two (2) members who are designated by the Division of		
12	Agriculture of the University of Arkansas; and		
13	(13) One (1) member who is a patient with a diagnosis of Alpha-		
14	gal allergies and who is appointed by the Speaker of the House of		
15	Representatives.		
16	(c) The terms of the legislative members of the task force shall		
17	expire on December 31, 2020.		
18	(d) Nonlegislative members shall serve at the pleasure of the		
19	organizations they represent.		
20	(e) Vacancies on the task force shall be filled in the same manner as		
21	provided for the initial appointment.		
22	(f) The chair shall be one (1) of the legislative members of the task		
23	force and shall be selected by the legislative members of the task force.		
24	(g) The task force shall meet as often as is deemed necessary by the		
25	chair.		
26	(h) The members of the task force shall serve without compensation and		
27	shall not receive per diem, mileage, or stipends.		
28	(i) The task force shall receive staff support from the Bureau of		
29	<u>Legislative Research.</u>		
30	(j) This section shall expire on December 31, 2020.		
31			
32	20-15-2203. Task Force on Alpha-gal — Duties.		
33	(a) The Task Force on Alpha-gal shall make recommendations designed to		
34	improve and increase knowledge and treatment throughout the state for Alpha-		
35	gal, especially for emergency room healthcare professionals.		
36	(b) The task force shall submit a report to the Legislative Council.		

1	the Senate Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor, and the House
2	Committee on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor no later than October 1
3	annually.
4	(c) This section shall expire on December 31, 2020.
