19	TO REFORM MEDICAID SERVICES FOR CHILDREN
20	WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES AND
21	MEDICALLY COMPLEX CONDITIONS; AND TO
22	DECLARE AN EMERGENCY.
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25	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 20-48-1102(2), concerning the definition of
28	"child health management services" for the managed expansion for child health
29	management services, is amended to read as follows:
30	(2) "Child health management services" means an array of clinic
31	services for children:
32	(A) Intended to provide full medical multidiscipline
33	diagnosis, evaluation, and treatment of developmental delays medical
34	conditions or multiple or complex medical conditions in Medicaid recipients
35	under twenty-two (22) years of age; and
36	(B) That is diagnostic, screening, evaluative, preventive,

1 therapeutic, palliative, or rehabilitative services, including early 2 intervention day treatment services; 3 4 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 20-48-1102(5)(A), concerning the definition 5 of "early intervention day treatment" for the managed expansion for child 6 health management services, is amended to read as follows: (5)(A) "Early intervention day treatment" means services 7 8 provided by a pediatric day treatment program run by early childhood 9 specialists, overseen by a physician, and serving children with developmental 10 disabilities, developmental delays, or a medical condition that puts them at 11 risk for developmental delay in a developmental day treatment clinic services program or child health management services program. 12 13 14 SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-48-1104(a), concerning the determination 15 of underserved status for expansion of services, is amended to read as 16 follows: 17 (a) An expansion of early intervention day treatment services in a 18 county is necessary when the Division of Developmental Disabilities Services 19 of the Department of Human Services determines that a county is underserved 20 with regard to: 21 (1) Early intervention day treatment services; or 22 (2) A specific category of early intervention day treatment 23 services currently offered to children with developmental disabilities or 24 delays. 25 26 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-48-1108 is repealed. 27 20-48-1108. Successor program. 28 (a) On or before July 1, 2013, the Department of Human Services shall 29 convene stakeholders, including without limitation representatives of the 30 Child Health Management Services Association and the Developmental 31 Disabilities Provider Association, to assist in determining the feasibility 32 of combining or merging the child health management services program and the 33 developmental day treatment clinic services program for children into a 34 successor program. 35 (b)(1) This subchapter does not require a successor program to include 36 child health management services programs operated by an academic medical

2	(2) Child health management services programs operated by an
3	academic medical center shall be subject to all other provisions of this
4	subchapter, including without limitation \$\$ 20-48-1103 and 20-48-1104.
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6	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code Title 20, Chapter 48, Subchapter 11, is
7	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
8	20-48-1109. Reforms.
9	(a)(1) On and after July 1, 2017, the Department of Human Services
10	shall promulgate rules to accomplish the following within the child health
11	management services program:
12	(A) Revise:
13	(i) The child health management services provider
14	manual to ensure that the program operates as a medical model providing
15	preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative, palliative, day
16	habilitation, and related services to children with medical conditions or
17	multiple or complex medical conditions;
18	(ii) The eligibility criteria to focus on children
19	with more serious medical conditions or multiple or complex medical
20	<u>conditions;</u>
21	(iii) Staffing ratios to ensure that the needs of
22	the target populations are effectively and efficiently met; and
23	(iv) Staff credentials to ensure that services are
24	provided to target populations by staff that are licensed, certified, or
25	specially trained in the services that they are providing; and
26	(B) Require evaluations of children to be conducted at
27	least annually for each type of service billed to ensure that the Arkansas
28	Medicaid Program does not pay for services that a child no longer needs.
29	(2) If a provider that is certified as a child health management
30	services program serves clients whose primary need for services is due to a
31	developmental disability or delay, the provider shall also comply with the
32	staffing ratios, staffing qualifications, annual evaluations, eligibility
33	criteria, and other rules applicable to the developmental day treatment
34	clinic services program as identified by the department.
35	(b)(1) On and after July 1, 2017, the department shall promulgate
36	rules to accomplish the following within the developmental day treatment

1	clinic services program:
2	(A) Revise:
3	(i) The developmental day treatment clinic services
4	provider manual to ensure that the program operates as a medical model
5	providing preventive, diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative, palliative,
6	day habilitation, and related services to children who have or are at risk
7	for developmental disabilities and developmental delays;
8	(ii) The eligibility criteria to focus on children
9	with more significant developmental disabilities and developmental delays;
10	<u>and</u>
11	(iii) Staff credentials to ensure that services are
12	provided to target populations by staff who are licensed, certified, or
13	specially trained in the services that they are providing;
14	(B) Require evaluations of children to be conducted at
15	least annually for each type of service billed to ensure that the Arkansas
16	Medicaid Program does not pay for services that a child no longer needs; and
17	(C) Develop staffing ratios to ensure that the needs of
18	the target populations are effectively and efficiently met.
19	(2) If a provider that is certified as a developmental day
20	treatment clinic services program serves clients whose primary need for
21	services is due to a medical condition or multiple or complex medical
22	condition, the provider shall also comply with the staffing ratios, staffing
23	qualifications, annual evaluations, eligibility criteria, and other rules
24	applicable to the child health management services program as identified by
25	the department.
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27	SECTION 6. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
28	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the populations served by
29	developmental day treatment services programs and child health management
30	services programs are not clearly and distinctly defined; that
31	overutilization of services is occurring due to the lack of clarity; that
32	referring providers need more clarity as to the types of services provided in
33	each program; and that this act is immediately necessary to ensure proper
34	screenings, referrals, and treatment for the populations served by these
35	programs and to prevent overutilization or the provision of services in the
36	wrong setting. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist, and this act

1	being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health,
2	and safety shall become effective on:
3	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
4	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
5	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
6	<u>bill; or</u>
7	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
8	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
