21	(2) It is not the intent of the General Assembly to cause the
22	licensing entity to engage in simple comparisons of the required hours of
23	training and other personal qualifications under Arkansas's occupational
24	licensing statutes with those qualifications required in the state where the
25	person is credentialed.
26	(b) A licensing entity shall by rule adopt the least restrictive
27	requirements for licensing, registration, or certification for a person who:
28	(1) Demonstrates that he or she:
29	(A) Was previously licensed, registered, or certified for
30	a term specified by rule of the licensing entity to practice in the field of
31	his or her profession in another state;
32	(B) Holds his or her license in good standing;
33	(C) Has not had his or her license revoked for:
34	(i) An act of bad faith; or
35	(ii) A violation of law, rule, or ethics;
36	(D) Is not holding a suspended or probationary license in

1	any state; and
2	(E) Is sufficiently competent in his or her field; and
3	(2) Pays any licensing, registration, or certification fee
4	required by law.
5	(c)(1)(A) A licensing entity shall comply with the requirements under
6	subsection (b) of this section by adopting a rule that is least restrictive
7	that allows for state-to-state reciprocity.
8	(B) The rule under subdivision (c)(1)(A) of this section
9	shall provide the procedure by which a licensing entity shall grant a one-
10	year temporary reciprocal license or permit to a person under subsection (b)
11	of this section.
12	(2) If a state does not require licensing, registration, or
13	certification for a profession that requires licensing, registration, or
14	certification in this state, a licensing entity shall adopt a rule that is
15	least restrictive to permit a person to obtain licensing, registration, or
16	certification for that profession in this state.
17	(d)(1) Except as provided under subdivision (d)(2) of this section, a
18	licensing entity shall not require a person who meets the requirements of
19	subsection (b) of this section to participate in the apprenticeship,

9	issued by another state upon a showing that:
10	(1) The applicant passed the examination required for issuance
11	of the applicant's certificate with grades that would have been passing
12	grades at the time in this state;
13	(2) The applicant:
14	(A) Meets all current requirements in this state for
15	issuance of a certificate at the time application is made;
16	(B) At the time of the issuance of the applicant's
17	certificate, license, or permit in the other state met all such requirements
18	then applicable in this state; or
19	(C) Had four (4) years of experience outside of this state
20	in the practice of public accounting or meets equivalent requirements
21	prescribed by the board by rule after passing the examination upon which the
22	applicant's certificate was based and within the ten (10) years immediately
23	preceding the application;
24	(3) The applicant has had experience in the practice of public
25	accounting meeting the requirements of § 17-12-309; and
26	(4) The applicant has fulfilled the continuing education
27	requirements applicable under § 17-12-502.
28	(b) As an alternative to the requirements of § 17-12-308(a), a
29	certificate holder licensed by another state who establishes his or her
30	principal place of business in this state shall request the issuance of a
31	certificate from the board prior to establishing such a principal place of
32	business. The board shall issue a certificate to such a person who obtains
33	from the NASBA National Qualification Appraisal Service verification that the
34	individual's CPA qualifications are substantially equivalent to the CPA
35	licensure requirements of the AICPA/NASBA Uniform Accountancy Act.
36	(c) The board shall issue a certificate to a holder of a substantially

T	equivalent foreign designation, provided that:
2	(1) The foreign authority which granted the designation makes
3	similar provision to allow a person who holds a valid certificate issued by
4	this state to obtain the foreign authority's comparable designation; and
5	(2) The foreign designation:

20	which granted the foreign designation or has completed four (4) years of
21	professional experience in this state or meets equivalent requirements

25	standards acceptable to the board.
26	(d) An applicant under subsection (c) of this section shall in the
27	application list all jurisdictions, foreign and domestic, in which the

23	(a) At its discretion, the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Counseling
24	may waive formal examination requirements of a candidate who is licensed or
25	certified to practice counseling or marriage and family therapy by a similar
26	board in another state if, in the opinion of the board, the standards and
27	qualifications required for the practice of counseling in the candidate's
28	licensing state are at least equal to those required by this chapter.
29	(b) The board has the power to waive formal examination requirements
