11	(C)(i) Personal contact information, real property		
12	records, personal property records, or tax records that are omitted shall		
13	remain omitted for two (2) years.

28	(a) There is created a focus group to develop, by May 1, 2018, a		
29	standardized form that may be submitted by an active law enforcement officer		
30	to the relevant county recorder, county assessor, or county clerk to serve as		
31	notification that the active law enforcement officer requires the real		
32	property records, personal property records, or tax records to be private.		
33	(b) The members of the focus group shall be appointed by the Speaker		
34	of the House of Representatives and membership shall consist of:		
35	(1) One (1) circuit court county clerk in this state;		
36	(2) One (1) county assessor in this state;

8	<u>1, 2018.</u>
9	(2) The focus group shall meet at least one (1) time during the

11	(3) The focus group may conduct its meetings telephonically or
12	through an online platform.
13	(d) The focus group shall expire on May 1, 2018.
