9	establish an online central repository that provides service members and		
10	veterans with information to assist in finding civilian employment, including		
11	without limitation:		
12	(1) Information on civilian credentialing opportunities for		
13	every stage of training for a military occupational specialty;		
14	(2) Information on civilian occupational equivalents of a		
15	military occupational specialty, including without limitation:		
16	(A) Required skills and education prerequisites;		
17	(B) Salary information; and		
18	(C) Available job listings; and		
19	(3) Information on opportunities to use educational military		
20	benefits available to service members and veterans which through		
21	corresponding training or continuing education leads to a certification exam		
22	and further credentialing opportunities.		
23	(d) For the purpose of educating civilian workforce employers, the		
24	Department of Veterans Affairs and the Department of Workforce Services are		
25	encouraged to study the need for and the resources available to provide		
26	information concerning military occupational services to state agencies and		
27	other agencies, including without limitation:		
28	(A) Military course training curricula;		
29	(B) Professional skills developed; and		
30	(C) Civilian occupational equivalents of a military		
31	occupational specialty.
