6	(d) The Arkansas Agriculture Department shall provide office space,		
7	staff and materials for the task force.		
8	(e) The task force shall select from its membership a chair and a vice		
9	<u>chair.</u>		
10	(f)(1) A majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum.		
11	(2) A majority vote of those members present shall be required		
12	for any action of the task force.		
13	(g) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position, the vacancy shall be		
14	filled in the same manner as the original appointment.		
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16	SECTION 2. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Feral Hog Eradication Task Force - Duties.</u>		
17	(a) The Feral Hog Eradication Task Force shall report on or before		
18	December 31, 2017, to the cochairs of the Legislative Council regarding the		
19	progress of the task force toward completing the project outlined in this		
20	section.		
21	(b) The task force shall create a plan for the eradication of feral		
22	hogs in Arkansas.		
23	(c) The plan created under this section shall include provisions for:		
24	(1) Controlling invasive feral hogs will take a long-term,		
25	cooperative approach with aggressive and effective strategies;		
26	(2) Four (4) tenets for effective population reduction and		
27	eradication efforts as the core principles to steer policy and guide the		
28	actions of the partnership, as follows:		
29	(A) Developing a multi-partner alliance to identify and		
30	address feral hog issues;		
31	(B) Increasing public understanding of the damage and harm		
32	caused by feral hogs;		
33	(C) Ensuring that sound regulatory mechanisms and		
34	enforcement capabilities exist to control illegal transport and release of		
35	feral hogs; and		
36	(D) Increasing resources for landowners and land managers		

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1	to control feral hogs;		
2	(3) Developing and implementing of effective outreach tools to		
3	disseminate information to the public that defines the problems and issues		
4	associated with feral hogs;		
5	(4) Resolving ambiguities among existing statutes regarding		
6	livestock and feral hogs;		
7	(5) Appropriating, allocating, identifying, and pursuing known		
8	and alternative funding mechanisms to aid and administer the feral hog		
9	eradication program;		
10	(6) Strengthening existing possession and transport laws to		
11	increase penalties for persons convicted of transport and release of feral		
12	hogs;		
13	(7) Identifying:		
14	(A) Endangered and sensitive species; and		
15	(B) Critical, sensitive, or significant habitats, or eco-		
16	regions or counties, that have been damaged or are threatened by the negative		
17	impacts caused by feral hogs; and		
18	(8) Developing plans to:		
19	(A) Remediate feral hog damage; and		
20	(B) Remove feral hogs from feral-hog damaged areas using		
21	collaborative projects, tools, and funding for the benefit of the public and		
22	private lands and native flora and fauna held as public trust within those		
23	areas.		
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25	SECTION 3. DO NOT CODIFY. <u>Expiration.</u>		
26	This act expires on June 30, 2018.		
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
