29	SECTION 1. DO N	NOT CODIFY. <u>Legislative findings.</u>		
30	The General Assembly finds that:			
31	(1) Many rural and small communities in Arkansas are losing			
32	residents and are struggling to preserve their unique local identity;			
33	(2) Many former residents of the state maintain an emotional			
34	attachment to their hometowns after they have moved and are interested in			
35	investing financially	in their hometowns;

13	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 4-30-107 is amended to read as follows:		
14	4-30-107. Membership — Purposes — Powers.		
15	(a) Any number of persons, corporations, or entities may associate		
16	themselves together as a cooperative corporation for the purpose of		
17	conducting any one (1) or more of the following purposes under the		
18	cooperative plan of the cooperative corporation:		
19	(1) Conducting an agricultural, dairy, mercantile, banking,		
20	mining, manufacturing, or mechanical, marketing, warehousing, transportation,		
21	construction, building, or property management business on the cooperative		
22	<del>plan</del> ;		
23	(2) Conducting the business of the cooperative corporation; or		
24	(3) Accomplishing a purpose of the cooperative corporation.		
25	(b) A cooperative corporation may:		
26	(1) Buy, sell, or deal in products:		
27	(A) Produced or owned by the following:		
28	(i) The cooperative corporation;		
29	(ii) The individual members or patrons of the		
30	cooperative corporation;		
31	(iii) Another cooperative corporation;		
32	(iv) The individual members or patrons of another		
33	cooperative corporation; and		
34	(B) Available in the open market;		
35	(2) Negotiate the price at which the products of the cooperative		
36	corporation may be sold;

1	(3) Enter into a contract between the cooperative corporation		
2	and the individual members and patrons of the cooperative corporation or on		
3	behalf of the cooperative corporation or the individual members and patrons		
4	of the cooperative corporation;		
5	(4) Purchase, hold, lease, mortgage, encumber, sell, exchange,		
6	and convey real and personal property;		
7	(5) Erect buildings, structures, and other facilities on:		
8	(A) Property owned or leased by the cooperative		
9	corporation; and		
10	(B) A right-of-way legally acquired by the cooperative		
11	corporation;		
12	(6) Issue bonds and other evidence of indebtedness and borrow		
13	money to finance the business of the cooperative corporation;		
14	(7) Make an advance to the individual members and patrons of the		
15	cooperative corporation on products delivered by the individual members and		
16	patrons to the cooperative corporation;		
17	(8) Loan money to an individual member of the cooperative		
18	corporation or a corporation or association from which the cooperative		
19	corporation is constituted, with security that the cooperative corporation		
20	<pre>considers sufficient;</pre>		
21	(9) Purchase, acquire, hold, or dispose of stock of another		
22	association or corporation and assume all rights, interests, privileges,		
23	responsibilities, and obligations arising out of the ownership of the stock;		
24	(10) Purchase, own, and hold shares of capital stock,		
25	memberships, interests in nonstock capital, and evidences of indebtedness of		
26	a corporation if the purchase, ownership, or holding of the shares of capital		
27	stock, memberships, interests in nonstock capital, and evidences of		
28	indebtedness of the corporation is necessary or incidental to accomplishing a		
29	purpose stated in the articles of incorporation of the cooperative		
30	<pre>corporation;</pre>		
31	(11) Exercise fiduciary powers in relation to the members,		
32	cooperatives, or associations from which the cooperative corporation is		
33	<pre>constituted;</pre>		
34	(12) Take, receive, and hold real and personal property,		
35	including without limitation the principal and interest of money or other		
36	funds and rights in a contract, in trust for any purpose not inconsistent

1	with the purposes of the cooperative corporation as determined by the		
2	articles of incorporation of the cooperative corporation; and		
3	(13) Exercise fiduciary powers in relation to taking, receiving,		
4	and holding real and personal property.		
5			
6	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 4-30-108(a) and (b), concerning the		
7	requirements for the articles of incorporation for a cooperative association		
8	are amended to read as follows:		
9	(a) The members shall sign and acknowledge written articles of		
10	incorporation which shall contain:		
11	(1) The name of the <u>cooperative</u> corporation;		
12	(2) The name and residences of the persons forming the		
13	<pre>cooperative corporation;</pre>		
14	(3) The purpose of the organization;		
15	(4) The principal place of business;		
16	(5) The amount of capital stock;		
17	(6) The number of shares and the par value of each share;		
18	(7) The number of directors and the names of those selected for		
19	the first term; and		
20	(8) The time for which the <u>cooperative</u> corporation is to		
21	continue, not to exceed fifty (50) years if the cooperative corporation is		
22	not of perpetual duration.		
23	(b) The original articles of incorporation or a certified copy of them		
24	shall be filed with the Secretary of State, who shall return to the		
25	cooperative corporation a certified copy of them, with the date of filing and		
26	attested with the seal of his or her office.
