31	(48)(A)(i) "Rea	asonable efforts" means efforts	to preserve the family
32	before the placement of	of a child in foster care to pre	event the need for
33	removing the child fro	om his or her home and efforts t	o reunify a family made
34	after a child is place	ed out of his or her home to mak	e it possible for him or
35	her to safely return h	home.	
36		(ii) Reasonable efforts shal	l also be made to obtain

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1	permanency for a child who has been in an out-of-nome placement for more than		
2	twelve (12) months or for fifteen (15) of the previous twenty-two (22)		
3	months.		
4	(iii) In determining whether or not to remove a		
5	child from a home or return a child back to a home, the child's health and		
6	safety shall be the paramount concern.		
7	(iv) The department <u>Department of Human Services</u> or		
8	other appropriate agency shall exercise reasonable diligence and care to		
9	utilize all available services related to meeting the needs of the juvenile		
10	and the family.		
11	(v)(a) "Reasonable efforts" include efforts to		
12	involve an incarcerated parent.		
13	(b) The Department of Human Services shall:		
14	(1) Involve an incarcerated parent in		
15	case planning;		
16	(2) Monitor compliance with services		
17	offered by the Department of Correction; and		
18	(3) Offer visitation in accordance with		
19	the rules of the Department of Correction if visitation is appropriate and in		
20	the best interest of the child.		
21	(B) The juvenile division of circuit court may deem that		
22	reasonable efforts have been made when the court has found that the first		
23	contact by the department <u>Department of Human Services</u> occurred during an		
24	emergency in which the child could not safely remain at home, even with		
25	reasonable services being provided.		
26	(C) Reasonable efforts to reunite a child with his or her		
27	parent or parents shall not be required in all cases. Specifically,		
28	reunification shall not be required if a court of competent jurisdiction,		
29	including the juvenile division of circuit court, has determined by clear and		
30	convincing evidence that the parent has:		
31	(i) Subjected the child to aggravated circumstances;		
32	(ii) Committed murder of any child;		
33	(iii) Committed manslaughter of any child;		
34	(iv) Aided or abetted, attempted, conspired, or		
35	solicited to commit the murder or the manslaughter;		
36	(v) Committed a felony battery that results in		

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1	serious bodily injury to any child;		
2	(vi) Had the parental rights involuntarily		
3	terminated as to a sibling of the child;		
4	(vii) Abandoned an infant as defined in subdivision		
5	(1) of this section; or		
6	(viii) Registered with a sex offender registry under		
7	the Adam Walsh Child Protection and Safety Act of 2006, Pub. L. No. 10-9-248		
8	(D) Reasonable efforts to place a child for adoption or		
9	with a legal guardian or permanent custodian may be made concurrently with		
10	reasonable efforts to reunite a child with his or her family;
