15	TO AMEND THE LAW REGARDING THE OPERATIONS
16	OF RETAIL LIQUOR STORES AND LIQUOR
17	DISTRIBUTORS.
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20	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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22	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code Title 3, Chapter 4, is amended to add
23	additional subchapters to read as follows:
24	<u>Subchapter 11 — Pool Buying</u>
25 26	2 4 1101 Definitions
20	<u>3-4-1101- Definitions.</u> As used in this subchapter:
27	<u>As used in this subchapter:</u> (1) "Member of a pool buying group" means a licensee reported by
28 29	<u>a pool buying agent and approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division;</u>
30	(2) "Pool buying" means the combining of orders into a single
31	transaction, by two (2) to more retail liquor permittees, who are members of
32	<u>a cooperative or pool buying group for maximizing purchasing power and</u>
33	approved by the division; and
34	<u>(3) "Pool buying agent" means a vendor designated by a pool</u>
35	buying group in a pool buying agreement.
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1	<u>3-4-1102. Pool buying agent Licensure.</u>
2	(a) A pool buying agent must be licensed under this subchapter.
3	(b) A license under this section shall authorize a pool buying agent
4	to purchase the types of alcoholic beverages that the agent orders on behalf
5	of the members of a pool buying group.
6	(c) The Alcoholic Beverage Control Board shall adopt rules to create a
7	pool buying agent license.
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9	<u>3-4-1103. Pool buying agreements.</u>
10	(a)(1) Before beginning operations, a pool buying group shall file
11	with the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division a copy of the agreement under
12	which the members of the pool buying group will operate.
13	(2) The division shall review the agreement and if the
14	requirements of applicable law and the rules are met, shall approve the
15	agreement.
16	(b) A proposed amendment to a pool buying agreement shall be filed
17	with and approved by the division in the same manner as the original
18	agreement before the proposed amendment becomes effective.
19	(c) A pool buying agreement shall include without limitation:
20	(1) The name and address of the members of a pool buying group;
21	(2) The name of the buying agent for the pool buying group; and
22	(3) For each member of the pool buying group, the licensee's
23	name, business name, license number, and the date on which the licensee
24	joined the pool buying group.
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26	<u>3-4-1104. Pool buying group operations.</u>
27	(a) A pool buying group may hire employees to act in an administrative
28	or management capacity for the members of a pool buying group's purchase of
29	alcoholic beverages.
30	(b) Except for products purchased as part of a pool order documented
31	under § 3-4-1106, members of a pool buying group shall not make sales or
32	transfers of alcoholic beverages between members of the pool buying group.
33	(c) A member of a pool buying group is not eligible to place an order
34	with the pool buying group until the member has executed the pool buying
35	agreement and the licensee's name, business name, license number and date of
36	membership have been filed with and approved by the Alcoholic Beverage

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1	<u>Control Division.</u>
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3	3-4-1105. Procedures for pool buying group orders.
4	(a) All changes, additions, and deletions to the membership of a pool
5	buying group shall be made using forms approved by the Alcoholic Beverage
6	Control Division.
7	(b) Upon the transfer, suspension, or revocation of an alcoholic
8	beverage license or permit held by a member of a pool buying group, the
9	division shall delete the licensee or permittee from membership in the pool
10	buying group.
11	(c)(l) An individual member of a pool buying group shall place orders
12	under this subchapter with and remit payment to the pool buying agent.
13	(2) Payments under this subchapter shall be made payable to the
14	pool buying agent or the distributor.
15	(3) Distributors of alcoholic beverages may accept pool buying
16	group orders and payment only from the designated buying agent of a pool
17	buying group.
18	(d)(1) All pool buying orders for alcoholic beverages shall be ordered
19	from distributors by the pool buying agent.
20	(2) All pool buying group orders shall place the order under the
21	name of the pool buying group and indicate each licensed vendor's part of the
22	pool buying group order.
23	(3)(A) Each distributor and pool buying agent shall keep the
24	individual invoices for each member's portion of the pool buying order.
25	<u>(B) A master invoice under § 3-4-1106 shall include all</u>
26	alcoholic beverages ordered under this subchapter and shall refer to each
27	associated invoice supporting the master invoice.
28	(4) Each wholesaler shall deliver each licensee's or permittee's
29	part of the pool buying group order to the licensee's or permittee's place of
30	business.
31	(5) All parties to a transaction under this subchapter shall
32	maintain records of purchases made between permit holders.
33	(e) If a payment is not timely made for a pool buying order, the pool
34	buying group and all members of the pool buying group shall be considered
35	delinquent accounts and reported to the division.
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1	<u>3-4-1106. Recordkeeping.</u>
2	(a) A distributor shall prepare and keep a master invoice that
3	<u>identifies:</u>
4	(1) The total pool buying group order placed by the pool buying
5	agent; and
6	(2) Each pool buying group order member's portion of the total
7	pool buying group order by setting forth the name of the pool buying agent
8	making the order.
9	(b)(1) Distributors and pool buying agents shall keep invoices for
10	members of a pool buying group purchases for a period of three (3) years.
11	(2) For each pool buying group order, an invoice shall include
12	without limitation:
13	(A) The date and the name of the distributor with whom the
14	order was placed;
15	(B) The names and license or permit numbers of each member
16	of a pool buying group participating in the pool buying group order;
17	(C) The brand, size, and quantity of alcoholic beverages
18	ordered by each member of a pool buying group; and
19	(D) The cost to each member of the pool buying group for
20	his or her share of the pool buying group order and any vinous and spirituous
21	beverage discount given on the pool buying group order.
22	(c)(1) Sale of alcoholic beverages ordered as part of a single pool
23	buying group order from a permit holder who received the products is a
24	purchase between members of a pool buying group, if a record of the
25	transaction is made by the member of the pool buying group member
26	transferring the products to another member of a pool buying group and
27	retained by both pool buying group members for a period of three (3) years
28	after the date of transfer.
29	(2) A record created under subdivision (c)(1) of this section
30	shall include without limitation the:
31	(A) Business name and license or permit number of each
32	<u>license or permit holder;</u>
33	(B) Names, sizes, and quantities of products transferred;
34	(C) Date of original delivery of products from the pool
35	buying group order;
36	(D) Date physical transfer of products was made; and

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1	(E) Unique identifier that links the record with the pool
2	buying group order.
3	(d) Upon written request, a pool buying agent shall make available to
4	an employee of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division for inspection all
5	papers and reports related to pool buying group orders, purchases, and
6	payments within ten (10) days of the request by the employee of the division.
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8	<u>Subchapter 12 - Delivery Service License</u>
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10	<u>3-4-1201. Delivery service license — Creation.</u>
11	(a) Effective September 1, 2017, there is created a delivery service
12	license to be issued by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to a delivery
13	service that:
14	(1) Delivers prepared food from restaurants to customers as part
15	of the delivery service's business; and
16	(2) Seeks to deliver sealed packages of alcoholic beverages or
17	beer or both sold by a retailer licensed under this title.
18	(b)(l)(A) A person, partnership, limited liability company, or
19	corporation desiring to deliver sealed packages of alcoholic beverages or
20	beer sold by a retailer licensed under this title as part of the delivery
21	service shall apply to the board for a delivery service license.
22	(B) The application shall be in writing and verified on
23	forms authorized by the board.
24	(2)(A) A person applying for a delivery service license shall be
25	twenty-one (21) years of age or older and shall not have been convicted of a
26	felony.
27	(B) The board may issue a delivery service license to an
28	individual, partnership, limited liability company, or corporation that is
29	registered to do business in the State of Arkansas regardless of the
30	residence of the ownership of the individual, partnership, limited liability
31	company, or corporation.
32	(c) Each applicant for a delivery service license shall pay to the
33	board an annual license fee of three hundred dollars (\$300).
34	(d)(1) Each delivery service licensee shall conduct or have a third
35	party conduct a local and national criminal background check on a potential
36	employee that seeks to be licensed under this subchapter.

1	(2) A background check under this section shall include a
2	multistate criminal records locator or other similar commercial nationwide
3	database with validation.
4	(e) Each delivery service licensee shall ensure that each employee
5	delivering alcoholic beverages or beer is licensed under this subchapter.
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7	<u>3-4-1202. Delivery employee license — Creation.</u>
8	(a) Effective September 1, 2017, there is created a delivery employee
9	license to be issued by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board to an individual
10	employed by a person who delivers alcoholic beverages or beer under this
11	<u>subchapter.</u>
12	<u>(b)(l) An individual seeking a delivery employee license shall make</u>
13	application for the license by completing an application form prescribed by
14	the board.
15	(2) An applicant shall demonstrate that the applicant:
16	(A) Is at least twenty-one (21) years of age;
17	(B) Has been subject to a state and federal criminal
18	background check under this subchapter to ensure the individual has not been
19	convicted of a crime involving the sale or distribution of alcohol within the
20	previous eight (8) years and has not been convicted of any felony within the
21	<u>previous five (5) years;</u>
22	(C) Has a valid driver's license; and
23	(D)(i) Has completed a responsible alcohol server course
24	approved by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Division.
25	(ii) A course offered under subdivision (b)(2)(D)(i)
26	of this section shall be completed every two (2) years.
27	<u>(c) An individual applying for a license under this section shall pay</u>
28	<u>to the board a fee of fifty dollars (\$50.00).</u>
29	(d) A delivery employee license shall be valid for two (2) years.
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31	<u>3-4-1203. Delivery service operations.</u>
32	(a) Effective September 1, 2017, a delivery service that delivers
33	prepared food from restaurants to customers as part of the delivery service's
34	business may deliver sealed packages of alcoholic beverages or beer or both
35	sold by a retailer licensed under this title to the delivery service's
36	customers if:

1	(1) The amount of alcoholic beverages and beer delivered to a
2	<u>customer does not exceed more than one gallon (1 gal.) per customer per</u>
3	<u>delivery;</u>
4	(2) At least fifty percent (50%) of the delivery service's gross
5	sales come from the delivery of food products or prepared food;
6	(3) A delivery service employee who delivers alcoholic beverages
7	or beer or both is twenty-one (21) years of age or older;
8	(4) The delivery service has made more than one hundred thousand
9	(100,000) deliveries in the State of Arkansas;
10	(5) The delivery service has a written agreement with a retailer
11	to deliver the retailer's alcoholic beverages or beer to customers; and
12	(6) Before a customer is allowed possession of alcoholic
13	beverages or beer, a delivery service employee who delivers alcoholic
14	beverages or beer requires the customer to show a valid, government-issued
15	document, such as a driver's license or other form of identification deemed
16	acceptable to the employee, that includes the photograph and birth date of
17	the customer establishing that the customer is twenty-one (21) years of age
18	<u>or older.</u>
19	(b) A delivery service shall not be prohibited from charging a fee to
20	customers when delivering sealed packages of alcoholic beverages or beer sold
21	<u>by a retailer.</u>
22	<u>(c) A delivery service shall make its services available to all permit</u>
23	holders under this title in the service area of the delivery service.
24	<u>(d) A delivery under this subchapter shall not be made to any area of</u>
25	the state in which the manufacture or sale of intoxicating liquor is
26	prohibited.
