16	CONCERNING DRIVER'S LICENSES; CONCERNING
17	THE ABILITY OF A PERSON WITH A SUSPENDED
18	DRIVER'S LICENSE TO DRIVE TO AND FROM
19	WORK; AND CONCERNING A HARDSHIP LICENSE.
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22	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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24	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code \S 27-16-801(h)(1), concerning the definition
25	of an inmate of the Department of Correction or Department of Community
26	Correction who is eligible for an identification card or a driver's license,
27	is amended to read as follows:
28	(h)(1) As used in this subsection;
29	(A) "Custody" means:
30	(i) Being an inmate of the Department of Correction
31	and housed in a facility operated by the Department of Correction; or
32	(ii) Being an inmate of the Department of Community
33	Correction and housed in a detention facility; and
34	(B) "eligible "Eligible inmate" means a person who is
35	within one hundred twenty (120) one hundred eighty (180) days of release from
36	custody by the Department of Correction or the Department of Community

1	Correction.
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3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code Title 27, Chapter 16, Subchapter 8, is
4	amended to add an additional section to read as follows:
5	27-16-815. Probationer and parolee restricted permits.
6	(a)(1) If a person on probation or parole for an offense that did not
7	involve the operation of a motor vehicle has his or her license suspended for
8	a reason not listed under § 27-16-915(b)(2)(C), the person may be eligible
9	for a restricted driving permit under this section that permits the holder to
10	drive a motor vehicle directly to and directly home from:
11	(A) A place where he or she is employed;
12	(B) A place where he or she, or his or her minor child,
13	attends school;
14	(C) A scheduled meeting with his or her probation or
15	parole officer; or
16	(D) Any place, location, or meeting that the person's
17	probation or parole officer has directed the person on probation or parole to
18	travel to or attend.
19	(2) This section does not apply to a person with an expired
20	<u>driver's license.</u>
21	(b)(1) A person on probation or parole is required to be in the
22	process of paying toward any outstanding fine or fee assessed by a court,
23	under terms and conditions set by the court, if applicable, or absent terms
24	and conditions set by the court, the person on probation or parole is
25	required to be paying toward any outstanding fine or fee as required by the
26	person's probation or parole officer.
27	(2) Failure to satisfy the payments toward a fine or fee as
28	required under subdivision (b)(1) of this section may result in revocation of
29	the restricted driving permit.
30	(c)(1) A probation or parole officer employed by the Department of
31	Community Correction who supervises a person on probation or parole with a
32	suspended driver's license may issue a restricted driving permit under this
33	section that allows the person on probation or parole to drive a motor
34	vehicle to and from a place listed under subsection (a) of this section.
35	(2)(A) A restricted driving permit issued under this section
36	shall be a standardized permit, and the person possessing a restricted

1	driving permit under this section shall have the restricted driving permit in
2	his or her possession at all times when the person is operating a motor
3	vehicle until the person's driver's license is no longer suspended.
4	(B)(i) A restricted driving permit shall include the
5	address of the person's residence and the address of each location to and
6	from where the person is permitted to drive under this section.
7	(ii) The person's name and address on a restricted
8	driving permit under this section shall match the person's name and address
9	as listed on a valid state-issued identification in the person's possession.
10	(3) The person's probation or parole officer may revoke a
11	restricted driving permit issued under this section at any time and for any
12	<u>reason.</u>
13	(d) A person who knowingly creates a fraudulent restricted driving
14	permit, the purpose of which is to be used as a restricted driving permit
15	under this section upon conviction is guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
16	(e) A motor vehicle liability insurance carrier may provide liability
17	insurance for a person issued a restricted driving permit under this section
18	but is not required to issue an insurance policy for a person who has been
19	issued a restricted driving permit under this section.
20	(f)(1) A person on probation or parole who has been issued a
21	restricted driving permit under this section shall continue to have his or
22	her driver's license suspended until the person has satisfied all the
23	requirements necessary to remove his or her driver's license from suspension.
24	(2) Once the person on probation or parole has his or her
25	driver's license removed from suspension, he or she shall be free from the
26	restrictions placed on him or her under this section.
27	(g) A restricted driving permit issued under this section expires on
28	the earlier of the following dates:
29	(1) Twelve (12) months from the date of issuance unless reissued
30	by a person's probation or parole officer; or
31	(2) The date on which the person is released from probation or
32	parole supervision.
33	(h) The department may promulgate rules to implement this section.
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35	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 27-16-1105(a)(3)(A), concerning minimum
36	issuance standards for a driver's license is amended to read as follows.

1	(3)(A)(i) The office may establish by rule a written and defined
2	exceptions process for a person who is unable to present all the necessary
3	documents for a driver's license or identification card and who must rely
4	upon alternate documents.
5	(ii) The office shall accept alternate documents only to
6	establish identity or date of birth of the person.
7	(iii)(a) An eligible inmate as defined under <u>§27-27-16-</u>
8	801(h)(1) or § 27-16-801(i)(1) may satisfy the identity document requirement
9	under this section by submitting a sentencing order to the Office of Driver
10	Services before his or her release from incarceration.
11	(b) The exception to the identity document
12	requirement under subdivision (a)(3)(A)(iii)(a) of this section shall not be
13	applicable to a first-time issuance of a driver's license or identification
14	card nor may it be used to waive any documentation requirements for non-
15	United States citizens.
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
