21	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL
22	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
23

25	WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Parker-Reed's doctoral thesis on the unique
26	odyssey of the once unconstitutional Department of Correction is considered
27	to be the definitive chronicle of legislative and agency reforms for the
28	State of Arkansas; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, Dr. Parker-Reed has been a member of the Department of
31	Criminal Justice Faculty at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock since
32	1984, earning a national reputation for her instruction, research, and
33	scholarly publications; and in 2011, her public service earned Dr. Parker-
34	Reed the Faculty Excellence Award from the UALR Foundation Fund Board; and
35	
36	WHEREAS, Dr. Parker-Reed was appointed by Governor Jim Guy Tucker to

1 the Correctional Resources Commission, which was created by the 1991 General 2 Assembly to reshape corrections in Arkansas; and as a result, Dr. Parker-Reed 3 authored the 1993 legislation that created the state's current adult 4 correctional configuration; and 5 6 WHEREAS, legislation authored by Dr. Parker-Reed transferred parole 7 supervision from the Department of Correction and probation supervision from 8 circuit courts to a newly-created state agency, which is now known as the 9 Department of Community Correction; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the groundbreaking legislation of 1993 introduced the concepts 12 of treatment-oriented community correction centers, day reporting centers, and the use of a continuum of sanctions to hold parolees and probationers 13 14 accountable; and 15 16 WHEREAS, Governor Tucker in 1993 appointed Dr. Parker-Reed to her first 17 seven-year term on the Board of Corrections; she was re-appointed in 2000 by 18 Governor Mike Huckabee and in 2007 by Governor Mike Beebe; and her 23 years, 19 7 months, and 14 days of continuous service makes Dr. Parker-Reed the 20 longest-serving member since the state correctional board was created in 21 1943; and 22 23 WHEREAS, during her board tenure, Dr. Parker-Reed has served as Chair 24 and Vice Chair and legislative liaison for the Department of Correction and 25 the Department of Community Correction; and Dr. Parker-Reed has overseen the 26 addition of 5 prisons, 5 community correction centers, 1 technical parole 27 violator center, and numerous expansions and renovations of state facilities; 28 and 29 30 WHEREAS, under her leadership and guidance, both the Department of 31 Community Correction and the Department of Correction earned the Golden Eagle 32 Award from the American Correctional Association for achieving full national 33 accreditation of all state correctional facilities; and 34 35 WHEREAS, through her involvement, Dr. Parker-Reed's commitment to

improving Arkansas's criminal justice system extends to the Arkansas Victim

1	Assistance Academy, the Safe Places Development Council, and the Arkansas
2	Police Corps; and
3	
4	WHEREAS, her compassion for animals led her to co-found Arkansas Paws
5	in Prison in 2011 that places overlooked shelter dogs into Arkansas prisons
6	where they are trained in basic obedience by inmates; the training makes the
7	dogs more adoptable; and this highly successful program has saved nearly
8	1,000 unwanted dogs from being euthanized and has provided marketable job
9	skills to the inmate trainers,
10	
11	NOW THEREFORE,
12	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIRST GENERAL
13	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:
14	
15	THAT the General Assembly recognizes and commends Dr. Mary L. Parker-
16	Reed on her contributions to corrections, criminal justice reforms, and the
17	entire State of Arkansas, and thanks her for her public service.
18	
19	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT upon adoption of this resolution, an appropriate
20	copy shall be provided to Dr. Parker-Reed by the Chief Clerk of the House of
21	Representatives.
